The maximum quantity of fuel allowed under Regulation No. 52, for fires in the offices of the different departments of the Government Service, will for the future be—
Wood, One and a half tons measurement; or,
Coal, Three-eighths of a ton weight per fire per month.
This Regulation does not apply to Housekeepers.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the first day of September, now last past, the boundaries of "The St. Arnaud Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered prospectively: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the fifteenth day of August in the year next ensuing, the boundaries of the said St. Arnaud Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the northern boundary of the Natta Yaloak pre-emptive section, on the River Avoca; thence by a line west to the eastern boundary of the Stawell Road District, at the township of Navarre; thence by part of the northern boundary of said Road District to a point where it is intersected by the west branch of the Richardson River; thence northerly by the centre line of said river and by the centre line of the Avon River to Lake Buloke; thence by the western shore of said lake to the 143 parallel of longitude; thence north by said parallel of longitude for a distance of 36 miles; thence by a line to the south boundary of Lalbert Swamp; thence southerly by the centre line of Lalbert Creek and by the centre line of the Avoca River to the commencing point. Excepting the municipality of St. Arnaud.—(62.1518.)

THE HORSHAM ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the third day of March, in the present year, the boundaries of "The Horsham Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be altered prospectively: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and

declare that from and after the fifteenth day of August in the year next ensuing, the boundaries of the said Horsham Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the most northern point of the River Glenelg; thence by a line north-westerly to a point in the western boundary of the province three miles north-east of Lake Cadmit; thence north by the western boundary of the province to a point sixty-six miles south of the River Murray; thence east to the eastern boundary of the Electoral District of the Wimmera; thence south by the said boundary to a point due west of the south shore of Lake Coorong; thence east to the 143 parallel of longitude, being a distance of about thirty miles; thence south by the said parallel of longitude to a point in the northern shore of Lake Buloke; thence southerly by the western shore of said lake, and by the centre line of the Avon River and the Richardson River to a point where the western branch of said river is intersected by the main road to Navarre; thence westerly by the centre line of said road to a point in the centre of the River Wimmera; thence southerly by the western boundary of the Stawell Road District, and by part of the eastern and southern boundaries of the Wimmera Electoral District to the commencing point.—(62.1501.)

COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE BEVERIDGE TOWN COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861) is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands in the township of Beveridge.—(62.E.11004.)

THE CAMPERDOWN TOWN COMMON (described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the eighteenth day of February and the twenty-seventh day of May, 1861) is hereby increased by adding thereto the area hereinafter described, viz.:—Eight hundred and twenty-three acres three roods one perch, county of Hampden, parishes of Purrambete and Colongulac, being the unappropriated lands within the township of Camperdown and adjacent thereto, containing 355 acres, more or less; also, the water reserve adjacent to the town boundary, area 69 acres; also, allotment 1, section 21, parish of Purrambete, area 399a. 3r. 1p., as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Total area of common, including present extension, 1947a. 3r. 2p., more or less.—(62.E.10686.)

THE CARGHAM TOWN COMMON shall comprise the unappropriated Crown lands within the town boundary of Cargham, consisting of about five hundred and eighty acres.—(62.E.10661.)

THE ESSENDON TOWN COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861) shall be and the same is hereby abolished.—(62.E.10405.)

THE ESSENDON MUNICIPAL COMMON shall be and comprise all the unappropriated Crown lands within the municipal district of Essendon and Flemington.—(62.E.10405.)

THE FRANKLIN FARMERS' COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861) is hereby increased by adding thereto the following area, viz.:—Two hundred and thirty-four acres three roods twenty-four perches, county of Talbot, parish of Yandoit, being allotments 2, 5, 6, and 7 of section 8, and allotment 2, section 5. Total area of common, including present extension, 933a. 3r. 24p., more or less.—(62.E.9641.)

THE HAMILTON MUNICIPAL COMMON shall be and comprise the Hamilton Town Common (described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifteenth day of July, 1861); together with the unappropriated Crown lands within the town boundary of Hamilton.—(62.E.10745.)

THE INKERMAN AND WATTLE FLAT GOLD FIELDS COMMON shall comprise the following area, viz.:—In the mining district of Maryborough, 3732 acres, more or less, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office; Melbourne, being the

unappropriated land within the following described boundaries, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of the Moliagul Gold Field Common; thence south two miles, more or less; thence east one hundred and ten chains, more or less; thence S. about 47° E. one hundred chains, more or less; to the north-west angle of the municipality of Dunolly; by the north-western boundary thereof about seven chains to the west boundary of Dunolly pre-emptive section; thence north to the north-west angle of said pre-emptive section; thence east by part of the north boundary of said pre-emptive section till it intersects the municipal boundary aforesaid; by said boundary north-easterly till it intersects the road from Dunolly to Moliagul; thence by said road northerly to the south-east angle of Moliagul Gold Field Common; by the south side of the last-named gold field common west to the point of commencement.—(62.F.9708.)

THE JAMIESON GOLD FIELD COMMON shall comprise the following area, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the Goulburn River about three (3) miles below its junction with the Jamieson River; thence east five miles; thence south five miles; thence west five miles; and thence north five miles to the commencing point.—Area, 16,000 acres.—(62.F.10602.)

THE KANGAROO GROUND FARMERS' COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifteenth day of July, 1861) is hereby increased by adding thereto the following area, viz.:—1950 acres, more or less, county of Evelyn: Commencing at a point on the present north boundary of the Kangaroo Ground Farmers' Common at a point where the road from Melbourne to Queenstown intersects it; thence northerly by said road to the south-west angle of the Saint Andrew's Gold Field Common; thence by a straight line bearing westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 12, at Arthur's Creek; by the north boundary thereof west to Arthur's Creek; by that creek southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 8, Arthur's Creek; thence by the south boundary thereof east to the north-east angle of allotment 5, section 17, Nillumbik; thence south to the northern boundary of the present Farmers' Common, Kangaroo Ground; and by the northern boundary thereof easterly to the point of commencement. Total area of common, including extension, 6270 acres, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the areas described.—(62.F.10529.)

THE NORTH WOORAGEE AND SOUTH WOORAGEE FARMERS' COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November, 1861, under the name of the Farmers' Common at South Wooragee) shall be for the use of agriculturists at North Wooragee and South Wooragee.—(62.E.10669.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field for, as the case may be] Common of " for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that each of the neighboring Commons hereinafter mentioned shall respectively be a United Common, under the following names, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF CARNGHAM shall comprise the Carngham Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing even date herewith, and the Carngham Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February, 1861, and shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons.—(62.E.10661.)

THE UNITED GOLD FIELDS COMMON OF DUNOLLY AND BURNT CREEK shall comprise the Dunolly Gold Fields Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, and the Burnt Creek Gold Field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of March, 1862, and shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons.—(62.F.10792.)

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering. The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately. Tenders may be for either of the supplies required, oats, bran, hay, or straw only, and if all be included in one tender, it will be accepted for one article only if advisable. The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked, "Tender for ——" (as the case may be), and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street, or if sent by post they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.
2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.
3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.
4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.
9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor, by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1863.
