PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

CHILTERN.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and ninety householders, resident at Chiltern, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they reside within the area hereinafter defined, and that the township of Chiltern is the centre of an extensive mining district, and comprises a mining and trading population who have invested large sums in trading stock, buildings, and mining plant.

That the land in the township has been lately sold, some of it at a high price, and that notwithstanding the amount paid to Government no provision has been made for roads or approaches to the town, the streets of which are sometimes almost impassable.

That the township contains over fifteen hundred residents.

They further state their opinion that the erection of their locality into a municipal district will greatly advance its interests and prosperity, and conduce to its permanent improvement and good government, and suggest an area circumscribed as follows, viz.—"Commencing at the north-west corner of the West Chiltern town reserve, and bounded thence by a line running east 160 chains; thence by a line at right angles to the former running south 112 chains 50 links to the north boundary of the suburban lands; thence by a line running west along the said suburban lands 160 chains; and thence by a line running north 112 chains 50 links to the commencing point" as marked on a plan which accompanied the petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"The petitioners pray that the said area may be proclaimed a municipal district in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, under the style and title of 'The Municipality of Chiltern.'"

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

VICINITY OF CRESWICK.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by thirty-eight persons, stated to be the majority of the householders resident within a defined area adjoining the Municipal District of Creswick, praying that their locality may be united with, and form part of, the said municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are a majority of the householders residing at Bald Hills, adjoining the southern boundary of the municipality of Creswick, and that they are desirous that the locality hereinafter described should be united to and form part of the said municipality, viz.—"Commencing at the south-west corner of the said municipality; thence south one mile and ten chains; thence east, one mile; thence north one mile and ten chains to a point on the south boundary line of the said municipality one mile east from the commencing point."

They further state that the number of householders residing within the abovementioned area exceeds thirty-six to the square mile, and that they believe it will be a great benefit to the inhabitants to have the locality annexed to the Creswick Municipality.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly beg that their petition will receive your Excellency's consideration, and that your Excellency will be pleased to grant the same."

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-seven landholders and householders resident at Brown's and Scarsdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are resident landholders and householders in the locality hereinafter described, and known as "Brown's and Scarsdale," in the parish of Scarsdale, which they are desirous should be erected into a municipal district.

That there are between 6000 and 6000 inhabitants in the proposed district, most of whom are engaged in mining, commercial, and agricultural pursuits, and are located at Brown's,

Scarsdale, and Black Hill, and that there is, besides, a large number of scattered habitations, the occupants of which it is desirable to include, and thus to secure to all the comforts and advantages derivable from centralization.

That the locality is well adapted for agriculture, and if rendered available by division into allotments of from half an acre to five acres or more will be capable of producing cereals and vegetables at present imported from other localities, and that the saving anticipated from such an arrangement might be applied to municipal requirements.

That the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, a genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are here concentrated; that 325 acres are held under mining leases at a rental of £1625; and that there are 35 steam-engines in operation, which, with their appliances, are valued at £50,000; fifteen commodious hotels, a large number of mercantile establishments of a costly description, comfortable dwellings, a considerable number of horses and cattle, and a weekly yield of about 1500 ounces of gold.

That the greatest inconvenience experienced by the petitioners arises from want of roads, there being but ten chains of made road in the district, and the intercourse with surrounding localities constant and frequent, and that the prices of articles of necessity are enhanced through the hazards and delay inseparable from bad roads.

Lastly, the petitioners are stimulated to improve the surrounding lines of communication by the anticipation that their district will become the entrepot between the western district and the sea-board *via* the Ballarat and Geelong Railway.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"Your petitioners seeing the manifold advantages of municipal institutions in other districts believe that similar results would follow the extension of the Municipal Act to theirs, and they therefore most humbly pray your Excellency to proclaim the area herein described as 'The municipal district of Brown's and Scarsdale,' [viz.]—commencing at the south-east corner of the Smythesdale municipality; thence west along the south boundary of the said municipality one hundred and twenty chains; thence by a continuation of the same line sixty chains; thence south three hundred and twenty chains; thence east one hundred and eighty chains, running partly along the north boundary of Brown's pre-emptive right; thence north three hundred and twenty chains to the commencing point aforesaid, the whole area being nine square miles."

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

VICINITY OF AMHERST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by forty-eight persons, stated to be the majority of the residents within an area contiguous to the municipal district of Amherst, praying that the said district may be enlarged so as to include their locality.

