## FARMERS' COMMON AT PURNIM AND COORA-MOOK.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander  
of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General  
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-  
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament  
holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of  
Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating  
the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst  
other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in  
Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of  
not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to  
proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such pur-  
chased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than  
three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common  
for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall  
cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and  
every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common," pro-  
vided that nothing in the now recited section shall be deemed or  
taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the  
said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing  
the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council  
shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and  
regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the  
exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common:  
And whereas the occupiers of purchased land at or near the  
localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for a Farmers'  
Common in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I,  
Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of  
the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands  
hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of  
the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent  
and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under  
and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of  
the right of common as are or may be prescribed, that is to  
say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT PURNIM  
AND COORAMOOK.—Commencing at the north-east angle of  
Tozer's pre-emptive section; thence by Drysdale Creek easterly  
and northerly to the north-east angle of Drysdale pre-emptive  
section; thence by a straight line easterly from said north-east  
angle of Drysdale pre-emptive section to the north-west angle of  
allotment 17, section 2, parish of Framlingham; thence southerly  
by the western boundaries of allotments 17, 15, 9, 5, and 1 of  
section 2, seventy-two chains, more or less, to the north-west  
angle of the town reserve of Framlingham; thence westerly by  
the north boundaries of allotments 4 and 3 of section 3, forty-  
two chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of allotment  
3; thence southerly to a point bearing westerly three chains  
from the south-west angle of allotment 5, section 1 (one);  
thence westerly sixty-one chains, more or less; thence S. 24°  
W. one hundred and forty chains to the eastern boundary of

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occupation license No. 840; thence north-westerly by said occu-  
pation license boundary to the main road; thence south-west-  
erly along the main road to the north-west angle of occupation  
license No. 839, and by the south-west side of the last-named  
occupation license, seventy chains, more or less, to a point  
bearing N. 55° E. from the north-east angle of allotment 50,  
parish of Purnim; thence S. 56° W. eighty chains; thence  
N. 35° W. eighty chains; thence crossing the three-chain road  
to the north side thereof; thence by the north side of said road  
south-easterly and north-easterly to the south-east angle of  
Tozer's pre-emptive right, and by the eastern side of that pre-  
emptive right bearing N. 35° W. eighty-six chains to the point  
of commencement, deducting from above described area all sold  
or appropriated lands. Approximate area for common 4500  
acres.—(61.C.11454.)

## THE REMOVAL OF TIMBER FROM MOUNT COTTERIL RESERVE PROHIBITED.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander  
of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General  
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-  
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed  
in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-  
fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An  
Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other pur-  
poses*, it is amongst other things provided, that notwithstanding  
anything thereinbefore contained, it shall be lawful for the  
Governor in Council, by proclamation, to declare that it shall  
not be lawful for any person to remove live or dead timber from  
such portions of Crown lands as may be named in such Pro-  
clamation: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor  
of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby  
declare that it shall not be lawful for any person to remove any  
timber from the land called or known as Mount Cotteril Reserve,  
the boundaries whereof are hereinafter described, viz.:—

PYWHEITJORKK—RESERVE FOR TIMBER IN THE PARISH  
OF PYWHEITJORKK, AT MOUNT COTTERIL.—One hundred and  
fifty-six acres, county of Bourke, parish of Pywheittjorkk, allot-  
ment 6, section 12: Commencing at the south-east angle of  
allotment 2, section 12; bounded on the east by a road bearing  
south thirty-nine chains; on the south by a road bearing west  
forty chains; on the west by allotments 5 and 4, bearing north  
thirty-nine chains; and on the north by allotment 2, bearing east  
forty chains to the point of commencement.—(61.D.10675.)

## PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

## CHILTERN.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and ninety householders, resident at Chiltern, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they reside within the area hereinafter defined, and that the township of Chiltern is the centre of an extensive mining district, and comprises a mining and trading population who have invested large sums in trading stock, buildings, and mining plant.

