FIVE THOUSAND POUNDS REWARD FOR THE DISCOVERY OF A WORKABLE GOLD FIELD IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that the local Government of Western Australia offer as a reward for the Discovery of a Workable Gold Field, within a radius of one hundred and fifty miles from the public offices in the city of Perth, on or before the 31st day of December, 1862, the sum of Five thousand pounds, upon the following conditions:—

1st. That the reward be not payable until 5000 ounces of gold, of standard purity, at the least, and either alluvial or crushed from quartz, and obtained from such gold field, be entered and cleared at the Custom House in Freemantle, and actually shipped to Great Britain, either in one entry or by several entries, before the 1st day of July, 1863.

2nd. That the Governor of the colony for the time being, in executive council, do finally adjudicate and determine to whom alone, or if there be several claimants, to whom, and in what proportions, and under what circumstances, such reward shall be payable and paid.

3rd. That the locality or localities of such discovery be clearly and accurately defined, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the said colony of Western Australia, on or before the 31st day of December, 1862.

LANDS TO BE PERMANENTLY RESERVED, ETC.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 4th section of the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, that, upon the expiration of one month from the date hereof, it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve from sale the lands hereinafter described, and that thereupon the Governor will grant the same to trustees, subject to the condition that all rules and regulations for the management of the reserve be submitted for the approval of the Board of Land and Works, viz:—

JIKA-JIKA—RESERVE FOR ZOOLOGICAL PURPOSES, IN THE PARISH OF JIKA-JIKA, being the reserve known as the Royal Park (less that portion thereof occupied by the Experimental Farm).—Five hundred and fifty acres (more or less), county of Bourke, parish of Jika-jika, subject to certain conditions: Commencing at the north-east angle, being a point bearing No. 36.—MARCH 25, 1862.—1.

S. 3° E. one chain fifty links from the south-east angle of allotment 1, section 1, north of Royal Park; thence by a road bearing west forty-five chains fifty links (more or less) to the east boundary of the Experimental Farm; thence south and westerly by the east and southern boundary of the Experimental Farm to its intersection with the western boundary of the Royal Park; by that boundary of the Royal Park south-easterly and southerly till it intersects the northern side of the Flemington road; by that side of the Flemington road south-easterly till it intersects the west side of a road forming the western boundary of the Hay and Corn Market reserve; thence by the western side of said road and a continuation thereof till it intersects the west side of the Sydney road; and by the last-named side of the Sydney road northerly to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in the Office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne.—(62.F.1384.)

LAND TO BE PERMANENTLY RESERVED AND GRANTED.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 87th section of the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, that, upon the expiration of one month from the date hereof, it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve the land hereinafter described, and that thereupon the said land will be granted to trustees in accordance with the 5th clause of the said Act, viz:—

LAND TO BE GRANTED TO THE COLLINGWOOD, FITZ ROY, AND DISTRICT GAS AND COKE COMPANY.—All that piece or parcel of land situate in the parish of Jika-jika, in the county of Bourke, and colony of Victoria, and containing by admeasurement three acres, be the same more or less: Commencing at the point of intersection of the north side of a Government road three chains wide, called Reilly street, with the west side of another Government road, one chain wide, called Smith street; bounded on the south by Reilly street aforesaid, extending west from said point of intersection along Reilly street aforesaid four hundred and twenty-five links; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing north seven hundred and six links, and bounded on the west by Gore street, one chain wide; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing east four hundred and twenty-five links, and bounded on the north by other Government land; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing south seven hundred and six links to the commencing point, and bounded on the east by Smith street aforesaid.—(62.F.978.)

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.
VICINITY OF SANDHURST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by forty-one persons, stated to be the majority of the householders resident within a defined area adjoining the Municipal District of Sandhurst, praying that their locality may be united with, and form part of, the said municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident upon lands outside of but adjacent to the south-eastern boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst, and that they constitute a majority of residents within an area adjoining the said municipality containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will be pleased to declare by proclamation the locality within which we reside to be united with and form part of the said municipality of Sandhurst, by the following general description, as defined and set forth in the plan [accompanying the petition], viz.:—Commencing from a point in the boundary line of the said municipality of Sandhurst, known as Kirk's post, by a line fifty-two chains-fifty links, bearing north fifty-five degrees west to a point at the south-western corner of the Cemetery reserve; thence by a line thirty-two chains, bearing south eighty-seven degrees west to the south-eastern corner of the said Cemetery reserve; thence by a line sixty-eight chains sixty links, bearing south twenty-nine degrees twenty minutes west to the south-eastern corner peg of allotment 83, section H; thence by a line fifty-four chains eighty links, bearing north three degrees east to a point in the boundary of the said municipality of Sandhurst known as Bell Post."

And whereas the street, court, or alley enumerated in the schedule to the order annexed marked A has not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

charges, and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition of the pavement, flagging, macadamizing, levelling, draining, and sewerage in which such street, court, or alley respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered:—

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than 1 in 120, and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline. In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than 1 foot thick. The transverse section of the right-of-way is to show a roadway whose crown shall be 1 inch above the kerbs of the footways, and in the fall from the crown of the waterchannels is to be at the rate of 1 in 25.

On either side of the roadway there is to be a waterchannel 18 inches wide, consisting of two rows of bluestone pitchers, 9 inches deep and not less than 9 inches by 14 inches on the surface, with upright sides, set in loam and rammed with a rammer weighing 40 lbs., so as to subside 4 inches.

The bottom of the channel is to be 7 inches below the top of the kerbs.

On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than 3 feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a red gum plank or kerb 10 inches by 3 inches; set on edge and fastened with 5-inch spikes to piles 4 inches by 4 inches of red gum, 3 feet long, driven into the soil.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel 3 inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of 1 in 10. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of broken metal, broken to a 24-inch gauge and laid on 7 inches thick at the channels and 8 inches at the crown, and this, when necessary, is to be covered with a coat of loam 1½ inch thick.

Whenever private entrances lead from the rights-of-way they are to be paved to the full width with bluestone pitchers, in the same manner as the channels. Paving is to be extended from the channels towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the City Surveyor, who is authorized to order any deviation from these general principles which the particulars of any case may require.
