MULGRAVE FARMERS' COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land at or near the locality hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for a Farmers' Common in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act.

MULGRAVE FARMERS' COMMON.—Parish of Mulgrave, county of Bourke; 743 acres, more or less, in the parish of Mulgrave; being portions 91, 98, and 101 (pursuant to Order of 10th February, 1862), being the unappropriated lands within the abovenamed portions.—(G2.E.676.)

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

No. 6.—BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING AND ENFORCING THE DRAINAGE OF CLAIMS IN THE ARARAT DIVISION OF THE ARARAT DISTRICT.—[13th of January, 1862.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 13th day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. Upon the petition of not less than six (6) claimholders, being holders of miners' rights, interested in claims to be drained under the provisions of this bye-law, praying for the appointment of a committee to carry out and exercise the powers and privileges in respect to drainage conferred upon mining boards by the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, No. 115, the surveyor shall, on receiving instructions from the board, post a notice or notices in the form of the schedule hereto annexed, calling upon all persons who may object to such appointment to urge their objections at a place and time set forth in such notice before the board, and any parties objecting shall be heard, and the petitioners shall also be heard in support of their petition, and the board may either grant or refuse the prayer of such petition, and if granted, shall fix the number constituting such committee, but not to exceed seven members.

2. Attached to the petition there shall be a map prepared by the mining surveyor of the ground over which the petitioners desire the committee to have jurisdiction, showing the number of claims liable to be assessed, the area therein unoccupied, also a sectional plan, showing the natural water level, drawn to a scale of one inch to one chain, and a report on the general features and drainage requirements of the ground, and also a specification from the petitioners of the manner or mode by which they propose to drain the said ground, whether by machinery or otherwise. The surveyor shall define the boundaries of the ground aforesaid, by placing at each angle of the same a substantial post four feet high, and cutting a V trench extending three feet therefrom, showing the boundary lines. The board may require any further information from the petitioners that may be deemed necessary.

3. The petitioners shall deposit with the clerk of the board the sum of Three pounds sterling (£3) before the petition shall be entertained, to defray any expenses which may be incurred by the board in determining on such petition, the balance (if any) to be returned.

4. The objectors shall lodge the sum of Three pounds sterling (£3) with the clerk of the board, previous to making their objections, and the board shall have power to award that sum, or any portion of it, to the petitioners, should such objections be deemed frivolous or vexatious.

5. Any claimholders, being holders of miners' rights, liable to be interfered with by the drainage aforesaid may be nominated for appointment on such committee, and in case the nominations should exceed the number previously determined by the board to constitute such committee, the board shall proceed to elect from such number a committee as aforesaid at the first following meeting of the board.

6. In case of the death, refusal to act, or resignation of any member of committee, the board will receive nominations and elect another member in his stead in the manner aforesaid.

7. The surveyor shall be entitled to demand from any such petitioners as aforesaid the amount of fees hereby prescribed for making the survey, duplicate plans (one of which shall be filed with the clerk of the board by the petitioners), ascertaining and reporting on the water level, and affording such other information as may be required by the board.

No. 7.—BYE-LAW FOR DETERMINING THE VALIDITY OF DISPUTED ELECTIONS IN THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT (18TH DECEMBER, 1861).

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 18th day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, it is ordained by the said board, as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Manner of proceeding.*—If any election of any candidate to a seat at this board be disputed, a petition may be presented to the board, stating the reasons for disputing such election. Such petition must be lodged with the clerk of the board within twenty-one (21) days after the election complained of.

2. *Attendance of witnesses.*—Any person wishing the attendance of any witness, he shall state the same to the clerk of the board, who shall issue a notice (in form of schedule), requesting the attendance of such witness at a time and place stated in such notice.

3. *Hearing of the petition.*—After the petition has been lodged the case shall be investigated at the next general meeting of the board, or, if necessary, at a special meeting called by the chairman.

4. *Information to be forwarded to member whose election is disputed.*—When any such petition has been presented against the election of a member of the board, the clerk shall forward him a written notice and a copy of the petition presented, and also inform him on what day the board will sit to examine witnesses and give a decision on the case. The member whose election is disputed may bring any necessary witnesses.

5. *Decision of the Board.*—The decision of the board shall be arrived at by the vote of the members present, and the person so determined to be (or not) duly elected shall be declared by the chairman; such decision shall be final.

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—SUPPLEMENTARY TO BYE-LAW No. 6 (REGULATING QUARTZ MINING IN THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT) GAZETTED ON THE 28TH SEPTEMBER, 1860.—[13th January, 1862.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the thirteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

Extent of tunnelling prospecting claims.—When prospecting for a quartz reef where tunnelling operations are required, two (2) men shall be entitled to hold eight hundred (800) feet along the course of the reef, by a breadth of one thousand (1000) feet until payable gold is found, after which such width must be reduced to four hundred (400) feet, and marked out at right angles with the course of the payable reef discovered by a peg at each corner, and such tunnelling claim must then be represented and worked by not less than fourteen (14) men, and all reefs and veins of quartz within the said reduced area shall be the property of the shareholders.