That the land in the township has been lately sold, some of it at a high price, and that notwithstanding the amount paid to Government no provision has been made for roads or approaches to the town, the streets of which are sometimes almost impassable.

That the township contains over fifteen hundred residents.

They further state their opinion that the erection of their locality into a municipal district will greatly advance its interests and prosperity, and conduce to its permanent improvement and good government, and suggest an area circumscribed as follows, viz.:-“Commencing at the north-west corner of the West Chiltern town reserve, and bounded thence by a line running east 160 chains; thence by a line at right angles to the former running south 112 chains 50 links to the north boundary of the suburban lands; thence by a line running west along the said suburban lands 160 chains; and thence by a line running north 112 chains 50 links to the commencing point” as marked on a plan which accompanied the petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:-

“The petitioners pray that the said area may be proclaimed a municipal district in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, under the style and title of ‘The Municipality of Chiltern.’”

## PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

## VICINITY OF CRESWICK.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by thirty-eight persons, stated to be the majority of the householders resident within a defined area adjoining the Municipal District of Creswick, praying that their locality may be united with, and form part of, the said municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are a majority of the householders residing at Bald Hills, adjoining the southern boundary of the municipality of Creswick, and that they are desirous that the locality hereinafter described should be united to and form part of the said municipality, viz.:-“Commencing at the south-west corner of the said municipality; thence south one mile and ten chains; thence east one mile; thence north one mile and ten chains to a point on the south boundary line of the said municipality one mile east from the commencing point.”

They further state that the number of householders residing within the abovementioned area exceeds thirty-six to the square mile, and that they believe it will be a great benefit to the inhabitants to have the locality annexed to the Creswick Municipality.

And the petitioners pray as follows:-

“Your petitioners therefore humbly beg that their petition will receive your Excellency's consideration, and that your Excellency will be pleased to grant the same.”

## PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

## BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-seven landholders and householders resident at Brown's and Scarsdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are resident landholders and householders in the locality hereinafter described, and known as “Brown's and Scarsdale,” in the parish of Scarsdale, which they are desirous should be erected into a municipal district.

That there are between 5000 and 6000 inhabitants in the proposed district, most of whom are engaged in mining, commercial, and agricultural pursuits, and are located at Brown's, Scarsdale, and Black Hill, and that there is, besides, a large number of scattered habitations, the occupants of which it is desirable to include, and thus to secure to all the comforts and advantages derivable from centralization.

That the locality is well adapted for agriculture, and if rendered available by division into allotments of from half an acre to five acres or more will be capable of producing cereals and vegetables at present imported from other localities, and that the saving anticipated from such an arrangement might be applied to municipal requirements.

That the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, a genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are here concentrated; that 325 acres are held under mining leases at a rental of £1625; and that there are 35 steam-engines in operation, which, with their appliances, are valued at £50,000; fifteen commodious hotels, a large number of mercantile establishments of a costly description, comfortable dwellings, a considerable number of horses and cattle, and a weekly yield of about 1500 ounces of gold.

That the greatest inconvenience experienced by the petitioners arises from want of roads, there being but ten chains of made road in the district, and the intercourse with surrounding localities constant and frequent, and that the prices of articles of necessity are enhanced through the hazards and delay inseparable from bad roads.

Lastly, the petitioners are stimulated to improve the surrounding lines of communication by the anticipation that their district will become the entrepôt between the western district and the sea-board *via* the Ballarat and Geelong Railway.

And the petitioners pray as follows:-“Your petitioners seeing the manifold advantages of municipal institutions in other districts believe that similar results would follow the extension of the Municipal Act to theirs, and they therefore most humbly pray your Excellency to proclaim the area herein described as ‘The municipal district of Brown's and Scarsdale,’ [viz.]—commencing at the south-east corner of the Smythesdale municipality; thence west along the south boundary of the said municipality one hundred and twenty chains; thence by a continuation of the same line sixty chains; thence south three hundred and twenty chains; thence east one hundred and eighty chains, running partly along the north boundary of Brown's pre-emptive right; thence north three hundred and twenty chains to the commencing point aforesaid, the whole area being nine square miles.”

## PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

## VICINITY OF AMHERST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by forty-eight persons, stated to be the majority of the residents within an area contiguous to the municipal district of Amherst, praying that the said district may be enlarged so as to include their locality.

The petitioners represent that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area hereinafter described, which is contiguous to the municipal district of Amherst, and that, with the addition of their locality, the district will still comprise less than nine square miles.

They further state that they are entirely debarred from participating in municipal rights and privileges.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:-

“Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to extend the boundaries of the Municipality of Amherst in the following manner: Commencing at the south-east angle of section six with a line bearing east thirty-six chains thirty-six links; from thence by a line bearing north one hundred and fifty chains; from thence by a line bearing west thirty-six chains thirty-six links; from thence by a line bearing south one hundred and fifty chains to the point of commencement.”

## BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[7th January, 1862.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at the office of the board, Camp, Beechworth, in the said district, on the seventh day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

## BYE-LAW XXVIII.—SIZES OF CLAIMS.

Bye-law numbered (IV.) four of the Beechworth Mining Board, from clause 1 to clause 9, in the words following, "Ordinary claims shall not exceed one hundred by one hundred feet," &c., &c., shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. Ordinary claims shall not exceed one hundred feet by one hundred feet for four men, eighty-six feet by eighty-seven feet for three men, seventy feet by seventy-one feet for two men, and fifty feet by fifty feet for one man.

2. A dry bank claim shall not exceed one hundred and sixty yards in length by sixty yards in width, except in the Omeo division, in which the claim shall not exceed one hundred yards by one hundred yards. The depth of dry bank claims on new ground shall be limited in the Stanley and Spring Creek divisions to three feet, and in the Woolshed division to five feet.

3. A wet bank claim shall not exceed one hundred yards in length by one hundred yards in width.

4. A dry frontage claim occupied on a supposed lead previous to proclamation shall not exceed two hundred feet in length on the supposed course of the lead by a width not exceeding one mile.

5. A dry frontage claim occupied on a proclaimed lead shall not exceed ninety feet in length on the surveyor's base line, together with nine inches in length on the base line for every foot exceeding forty that the prospect shaft of the lead on which the claim is situated is in depth; and if the claim is below the prospect claim, one foot in length on the base line for every claim between them, by a width not exceeding one mile, until gold in payable quantities has been found in the claim, after which the width shall not exceed twice the length of the claim.

6. A wet frontage claim occupied on a supposed lead previous to proclamation shall not exceed two hundred feet on the supposed course of the lead by a width not exceeding one mile.

7. A wet frontage claim occupied on a proclaimed lead shall not exceed one hundred and twenty feet in length on the surveyor's base line, together with one foot in length on the base line for every foot exceeding forty that the prospect shaft of the lead on which the claim is situated is in depth; and if the claim is below the prospect claim, one foot in length on the base line for every claim between them, by a width not exceeding one mile, until gold in payable quantities has been found in the claim, after which the width shall not exceed thrice the length of the claim.

8. A creek claim shall not exceed one hundred yards in length in the direction of the course of the stream by a width not exceeding the boundaries of the bed of the creek, as defined by the warden; except in the Omeo division, in which the claim shall not exceed two hundred yards in length by a width limited as aforesaid; and that portion of the Woolshed Creek between the upper end of Kneebone's claim and the junction of the said creek with the Ovens River, on which the claim shall not exceed eight hundred yards in length in the direction of the course of the stream by a width not exceeding four hundred yards across such course.

9. A quartz claim shall not exceed eighty yards in length on the course of the vein by a width not exceeding one hundred and fifty yards across such course, the measurement to be horizontal.