The petitioners represent that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area hereinafter described, which is contiguous to the municipal district of Amherst, and that, with the addition of their locality, the district will still comprise less than nine square miles.

They further state that they are entirely debarred from participating in municipal rights and privileges.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to extend the boundaries of the Municipality of Amherst in the following manner: Commencing at the south-east angle of section six with a line bearing east thirty-six chains thirty-six links; from thence by a line bearing north one hundred and fifty chains; from thence by a line bearing west thirty-six chains thirty-six links; from thence by a line bearing south one hundred and fifty chains to the point of commencement."

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 31.—TO PROVIDE FOR THE CLOSING OF PUBLIC STREETS, ETC., DURING THE PROGRESS OF PUBLIC WORKS, ETC., ETC.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary that for the purpose of forming, metalling, paving, and repairing the several public streets, roads, ways, and footpaths within the municipality of Ballarat, and for the construction and repairs of drains and sewers, or for the laying of water or gas pipes, or for the taking up and relaying or repairing the same, the public street, road, way, or path, or public streets, roads, ways, or paths, where any such works are being carried on, should be stopped up or closed against public traffic if considered necessary during the progress of such works or any of them: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Ballarat, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, &c., it shall be lawful for the said council to order and direct the closing up or stopping of any public street, road, way, or path within the limits of the municipality, against public traffic during the progress therein of any or all of the works above described, by any suitable barrier or barriers, or by notice or notices in writ-

ing at the ends or junction of any such public street, road, way, or path with any other street, road, way, or path, and to continue such barrier or barriers, notice or notices, until such time as such street, road, way, or path shall be ready and fit for public traffic. And be it further ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that if any person or persons shall take down, break, or remove any such barrier or barriers, notice or notices, as aforesaid, or proceed along any such public street, road, way, or path, without the consent of the said council being first obtained thereto, with any cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle, or with any horse, bullock, or other beast of burden, or cattle, whether attached to any such cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle, or not, during the progress of any such work or works as aforesaid, or until such barrier or barriers, notice or notices, shall have been removed at the instance of the said council, any person or persons so offending shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 31, made by the municipal council of Ballarat, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

BYE-LAW No. 28.—EMPOWERING THE COUNCIL TO ESTABLISH BOTANIC GARDENS AT KILMORE, AND TO EXPEND MONEYS TOWARDS THE MAINTENANCE THEREOF.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, power is given to the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the establishment of botanic gardens and the maintenance and management thereof: And whereas by a proclamation published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 6th December, 1861, a public garden is therein appropriated and set apart for the use of Kilmore, and described as follows, namely:—Thirty acres two roods sixteen perches, county of Dalhousie, parish of Bylands: Commencing at the north-east angle of section 18, Kilmore; thence bounded on the north by a road one chain wide, bearing east eighteen chains; on the east by a line south seventeen chains; on the south by a line west eighteen chains; and on the west by Graves street, bearing north seventeen chains to the point of commencement. And whereas it is deemed advisable by the municipal council of Kilmore to make a bye-law for the purposes herein mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said council, that from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, may and when so soon as they may think fit establish a botanic garden within the boundaries of the public garden herein described, and may from time to time pay and expend out of the rates, tolls, dues, or other funds at the disposal of the council, such a sum or sums as the council may deem expedient or necessary for or towards the establishing, maintenance, and management of any such botanic garden to be established and maintained by the said council.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 28, made by the municipal council of Kilmore, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW No. 19.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING THE SLAUGHTERING OF SMALL CATTLE WITHIN THE TOWN OF MARYBOROUGH.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the preservation of the public health, the suppression of nuisances, and the regulation of slaughter-houses: And whereas it is necessary and expedient for the preservation of the public health to prevent the nuisances arising from improperly constructed slaughter-houses and butchers' yards: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maryborough, that all butchers or other persons whose premises shall have been suitably prepared and properly paved for the purpose of slaughtering, so that in the judgment of the council, after the report of the inspector or other officer, the premises are found to be in a fit and proper state, shall be granted a license and permitted to kill sheep, lambs, swine or goats; provided that all such persons shall receive, or cause to be received, the blood into tubs, together with all offal or other offensive matter, and remove the same or cause it to be removed from such premises at least once in every twenty-four hours.

