DESCRIPTION OF THE OFFENDERS.

First man, 35 or 40 years of age, 6 feet high, stout-built; wore moleskin trousers, and carried a pepper-box revolver.
Second man, 28 years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, had a deep scar between the forefinger and thumb of one hand, and wore Bedford cord trousers.

DESCRIPTION OF THE OFFENDERS.

First man, aged about 27, with thin features, sandy whiskers worn round the face, and dark hair; he wore a dark coat (supposed reversible), light-colored trousers, and blue veil; he carried a revolver, and rode a light bay horse with switch tail.

Second man is only described as wearing a dirty silk handkerchief over his face; he rode a bay horse, and carried either a revolver or large pistol.

Third man, wore a blue or green veil and carried a revolver.
The second and third men seemed to be not over 30 years of age.

One of the offenders has also been described as about 22 years of age, with sandy hair, little or no whiskers, much sunburnt, and as wearing a brown wideawake hat, moleskin pants, and Napoleon boots.

The offenders above described are supposed to be the same men who on the same evening robbed James Pullen about two miles from Ewbank's station, and after the robbery took the road to Fiery Creek.

JURY LIST TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF SMYTHESDALE.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of February, 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventeenth day of February instant, it is ordered that a county court shall be holden at Smythesdale, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that a jury list shall be prepared for the jury district of Smythesdale, in the manner and within the intervals hereinafter stated, that is to say:—

The clerk of petty sessions at Smythesdale shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Smythesdale on or before Friday, the twenty-eighth day of February instant; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the eighth section of the said Act shall be affixed, as provided by the said Act, on Sunday, the sixth and thirteenth days of April in the present year; the court of petty sessions at Smythesdale aforesaid shall revise such list on Friday, the ninth day of May then next ensuing; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Monday, the twelfth day of May aforesaid; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday, the second day of June next ensuing.

And the Honorable John Dennistoun Wood, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the thirtieth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Farmers' Common at Codrington, &c.: And whereas it is expedient to substitute another area in lieu of the said common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be the FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land at or near Codrington aforesaid, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT CODRINGTON. — Twelve thousand acres, more or less, counties of Villiers and Normanby, parish of Codrington, and parish unnamed, being the unappropriated lands within the following boundaries, viz.: Commencing at a point on the Shaw River due west of the north-west angle of allotment 18, section E, parish of Yambuk, county of Villiers; thence west one and a half miles; thence north two miles forty chains, more or less, to a point due west from the north-west angle of allotment 5, section F, Yambuk; thence west six hundred and eight chains, more or less, crossing the Eumeralla River; thence south two hundred and sixteen chains, more or less, to the sea coast; thence by the sea coast south-easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 11, parish of Eumeralla; thence northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 23, section A, parish of Codrington; thence easterly and southerly by the north and part of the east sides of

allotments 23, 22, 19, 18, 15, 14, 13, 10, and 8, section A, to the north-east angle of allotment 8, section A, parish of Codrington; thence by the northern boundary of allotment 9, south-easterly to the north-east angle thereof; thence by the Shaw River northerly to the commencing point.—(62 F.925.)

NOTICE TO MARINERS. Entrance to the New River.

Strangers bound for the New River from the eastward should haul well off the land until they open the Flagstaff, in order to give time for the pilot to communicate with them by signal, and to board them outside the bar.

If the tide or other circumstances should be unfavorable for a vessel entering, a Blue Peter will be hoisted at the signal-staff as a signal for the vessel to keep to sea.

On a red flag being hoisted, a vessel should stand in, keeping the Outer Beacon—which will be distinctly visible near the water's edge on the extremity of the South Head—in one with the Inner Beacon, which is in front of the pilot's house, on a small green rise. The bearing of the beacons is east by south by compass.

The pilot, who is now provided with good boats and crew, and a substitute in case of absence, will invariably board all vessels not showing the exemption flag.

When about a cable's length from the Outer Beacon, the channel will show out quite clear, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. by compass, and the vessel can stand up it, keeping not less than a half-cable's length from the south shore.

The Inner Beacons must then be looked for. The lower one is conspicuous on the beach a long mile from the Pilot Station. The upper one is amongst the sand hills, about 40 feet above the other. The upper one should be kept a very little open on the south side of the lower one, and on no account be opened in the least to the north of it until abreast of the small beacon next noticed.

About midway between the Pilot Station and the Inner Beacon, and about a quarter of a mile outside (west) of the Maori village, a small white beacon will be seen on the shore, near the edge of the beach, marking a reef which runs out from it, nearly a cable's length to the north. The extremity of this reef is also marked by a pile—[a stake with a bush on it.—T. R., A. J. E., A. F. M.]—a vessel may pass this at a half-cable's length, the channel being there two [2] cables' length wide.