## BYE-LAW XXIX.—DUTIES OF CLAIMHOLDER.

Bye-law numbered (XXVII.) twenty-seven of the Beechworth mining board, in the words following (from clause 1 to clause 8), "It shall be imperative on any person occupying any claim," &c., shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. It shall be imperative on any person occupying any claim other than an ordinary claim to register such occupation, together with the number of men intended to be employed on the claim, with the registrar, within forty-eight hours after such occupation; and the person in whose name the claim is thus registered, or the holder of any ordinary claim, shall be responsible for the due observance of such of the following duties as are applicable to his claim.

2. He shall keep constantly employed on or in connection with his claim, if a dry bank claim, at least one man for every twenty yards comprised in the width of the claim, unless the claim is in the Omeo division, in which case he shall employ at least one man for every one hundred feet comprised in the width of the claim: if a wet bank claim, at least one man to every twenty-five yards comprised in the width of the claim: if a frontage claim or an alluvial prospecting claim not in the bed of the creek or river, at least four men for an entire claim, and a proportionate number for one of a less size: if a creek claim, at least one man for every fifty feet comprised in the length of the claim unless the claim is situate in the Buckland or Woolshed division, in which case he shall keep constantly employed thereon at least one man for every twenty-five yards comprised in the length of the claim; or in the Omeo division, in which case he shall keep employed at least one man for every fifty yards comprised in the length of the claim; or on that portion of the Woolshed Creek situate between the upper boundary of Kneebone's claim and the junction of the said creek with the Ovens River, in which case he shall keep employed at least one man for every fifty yards comprised in the length of the claim, unless while the pump shaft is being sunk, during which time he shall keep at least ten men on the claim: if a quartz claim,

at least one man for every forty feet comprised in the length of the claim, unless while the claim is being prospected, during which time the employment of two men will be deemed sufficient to hold the entire claim.

3. If the claim is other than a frontage claim, he shall cause a post to be erected at each corner thereof; if a frontage claim on an unproclaimed lead, he shall cause a post to be erected at each end of the claim; if on a proclaimed lead he shall cause a post to be erected at each end of the surveyor's cross lines, and when the claim is reduced in width he shall cause a post to be erected at each corner thereof. These posts shall be not less than three inches in diameter, and shall be firmly fixed in the ground, extending at least three feet above it, and shall be kept erected during the occupation of the claim.

4. If he holds a dry bank claim in the Yackandandah division, or a puddling mill in the Spring Creek division, he shall have a dam into which the tailings from such claim or mill shall be run, and such dam shall be made in such a way that during any time in which tailings are being run into it there shall be at least nine inches of still water immediately within the outlet, and shall keep his tailings or sludge clear of any occupied claim which had been occupied prior to the erection of his mill or occupation of his claim, and which may intervene between his claim or mill and the dam into which his tailings or sludge are being run.

5. If the claim is an alluvial prospecting claim not in the bed of a creek or river, and gold in payable quantities is found therein at a depth exceeding forty feet, he shall within forty-eight hours after such discovery give notice thereof in writing to the surveyor, together with such information as will enable the surveyor to find the claim in which the discovery has been made.

6. If he holds a creek claim, he shall make and maintain an efficient flood race through or past such claim.

7. He shall at all times allow the surveyor or any person or persons appointed by him to enter upon his workings, either to take measurements or to ascertain whether payable ground has been discovered.

8. If any occupied tail race is included in the claim, he shall not be deemed to be in possession of any ground within a distance from the sides of the race equal to the depth thereof, nor of any ground within a distance of ten feet from the sides of the race, whatever may be the depth thereof.

## BYE-LAW XXX.—INTERPRETATION BYE-LAW.

Bye-law numbered (xxv.) twenty-five of the Beechworth Mining Board, from clause 1 to clause (11) eleven, in the words "In the construction, and for the purposes of these bye-laws," &c., shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. In the construction, and for the purposes of these bye-laws, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them.