That all such premises shall be registered at the office of the town clerk, and the same premises shall always be open to the inspection of the municipal council or their inspector or other officer. That no butcher, or other person as aforesaid, shall kill any sheep, lambs, swine or goats, except upon premises registered as aforesaid, and without being duly licensed, except such butcher or other person be the *bond fide* servant of a duly licensed person.

That it shall not be lawful for any licensed butcher or other person to kill any sheep, lambs, swine or goats on premises distinct and apart, except all such premises are severally registered, and a license be taken out to slaughter on each of such premises as though they belonged to different owners and persons.

That written notice of application for such license and registration shall be given to the town clerk at least eight days before the same be granted, made, and entered, and be exhibited at his office; and that the said license and registration

shall issue and be made on the first Monday in every month, or upon such other day as the council may appoint.

That any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 19, made by the municipal council of Maryborough, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

PROCLAMATION*

By JAMES A. R. MENZIES, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Southland.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to delegate, under the *Diseased Cattle Act*, 1861, to the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, the several powers vested in the Governor by the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 10th sections of the said Act, subject to the Regulations contained in the Order in Council of 1st October, 1861: And whereas by a Proclamation given under my hand, dated 2nd October, 1861, it was amongst other things declared, that the inspector was thereby prohibited from granting a certificate to land any cattle imported from the colony of Victoria: And whereas it is expedient to make further provision in that behalf: Now therefore I, the Superintendent, in virtue of the powers vested in me, do hereby proclaim that the inspector of cattle under the said Act shall not be authorised to grant a certificate to land in the province of Southland cattle coming from any of the Australian Colonies, namely, Queensland, New South Wales (except as hereinafter mentioned), Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia, and Tasmania, from the date hereof: Provided that cattle arriving in the Province of Southland from the Port of Newcastle, in the colony of New South Wales, in a vessel which shall have put to sea with the same on or before the 24th of December current (and which shall not thereafter have touched at the same or any other port until her arrival at a port within the Province of Southland), shall, under the provisions of sub-section 2, section 4 of the said Act, be permitted to land upon the Quarantine Ground as the same has been defined in the proclamation of 2nd October, 1861, aforesaid, there to remain until the said inspector shall permit the same to be removed from thence; the said Quarantine Ground being bounded on the west by the Bluff Harbor; on the north by the eastern arm of the said harbor, and by a right line extending due east from its eastern extremity until it intersects the east boundary of the Campbelltown Hundred; on the east by the east boundary of the Campbelltown Hundred, from the said point of intersection to the sea coast; on the south by the ocean.

RETIREMENT BY ROTATION, RESIGNATIONS AND ELECTIONS.

At the close of the last (being the fourth) municipal year, the chairman, G. Clendinning, Esq., Councillors C. Dyte and S. J. Bradshaw retired by rotation. C. Dyte, Esq., was re-elected; F. Young and J. Fussell, Esqs., were elected in the places of Councillors Clendinning and Bradshaw. At the first meeting of the council (on June 4th), Councillor W. Scott was elected chairman of the council. On August the 27th Councillor Davies resigned his seat; and on September the 10th, the chairman, W. Scott, Esq., resigned the chair and his seat in the council; and at the meeting October the 1st, Councillor C. Dyte was elected chairman of the council for the remainder of the year. An election took place on the 11th day of October, when David Turpie and Emanuel Steinfield, Esqs., were duly elected in the places of W. Scott and H. Davies, Esqs.

OFFICIAL CHANGES.

At the meeting for the nomination of candidates held 31st May, a resolution was duly carried by the ratepayers abolishing the salary previously paid to the chairman, and the duties of that office are therefore now performed gratuitously. The resignation of Mr. B. W. Walshe as engineer and surveyor to the council having been accepted at the end of the last year, Mr. John Carruthers was on 21st June appointed to that office. On 4th June, Mr. T. Hayes was appointed assessor in addition to his offices of town inspector and collector, and on 12th November Sergeant James Larnier was appointed inspector of nuisances.

WORKS EXECUTED DURING THE HALF-YEAR.

