## UPPER PLENTY FARMERS' COMMON ALTERED.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Farmers' Common at Upper Plenty: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the said Farmers' Common at Upper Plenty; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be the FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land at or near the Upper Plenty aforesaid, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT UPPER PLENTY, COUNTY OF EVELYN, PARISHES OF LINTON AND UNNAMED.—Extent, about 21,000 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of section 5, parish of Yan Yean; bounded on the west by a road one chain wide, bearing north about eight

miles to the north-east angle of section 19, parish of Toorour-rong; on the north by a line bearing east about five miles to the source of the King Parrot Creek; on the east by that creek and a line bearing south-westerly to the source of Sugar Loaf Creek; and by that latter named creek bearing southerly to a point due east about three and a half miles from the north-east angle of section 5, parish of Yan Yean aforesaid; and on the south by Morang Farmers' Common and a road together, bearing west about three and a half miles to commencing point. Exclusive of all appropriated land within the beforementioned boundaries.—(62.F.1221.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.