2. The words "warden," "surveyor," and "registrar," shall mean respectively the warden, surveyor, and registrar, for the time being, of the division in which the event in connection with which they are mentioned shall happen.

3. The words "lead" or "frontage lead" shall mean any stratum of auriferous earth at a depth exceeding forty feet.

4. The words "constantly employed" shall mean employment during ordinary working hours, except on an unproclaimed lead, on which "constantly employed" shall be held to mean occupation for two hours daily, namely, from Ten o'clock a.m. to Twelve o'clock noon.

5. The word "race" shall mean a channel made for the purpose of conveying water.

6. The words "tail race" shall mean a race cut for the purpose of draining any claim or claims, or for carrying off the water used for sluicing or any other mining purpose.

7. The words "worked and abandoned ground" shall mean any ground which has been mined upon for gold, and which has been declared by the warden to be worked and abandoned.

8. The words "right" or "water right" shall mean the privilege of diverting and using water from any creek or river.

9. Any words importing the singular number shall include the plural number.

10. Any words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine gender.

11. "New alluvial gold workings" shall mean workings on any lead or creek on which payable ground has not been previously discovered, or which has been entirely abandoned as unprofitable, or any surface workings not less than five miles from the nearest workings of the same class.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-laws.

## RETIREMENT BY ROTATION, RESIGNATIONS AND ELECTIONS.

At the close of the last (being the fourth) municipal year, the chairman, G. Clendinning, Esq., Councillors C. Dyte and S. J. Bradshaw retired by rotation. C. Dyte, Esq., was re-elected; F. Young and J. Russell, Esqs., were elected in the places of Councillors Clendinning and Bradshaw. At the first meeting of the council (on June 4th), Councillor W. Scott was elected chairman of the council. On August the 27th Councillor Davies resigned his seat; and on September the 10th, the chairman, W. Scott, Esq., resigned the chair and his seat in the council; and at the meeting October the 1st, Councillor C. Dyte was elected chairman of the council for the remainder of the year. An election took place on the 11th day of October, when David Turpie and Emanuel Steinfeld, Esqs., were duly elected in the places of W. Scott and H. Davies, Esqs.

## OFFICIAL CHANGES.

At the meeting for the nomination of candidates held 31st May, a resolution was duly carried by the ratepayers abolishing the salary previously paid to the chairman, and the duties of that office are therefore now performed gratuitously. The resignation of Mr. B. W. Walshe as engineer and surveyor to the council having been accepted at the end of the last year, Mr. John Carruthers was on 21st June appointed to that office. On 4th June, Mr. T. Hayes was appointed assessor in addition to his offices of town inspector and collector, and on 12th November Sergeant James Larnier was appointed inspector of nuisances.

## WORKS EXECUTED DURING THE HALF-YEAR.

Maintaining and repairing 300 chains of streets within the municipality.

Maintaining and repairing 177 chains of kerbed and planked footpaths.

Renewing 4 chains of planked and kerbed footpaths.

Maintaining 1852 yards of water mains, branch pipes, fire-cocks, &c.

Erecting 24 rods of fencing round the old burial ground at Golden Point.

Erecting 18 rods of fencing at the excavation in Esmond street.

Cutting 2½ chains of channeling to prevent the flooding of the cricket ground.

Forming and metaling 3 chains of Clayton street.

Forming and metaling 30½ chains of Mair and Princes streets, pitching 20 chains of channeling, making two culverts, and furnishing 106 cubic yards of quartz for maintenance.

Filling in, leveling, and graveling the Market Reserve, Peel street.

Fixing weighbridge and erecting office, &c.

Lighting and repairing ten gas lamps.

Watering Main and Bridge streets.

## WORKS IN PROGRESS OF EXECUTION.

Erecting bridge over Canadian Creek and making 18 chains of approaches thereto.