Tunnelling claims shall be held and worked subject to all the clauses of bye-law No. 6 (gazetted on the 28th September, 1860), regulating quartz mining, excepting clauses Nos. 12 and 13, relating to the suspension of work, which shall not be allowed in such tunnelling claims.

BYE-LAW NO. 10.—SUPPLEMENTARY TO BYE-LAW NO. 4 (REGULATING ALLUVIAL MINING IN THE ARARAT DIVISION OF THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT) GAZETTED ON THE 1ST OCTOBER, 1861.—[13th January, 1862.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 13th day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Prospecting*.—Any party commencing and continuing to sink on any new lead two hundred and fifty (250) yards ahead of the last payable claim shall be entitled to a claim equal in extent to double the ordinary sized claim of the class of mining to which such sinking belongs, provided the length of such extended claim shall in no case exceed double its breadth.

2. *Wet sinking, block claims*.—In block claims where rock occurs in the sinking below the water level, the size of claims shall be as follows:—

- Four (4) men, one hundred (100) feet square.
- Six (6) men, one hundred and twenty (120) feet square.
- Eight (8) men, one hundred and forty (140) feet square.

3. *Frontage leads*.—Where rock occurs in the sinking below the water level, the size of claims shall be three hundred and twenty (320) feet along the supposed course of the lead by a width of one hundred and fifty (150) yards until the lead is struck in the claim, one month after which the width shall be reduced to two hundred (200) feet, and eight (8) men shall constitute a party.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-seven landholders and householders resident at Brown's and Scarsdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are resident landholders and householders in the locality hereinafter described, and known as "Brown's and Scarsdale," in the parish of Scarsdale, which they are desirous should be erected into a municipal district.

That there are between 5000 and 6000 inhabitants in the proposed district, most of whom are engaged in mining, commercial, and agricultural pursuits, and are located at Brown's, Scarsdale, and Black Hill, and that there is, besides, a large

number of scattered habitations, the occupants of which it is desirable to include, and thus to secure to all the comforts and advantages derivable from centralization.

That the locality is well adapted for agriculture, and if rendered available by division into allotments of from half an acre to five acres or more will be capable of producing cereals and vegetables at present imported from other localities, and that the saving anticipated from such an arrangement might be applied to municipal requirements.

That the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, a genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are here concentrated; that 325 acres are held under mining leases at a rental of £1625; and that there are 35 steam-engines in operation, which, with their appliances, are valued at £50,000; fifteen commodious hotels, a large number of mercantile establishments of a costly description, comfortable dwellings, a considerable number of horses and cattle, and a weekly yield of about 1500 ounces of gold.

That the greatest inconvenience experienced by the petitioners arises from want of roads, there being but ten chains of made road in the district, and the intercourse with surrounding localities constant and frequent, and that the prices of articles of necessity are enhanced through the hazards and delay inseparable from bad roads.

Lastly, the petitioners are stimulated to improve the surrounding lines of communication by the anticipation that their district will become the entrepôt between the western district and the sea-board *via* the Ballarat and Geelong Railway.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"Your petitioners seeing the manifold advantages of municipal institutions in other districts believe that similar results would follow the extension of the Municipal Act to them; and they therefore most humbly pray your Excellency to proclaim the area herein described as 'The municipal district of Brown's and Scarsdale,' [viz.]—commencing at the south-east corner of the Snythesdale municipality; thence west along the south boundary of the said municipality one hundred and twenty chains; thence by a continuation of the same line sixty chains; thence south three hundred and twenty chains; thence east one hundred and eighty chains, running partly along the north boundary of Brown's pre-emptive right; thence north three hundred and twenty chains to the commencing point aforesaid, the whole area being nine square miles."

WHEREAS by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every work proposed to be executed by any municipal council, by funds raised by aid from the Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be the subject of a distinct and separate bye-law: And whereas the legislature of this colony has made a grant in aid of the public works of this municipality of Five hundred and sixty-two pounds thirteen shillings (£562 13s.), as a second instalment for the year 1861: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Kilmore, that such amount be expended as follows, that is to say:—Erecting a new bridge near Rutledge street; erecting a new footbridge in Mitchell street; additions to the stone crossing in John street; additional kerbing and channelling in Sydney street; cutting and forming portions of Union, Albert, Melbourne, Victoria, and Gipps streets; and generally for making, repairing, maintaining, and draining said bridges, crossing, and streets, together with the footpaths, waterchannels, and drains belonging to the same.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 27, made by the municipal council of Kilmore, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

By the eighth section of the Act, "Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenure of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever."

5. Application for such permission to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying, on payment of the charges in the schedule A.

6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person died in indigent circumstances, and that the relatives of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

8. Orders for interment to be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not, an extra charge will be made (see schedule A). No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or bricked grave to be bricked in, or cemented closely, and covered by a slab of stone or iron, to the satisfaction of the trustees.

11. The plans of all monuments, tombstones, and fences to be submitted to the trustees for approval.

12. Any person wantonly and wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.

13. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the month of September to April inclusive, and from Eight o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year. No funeral will be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven o'clock p.m. and Seven o'clock a.m.

15. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.
