#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sig Henry Barrly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, initialed, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony; bearing date the eighteenth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Farmers' Common at Camperdown: And whereas a portion of the said common has been taken up by holders of residence and cultivation licenses, and it is expedient to add to the said common other land in lieu of the land so taken up: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Farmers' Common at Camperdown aforesaid, and I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be an addition to the FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land at or near Camperdown aforesaid, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say.—

Additional contents of the Common of Camperdown and Parlaments of the Said Act, that is to say.—

ADDITION TO CAMPERDOWN FARMERS' COMMON (in lieu of Four hundred and thirty-one acres two roods seven perches taken up by residence and cultivation licenses).—Four hundred

and thirty-one acres two roods seven perches, county of Hampden, parish of Marida Yallock: Commencing at the south-east angle of the farmers' common as already proclaimed; thence southerly by a road sixty chains thirty-five links; thence by the parish boundary, bearing S. 33° 30° W. sixty-seven chains sixty-five links; thence northerly by a line sixty-eight chains three links; thence easterly sixty-seven chains twenty-two links to the point of commencement, excluding therefrom all sold or alienated land.—(61.C.11630.)

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation

under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Coleraine: And whereas it is expedient to increase the said common, by adding therefor the area hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be an addition to the Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the said town of Coleraine, in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if the said additional area had been included within the area described in the said Proclamation, that is to say:—