Building the town hall, plastering, fencing, and fitting-up police court.

## APPLICATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT GRANTED.

For a portion of the cost of improvements to the police court.

For an additional area to the cemetery reserve, and a portion of the parliamentary grant for fencing and improvements.

For the proclamation of the cricket and recreation reserve.

That the powder magazine may be erected on Golden Point, in preference to the proposed site near the Redan Lead.

## APPLICATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT UNDER CONSIDERATION.

That as by the 13 Victoria, clause 27, the care and management of cemeteries is vested in the municipal council, that the amount awarded by the Board of Land and Works for fencing and improvements, be paid to the council to expend for that purpose.—Submitted for the decision of His Excellency the Governor.

That one crossing at least may be constructed over the railway between Ballarat East and Warraneep, but which the engineer-in-chief reports is not required.

That the works requisite for the completion and opening of the railway may be more energetically proceeded with.

That the pitching with bluestone of the channels of the Main road may be completed, and that blue-tone metal may be used in future for the road instead of quartz.

## MISCELLANEOUS SUBJECTS.

*The Governor's Visit.*

His Excellency the Governor honored the district with a visit in October last, on which occasion the municipal councils, in conjunction with the other local bodies, co-operated to give him the most fitting reception their means would allow, by a public procession and banquet, and by presenting addresses expressive of their loyalty to his office, and the high esteem and regard felt by all classes toward His Excellency individually. The address from this council was presented by the chairman and members in front of the Town Hall.

*Sludge Channel.*

It having been estimated that £5000 would pay for the necessary works to complete the sludge channels, that sum was voted by the Government during the last session, but on preparing the detailed plans and specifications it was found that to carry out the work in a complete and permanent manner a much larger sum would be required; the Government have therefore accepted tenders for a portion of the work to the amount of the money voted, and placed a sufficient sum on the estimates for next year to enable the whole work to be completed.

*Survey of streets.*

The council have always felt that the greatest drawback to the prosperity of the municipality was the want of properly laid out streets, to which the inhabitants could build their residences; it has, however, at length succeeded in inducing the Government to cause the work to be proceeded with, which is

now being done, and the frontage lines marked with trenches and posts, which will doubtless greatly assist in the further settlement of the district.

*Street railway.*—Application being made to the council by Thos. Loader, Esq., M.L.A., agent for Train's patent street railways, for permission to construct the same through certain streets, conditional permission was given.

*Railway.*—In compliance with the resolutions carried at a very numerous attended meeting of the inhabitants, this council, in conjunction with the western council, and several of the most influential residents, formed a committee and put themselves in communication with the representatives of the western districts, for the purpose of stimulating the apparently lethargic progress of the railway works between Ballarat and Geelong, and to cause a time in the early part of this year to be fixed on for their completion and the opening of the line, seeing that the contract time had long since expired, and the progress of the work gave no indication as to when it would be finished, neither could any satisfactory information be obtained from the official or professional heads of the department; the committee have caused a very numerous signed petition from this and the surrounding districts to be presented to the Legislative Assembly by W. C. Smith, Esq., and a committee of the House has been appointed to inquire into the causes of the supposed unnecessary delay, which this council hopes will have the effect at least of causing greater progress to be made in future, and the railway to be opened some months earlier than it otherwise would have been, notwithstanding that the engineer-in-chief thought himself justified in stating that the public action taken would have the effect of retarding the progress of the work, a deduction rather difficult to be understood apart from personal feeling.

*Town Hall.*—The necessity which existed for more convenient offices in which to carry on the business of the council, and for the security of its property, and also in consequence of the unfinished state of the police court, which caused great inconvenience in the transaction of the business, the council deemed it advisable to modify the original designs of the building, so that the cost would be more compatible with its means, and to enter into a contract for the erection of the building, and the finishing and fitting up the police court, which is being carried out satisfactorily.