From thence the course is straight for the Bombay Rock. Buoys are now being prepared for the further marking out the channel; when they are laid down, due notice will be given of their positions, and of the changes which will then be made in the beacons.

BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-seven landholders and householders resident at Brown's and Scarsdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are resident landholders and householders in the locality hereinafter described, and known as "Brown's and Scarsdale," in the parish of Scarsdale, which they are desirous should be erected into a municipal district.

That there are between 5000 and 6000 inhabitants in the proposed district, most of whom are engaged in mining, commercial, and agricultural pursuits, and are located at Brown's, Scarsdale, and Black Hill, and that there is, besides, a large number of scattered habitations, the occupants of which it is desirable to include, and thus to secure to all the comforts and advantages derivable from centralization.

That the locality is well adapted for agriculture, and if rendered available by division into allotments of from half an acre to five acres or more will be capable of producing cereals and vegetables at present imported from other localities; and that the saving anticipated from such an arrangement might be applied to municipal requirements.

That the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, a genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are here concentrated; that 325 acres are held under mining leases at a rental of £1625; and that there are 35 steam-engines in operation, which, with their appliances, are valued at £50,000; fifteen commodious hotels, a large number of mercantile establishments of a costly description, comfortable dwellings, a considerable number of horses and cattle, and a weekly yield of about 1500 ounces of gold.

That the greatest inconvenience experienced by the petitioners arises from want of roads, there being but ten chains of made road in the district, and the intercourse with surrounding localities constant and frequent, and that the prices of articles of necessity are enhanced through the hazards and delay inseparable from bad roads.

Lastly, the petitioners are stimulated to improve the surrounding lines of communication by the anticipation that their district will become the entrepôt between the western district and the sea-board *via* the Ballaarat and Geelong Railway.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"Your petitioners seeing the manifold advantages of municipal institutions in other districts believe that similar results would follow the extension of the Municipal Act to theirs, and they therefore most humbly pray your Excellency to proclaim the area herein described as 'The municipal district of Brown's and Scarsdale,' [viz.]—commencing at the south-east corner of the Smythesdale municipality; thence west along the south boundary of the said municipality one hundred and twenty chains; thence by a continuation of the same line sixty chains; thence south three hundred and twenty chains; thence east one hundred and eighty chains, running partly along the north boundary of Brown's pre-emptive right; thence north three hundred and twenty chains to the commencing point aforesaid, the whole area being nine square miles."

BYE-LAW No. 34.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SLAUGHTER-HOUSES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EMERALD HILL.

WHEREAS it is expedient to prevent the injury to the public health arising from the practice of slaughtering within the town proper of Emerald Hill, and to establish slaughter-houses in and for the municipal district of Emerald Hill: And whereas buildings and other conveniences suitable for the purposes of slaughtering have been erected and provided within the said district outside the limits of the town proper, upon a piece of land situate on the south bank of the River Yarra Yarra, and commonly called and known as "The Abattoirs Site," commencing at a point on the south bank of the said river, being the intersection of the said bank with the old western boundary of the city of Melbourne; thence along the boundary line between the municipalities of Sandridge and Emerald Hill (said line being the north-east boundary of the municipality of Sandridge) 1563 feet to the north-west angle of the said site; thence at right angles to the said municipal boundary line one chain fifty links to the north corner of said site; thence south-easterly and at right angles to the last line ten chains; thence south-westerly and perpendicular to the preceding line one chain fifty links to the aforesaid municipal boundary line; thence along the said line ten chains to the

beforementioned north-west corner of said site, the area thereof being one acre two roods: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the said district, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, as required by law, the said buildings and premises shall be, and the same are hereby established, as and for slaughter-houses for the said district.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 34, made by the municipal council of Emerald Hill, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDRIDGE.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SLAUGHTER-HOUSES OR ABATTOIRS FOR THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SANDRIDGE.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria, No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the establishment of slaughter-houses: And whereas the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf by the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, has temporarily reserved from sale at Sandridge a site for municipal abattoirs and yards in connection therewith, pursuant to Order of 18th March, 1861, the said site being further described in the *Government Gazette* of 28th March, 1861: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Sandridge, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of Victoria:—

1. That the municipal council of Sandridge shall and may establish, upon the ground set apart as aforesaid, such slaughter-houses, abattoirs, and yards as may be considered requisite for the use of the municipal district of Sandridge; and appoint such officers for the inspection of such slaughter-houses, abattoirs, and yards; and permit such person or persons as the municipal council aforesaid may deem eligible, to occupy and manage such slaughter-houses, abattoirs, and yards, and also to kill and slaughter such animals as may by law be slaughtered therein.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 9, made by the municipal council of Sandridge, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.
