WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, initialed, An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Tields, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereinbefore mentioned into any number of divisions, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: And whereas by two several Orders of the Governor in Council, made on the fourth day of January, 1858, and the fourth day of April, 1859, the mining district of Ararat was split into the divisions therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to subdivide the said district into four divisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order split the said mining district of Ararat into the four divisions named in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, and doth define the limits and boundaries of each such division to be those set opposite thereto respectively in the last column of the same schedule, and doth determine that the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division shall be that set immediately under the name of each such division, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled. An Act to regulate the importation carriage and custody of Guppowder, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim any town, township, or municipal district, not being a sea-port town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than One hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the municipal district hereinafter mentioned to be a district within the meaning and intent and for the purpose mentioned in the above-recited clause of the said Act, that is to say.

At the request of the Lords of the Committee of Privy
Council for Trade, I have to call your attention to the 242nd
section of the Merchant Shipping Act of 1854 (Clause 6).
That section prescribes the cases in which the Board of Trade
may cancel or suspend a master or mate's certificate for
misconduct, and it distinctly provides that in the case of any
investigation made by any court or tribunal authorised by the

Legislative authority in any British possession to enquire into the conduct of masters and mates, the report of the court is to be confirmed by the Governor or person administering the government of such possession.

I am led to advert to this subject from the circumstance, that in a recent instance the Board of Trade were unable to cancel a certificate in consequence of an ommission on the part of a Governor to confirm the report of a marine court.

Whereas the infectious disease known or described as Pleuropneumonia has appeared amongst cattle in certain parts of the neighboring colony of Victoria, and it is necessary to take measures to prevent the introduction into this colony of such disease. Whereas by section number nine of the Diseased Cattle Act, 1861, it is enacted, that "If at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out in any district out of the colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to declare that such district is infected within the meaning of this Act, and from time to time to make such Regulations as to him shall seem fit, for prohibiting the importation of cattle into the colony from such district, and the landing or driving of such cattle, and for destroying cattle imported, landed, or driven contrary to such Regulations," and by section ten of the same Act it is also enacted, that "If at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out amongst cattle in any district of the colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to declare that such district is infected within the meaning of this Act, and from time to time to make such Regulations for destroying diseased cattle therein, and for prohibiting the removal or transportation of cattle from one part of the colony to another, and for preventing the further spread of such disease as to him shall seem fit;" and it is by the same Act also enacted that the Governor in Council, by the said Act, subject to such Regulations as he may think fit, and may from time to time resoind such delegation: And whereas the Governor hath with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to Isaac Earl Fetherston, Esquiro, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the province of Wellington, the several powers vested in the Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, several powers vested in the Governor in Council on the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and to any other Regulations to be from time to time to fine duly made:

made:

Now therefore I, the said Isaac Earl Featherston, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare—First, that after the date hereof the several colonies of Australia, that is to say, the colony of Victoria, the colony of New South Wales, the colony of Queensland, the colony of South Australia, and the colony of Western Australia, as well as the colony of Tasmania, and the colony Cape of Good Hope, and the islands of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the abovementioned Act, and that no cattle after the date hereof, until furthur notice, shall be imported into the province of Wellington from such districts: Provided however that the Superintendent of the province may allow any cattle to be landed from vessels from the islands of Great Britain and Ireland, subject to such conditions and restrictions as he may deem expedient and the circumstances of any case may require:

And I do also proclaim and declare, that after the date hereof the province of Otago and the province of Southland, in the colony of New Zealand, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be imported into the province of Wellington from either of the said provinces. said provinces.

Whereas by Warrants under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the Governor has, with the advice and consent of the Excentive Council of New Zealand, delegated to the Superintendents respectively of the provinces of Auckland, Turanaki, Wellington, Hawke's Bay, Nelson, Maribrough, Canterbury, Otago, and Southland, certain powers conferred on him by the Diseased Cattle Act, 1861, subject to certain Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, under the recited Act.: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, by virtue of the authority given to him by the 14th section of the above-recited Act, doth hereby make and ordain the following Regulations:—

1. The delegation of powers under the said Warrants shall continue to be in force for the period of one year from this date, subject to be resoinded according to the provisions of the above-recited Act.

2. Each Superintendent shall, immediately after exercising any of the delegated powers, notify the same to the Governor; and he shall transmit to the Governor particulars of all appointments and copies of all regulations made by him.

3. He shall, so soon as conveniontly can be, notify all regulations made by him to the Colonial Secretary, or Chief Secretary of each of the Australian colonies, and cause the same to be published in England in the Times newspaper.

4. #### SMYTHESDALE TOWN COMMON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE TOWN COMMON.

WHEREAS in an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any town shall be a common for the use of the inhabitants of such town, and all the inhabitants of such town, and all the inhabitants of such town and its vicinity shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture their cattle and horses on such common; and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the municipal council of any district within or adjoining which any such common shall have been proclaimed, with the consent of Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every such inhabitant shall be entitled to depasture on any town common: Now therefore the municipal council of Smythesdale, with the consent of the Governor in Council, rules and declares that every inhabitant of the town of Smythesdale and its vicinity shall be entitled to depasture on the Smythesdale town common any number of horses and cattle not exceeding six.
