Wy HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, if he should think fit, on the receipt of a petition signed by the householders purporting to be the majority resident within an area adjoining to any proclaimed municipal district containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof, praying that such locality by a general description might be united with and form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district, to declare by proclamation, with the No. 27.—February 28, 1862.—1. consent of the council of such proclaimed district, such locality to be united with and form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district, and also by the same or any other Proclamation, to define the limits and boundaries of such locality, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the Government Gazette, such locality so defined should be and be deemed to be united with and should form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district; provided that no such Proclamation be issued as above until the substance and prayer of such petition should have been published for at least one month previously in the Government Gazette: And whereas the householders purporting to be the majority resident within an area adjoining to the municipal district of Amherst have presented a petition to the Governor, praying for the annexation of the locality therein mentioned to the said municipal district have consented to such annexation: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Erceutive Council, and with the consent of the municipal council of Amherst, do by this my Proclamation declare that the locality hereinafter described shall be united with and form part of the said municipal district of Amherst, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 8, section 5

to the municipal district of Essendon and Flemington: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, revoke the said Proclama-tion; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Essendon and Flemington.

Bye-law No. 13.—For making an Assessment and imposing a rate of One shilling and thrrepence in the pound for the current Municipal Year ending 19th October, 1862.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, instituted, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is authorised and required to assess all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to Her Majesty) according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current municipal year: And whereas the council of the municipal district of Hotham has lately caused a valuation of all rateable property within the said district to be made for the purpose of assessing the same, and which said value amounts to the sum of £39,612: And whereas all appeals against such valuation have been finally heard and determined, and such valuation have been finally heard and determined, and such valuation have been finally the act and district of the sum of £37,434: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said Act: And whereas such amended valuation amounts to the sum of £37,434: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said municipal council of Hotham, that the said valuation or assessment as amended be confirmed, and that a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound for the current municipal year ending 19th October, 1862, on the said annual value of the said respective properties, be and the same is hereby imposed and levied, and that three-fifths of the amount of such rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of February, 1862, and the residue on the 1st day of May, 1862.

MUNICIPALITY OF SMYTHESDALE.

BYE-LAW NO. 5. —A BYE-LAW FOR CONDUCTING PUBLIC MEETINGS OF THE RATEFAYERS AND ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL, AND ALSO FOR REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS AT THE ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

AT all public meetings of the rategayers, in the absence of the chairman, the senior councillor then present shall preside.

- preside.

 2. In any poling place, no person other than the chairman, the town clerk it his deputy, the scrutineers, or electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be prevent; and it is hereby provided that it shall always be lawful for the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, to summon to his assistance in such compartment or room any member or members of the police force, for the purpose of preserving the public peace, quelling any breach thereof that may have arisen, and for removing out of such room any person or persons who may in his opinion be obstructing the polling or wilfully violating any of the provisions of this section of this bye-law.

 3. The chairman shall cause to be provided for the purpose
- of this bye-law.

 3. The chairman shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked-up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting-papers, and which box shall stand in front of the chairman, and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting-paper in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose and there strike out the name or names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot-box, in the presence of the chairman, town clerk or his deputy, and scrutineers; and in case such elector shall be unable to read, or be blind, he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate; and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting-paper either before or after he has marked the same.

- 4. Each cancerase shall be entitled to appoint by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before Eight o'clock in the morning of the day of polling, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling place.

5. The chairman may put to any person, before he shall have received his voting-paper, the following questions:—
First. What is your name and surname?
Second. Are you twe-fey-one years of age?
Third. Are you a-fatepayer on the ratepayers' roll of the municipal district of Smythesdale?
Fourth. Have you paid all rates levied upon you except such as shall hav become payable by you within six months before this/lection?

6. At every el/tion it shall be the duty of the town clerk or

At every el'ction it shall be the duty of the town clerk or his deputy to provide himself with the ratepayers' roll, and as each elector comes forward to demand his voting-paper, to see whether the name of such elector appears upon the roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the Municipal Act, and as each elector deposits his voting-paper within the ballot-box to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.
- mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

 7. In case the voting-paper as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting-paper as of the same person, the chairman, when such person shall propose to deposit his voting-paper in the ballotbox, shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall receive and keyp the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether, such person has already voted or not, and his decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties; and if it shall appear to 'be chairman that such person has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise such vote shall not be allowed.

- 8. At the close of the poll, or as soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman, in the presence of the scrutineers, shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate; and if, on the state of the poll being announced, the number of votes shall have been found to have been equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall, by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected, be entitled to be declared elected, the chairman shall by a casting voto or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected; and the chairman shall then, in the presence of the scrutineers, seal up all the voting-papers given during the election, and safely preserve them amongst the records of the council.

 9. The chairman of the council shall be annually elected in
- given during the election, and safely preserve them amongst the records of the council.

The chairman of the council shall be annually elected in the following manner:—At the first meeting of the council after the annual election, which meeting shall be convened by the retiring chairman, or the person presiding at the annual election, the senior councillor then present shall take the chair at the hour mentioned in the notice calling the meeting, provided the whole council be present, otherwise at the expiry of half an hour thereafter, and the council shall proceed, by open voting on motion as usual, to elect a chairman for the current year, and the councillor in whose favor the show of hands shall be, shall be declared by the acting chairman to be chairman of the council for the current year, and shall take the chair accordingly.

 10. If the result of voting for chairman should be that the highest number of votes is held equally by more than two councillors, then another voting shall take place for those councillors only having such equality of votes, until a majority is recorded.

 11. Upon the resignation or disqualification of the chairman of the council, at the next meeting of the council thereafter the senior councillor then present shall take the chair pro tem, and immediately after the confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, shall proceed to the election of a chairman of council for the residue of the municipal year, in manner prescribed by this bye-law, it shall be understood to mean those councillors who shall have held office for the longest period without re-election, and having the greatest number of votes when elected.

THE business of the board shall be conducted, except on special occasions, with open doors.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held at the office of the board, on every fourth Saturday, at Ten o'clock a.m. The business to commence as soon as a quorum of three is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and the meeting shall lapse.

3. 4. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be reacting, as to their accuracy.

7. On the presentation of a petition, or the bringing up of a report, no debate shall take place thereon, until notice has been given in the usual manner, unless two-thirds of the board be present; and the only question that shall be entertained shall

be, that the petition or report be received, and if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of notice of motion. No such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board, unless notice thereof shall have been given to the secretary, in writing, by the member bringing it forward seven clear days before such meeting.

9. All meetings shall be duly notified to each member by the secretary; such notice shall contain all notices of motion duly entered, and shall be posted five (5) clear days before such meeting.

meeting.

10. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with, unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the

order. Notices not so proceeded with snail be struck out of the papers.

11. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting.

12. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee, shall, pro hac vice, be a member of such committee.

13. Any bye-law may be suspended pro tem., in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the board present.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

14. The presiding chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

15. Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder; and on a division thereon, the votes shall be recorded.

16. Any member may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

19. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

20. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board, shall be again entertained during the same year.

same year.

21. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the board.

CONTRACTS.

22. All contracts shall be made by tonder, advertised not less than twice. Each tender shall be addressed to the chairman, and such tender or tenders only be opened at the time of their consideration by the board,—the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board; and when tenders are accepted a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor, and by two members of the board, one of whom shall be the chairman of the board, or, in his abscence, the chairman of the meeting at which such tender is accepted; and the expense of preparing such bond shall, in all cases, be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

23. No officer or member of the board shall have any pecuniary interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract under the board.

24. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the secretary; and no such cheques shall be given unless they be passed at a regular meeting of the board.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

25.