Maintaining and repairing 300 chains of streets within the municipality.
Maintaining and repairing 177 chains of kerbed and planked footpaths.
Renewing 4 chains of planked and kerbed footpaths.
Maintaining 1852 yards of water mains, branch pipes, fire-cocks, &c.
Erecting 24 rods of fencing round the old burial ground at Golden Point.
Erecting 18 rods of fencing at the excavation in Esmond street.
Cutting 2½ chains of channeling to prevent the flooding of the cricket ground.
Forming and metaling 3 chains of Clayton street.
Forming and metaling 30½ chains of Mair and Princes streets, pitching 20 chains of channeling, making two culverts, and furnishing 106 cubic yards of quartz for maintenance.
Filling in, leveling, and graveling the Market Reserve, Peel street.
Fixing weighbridge and erecting office, &c.
Lighting and repairing ten gas lamps.
Watering Main and Bridge streets.

WORKS IN PROGRESS OF EXECUTION.

Erecting bridge over Canadian Creek and making 18 chains of approaches thereto.
Building the town hall, plastering, fencing, and fitting-up police court.

APPLICATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT GRANTED.

For a portion of the cost of improvements to the police court.
For an additional area to the cemetery reserve, and a portion of the parliamentary grant for fencing and improvements.
For the proclamation of the cricket and recreation reserve.
That the powder magazine may be erected on Golden Point, in preference to the proposed site near the Redan Lead.

APPLICATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT UNDER CONSIDERATION.

That as by the 18 Victoria, clause 27, the care and management of cemeteries is vested in the municipal council, that the amount awarded by the Board of Land and Works for fencing and improvements, be paid to the council to expend for that purpose.—Submitted for the decision of His Excellency the Governor.

That one crossing at least may be constructed over the railway between Ballarat East and Warrneep, but which the engineer-in-chief reports is not required.

That the works requisite for the completion and opening of the railway may be more energetically proceeded with.

That the pitching with bluestone of the channels of the Main road may be completed, and that bluestone metal may be used in future for the road instead of quartz.

MISCELLANEOUS SUBJECTS.

The Governor's Visit.

His Excellency the Governor honored the district with a visit in October last, on which occasion the municipal councils, in conjunction with the other local bodies, co-operated to give him the most fitting reception their means would allow, by a public procession and banquet, and by presenting addresses expressive of their loyalty to his office, and the high esteem and regard felt by all classes toward His Excellency individually. The address from this council was presented by the chairman and members in front of the Town Hall.

Sludge Channel.

It having been estimated that £5000 would pay for the necessary works to complete the sludge channels, that sum was voted by the Government during the last session, but on preparing the detailed plans and specifications it was found that to carry out the work in a complete and permanent manner a much larger sum would be required; the Government have therefore accepted tenders for a portion of the work to the amount of the money voted, and placed a sufficient sum on the estimates for next year to enable the whole work to be completed.

Survey of streets.

The council have always felt that the greatest drawback to the prosperity of the municipality was the want of properly laid out streets, to which the inhabitants could build their residences; it has, however, at length succeeded in inducing the Government to cause the work to be proceeded with, which is now being done, and the frontage lines marked with trenches and posts, which will doubtless greatly assist in the further settlement of the district.

Street railway.—Application being made to the council by Thos. Loader, Esq., M.L.A., agent for Train's patent street railways, for permission to construct the same through certain streets, conditional permission was given.

Railway.—In compliance with the resolutions carried at a very numerously attended meeting of the inhabitants, this council, in conjunction with the western council, and several of the most influential residents, formed a committee and put themselves in communication with the representatives of the western districts, for the purpose of stimulating the apparently lethargic progress of the railway works between Ballarat and Geelong, and to cause a time in the early part of this year to be fixed on for their completion and the opening of the line, seeing that the contract time had long since expired, and the progress of the work gave no indication as to when it would be finished, neither could any satisfactory information be obtained from the official or professional heads of the department; the committee have caused a very numerously signed petition from this and the surrounding districts to be presented to the Legislative Assembly by W. C. Smith, Esq., and a committee of the House has been appointed to inquire into the causes of the supposed unnecessary delay, which this council hopes will have the effect at least of causing greater progress to be made in future, and the railway to be opened some months earlier than it otherwise would have been, notwithstanding that the engineer-in-chief thought himself justified in stating that the public action taken would have the effect of retarding the progress of the work, a deduction rather difficult to be understood apart from personal feeling.

Town Hall.—The necessity which existed for more convenient offices in which to carry on the business of the council, and for the security of its property, and also in consequence of the unfinished state of the police court, which caused great inconvenience in the transaction of the business, the council deemed it advisable to modify the original designs of the building, so that the cost would be more compatible with its means, and to enter into a contract for the erection of the building, and the finishing and fitting up the police court, which is being carried out satisfactorily.
