## FARMERS' COMMON, YULECART AND AUDLEY.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land at or near the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for a Farmers' Common in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act.

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT YULECART AND AUDLEY.—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 4 of section 3, in the parish of Audley; thence by the south boundaries of said allotment 4, and allotments 3 and 4 of section 2, and allotments 3 and 4 of section 1, in the said parish of Audley, bearing west two miles fifty-one chains eighty-one links to the main road to Hamilton; thence crossing that road west; thence by the west side of that road bearing south 49° 18' west about thirty-six chains; thence by a line bearing north about eighty-five chains; thence by the road on the south boundary of allotment 4 of section 4 in the parish of Yulecart, bearing east about sixty-six chains forty-two links to the said road to Hamilton; thence crossing that road east; thence by that road along the north-west boundaries of allotments 1 and 2 of section 8, in the parish of Yulecart, bearing north-easterly about one mile seventy links to Violet Creek; thence by that creek bearing southerly and easterly to the east boundary of allotment 4 of section 9, parish of Yulecart; and thence by that boundary and by the east boundaries of allotments 1 and 4, section 3, parish of Audley, bearing south about one mile ten chains to the point of commencement. Area about 1954 acres. The bearings are true.

## PROCLAMATION.

By JAMES A. R. MENZIES, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Southland.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers in him vested in that behalf, has been pleased to delegate to the Superintendent of the Province of Southland the several powers vested in the Governor by the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 10th sections of the *Diseased Cattle Act*, 1861, subject to certain regulations made by the Governor in Council, on or about the 12th day of October, 1861:

Now therefore I, the said Superintendent, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the inspector of diseased cattle at the harbors of the Bluff and the New River shall not be authorised to grant a certificate to land in the province of Southland cattle coming from Stewart's Island, the Island of Ruapuke, or Solander's Island, or any of the islands adjacent thereto.

## LAND TO BE PERMANENTLY RESERVED AND GRANTED.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 87th section of the Act 21 Victoria No. 117, that, upon the expiration of one month from the date hereof, it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve the land hereinafter described, and that thereupon the said land will be granted to trustees in accordance with the 5th clause of the said Act, viz.:-

LAND TO BE GRANTED TO THE COLLINGWOOD, FITZ ROY, AND DISTRICT GAS AND COKE COMPANY.—All that piece or parcel of land situate in the parish of Jika-jika, in the county of Bourke, and colony of Victoria, and containing by admeasurement three acres, be the same more or less: Commencing at the point of intersection of the north side of a Government road three chains wide, called Reilly street, with the west side of another Government road, one chain wide, called Smith street; bounded on the south by Reilly street aforesaid, extending west from said point of intersection along Reilly street aforesaid four hundred and twenty-five links; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing north seven hundred and six links, and bounded on the west by Gore street, one chain wide; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing east four hundred and twenty-five links, and bounded on the north by other Government land; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing south seven hundred and six links to the commencing point, and bounded on the east by Smith street aforesaid.—(G2.F.978.)

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.  
VICINITY OF SANDHURST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by forty-one persons, stated to be the majority of the householders resident within a defined area adjoining the Municipal District of Sandhurst, praying that their locality may be united with, and form part of, the said municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident upon lands outside of but adjacent to the south-eastern boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst, and that they constitute a majority of residents within an area adjoining the said municipality containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—  
"That your Excellency will be pleased to declare by proclamation the locality within which we reside to be united with and form part of the said municipality of Sandhurst, by the following general description, as defined and set forth in the plan (accompanying the petition), viz.:-Commencing from a point in the boundary line of the said municipality of Sandhurst, known as Kirk's post, by a line fifty-two chains fifty links, bearing north fifty-five degrees west to a point at the south-western corner of the Cemetery reserve; thence by a line thirty-two chains, bearing south eighty-seven degrees west to the south-eastern corner of the said Cemetery reserve; thence by a line sixty-eight chains sixty links, bearing south twenty-nine degrees twenty minutes west to the south-eastern corner peg of allotment 83, section H; thence by a line fifty-four chains eighty links, bearing north three degrees east to a point in the boundary of the said municipality of Sandhurst known as Bell Post."
