THE GLENLYON ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the eleventh day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the boundaries of "The Glenlyon Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Glenlyon Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 7, section 5, in the parish of Wombat; thence due north to the north-west angle of allotment 1 in the said section; thence north one chain to the south side of allotment 4, section 6, of the said parish; thence west to the south-west angle of the said allotment; thence along the western boundaries of allotments 4 and 3 of section 6, and allotments 4 and 3 of section 7, in the said parish, and a direct line north to the south side of block 19, in the parish of Holcombe; thence due west by the southern boundary of block 19 of the said parish to the centre of Middleton's Creek; thence northerly along the centre line of Middleton's Creek to a point opposite the north angle of block 2 of the said parish of Holcombe; thence by a line due north to the northern boundary of the said parish; thence east by the northern boundary of the said parish to the north-west angle of the parish of Burke; thence due east by the northern boundary of said parish to the south-west angle of the parish of Drummond; thence due north by the western boundary of the said parish to its north-west angle; thence east by the northern boundary of the said parish to a point on the centre of the River Coliban; thence southerly by the centre of the said river to a point in a line with and due east of the southern boundary of the parish of Glenlyon; thence by a line due west and the southern boundary of the said parish to the commencing point.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

LANDS TO BE PERMANENTLY RESERVED, ETC.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 4th section of the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, that, upon the expiration of one month from the date hereof, it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve from sale the lands hereinafter described, and that thereupon the Governor will grant the same to trustees, subject to the condition that all rules and regulations for the management of the reserve be submitted for the approval of the Board of Land and Works, viz.:—

JIKA-JIKA—RESERVE FOR ZOOLOGICAL PURPOSES, IN THE PARISH OF JIKA-JIKA, being the reserve known as the Royal Park (less that portion thereof occupied by the Experimental Farm).—Five hundred and fifty acres (more or less), county of Bourke, parish of Jika-jika, subject to certain conditions: Commencing at the north-east angle, being a point, bearing S. 3° E. one chain fifty links from the south-east angle of allotment 1, section 1, north of Royal Park; thence by a road bearing west forty-five chains fifty links (more or less) to the east boundary of the Experimental Farm; thence south and westerly by the east and southern boundary of the Experimental Farm to its intersection with the western boundary of the Royal Park; by that boundary of the Royal Park south-easterly and southerly till it intersects the northern side of the Flemington road; by that side of the Flemington road south-easterly till it intersects the west side of a road forming the western boundary of the Hay and Corn Market reserve; thence by the western side of said road and a continuation thereof till it intersects the west side of the Sydney road; and by the last-named side of the Sydney road northerly to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in the Office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne.—(62.F.1384.)

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

SALE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and fifty-three householders and landowners, at and near Sale, in the district of Gipps Land, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders and landowners in the township and parish of Sale, and that necessity exists for the erection of the township into a municipal district, to further its improvement and good government.

They further state that it is the centre of a large agricultural district, and that the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are there concentrated; but the greatest inconvenience is caused by the want of proper roads, whereby the outlet of produce is obstructed and the cost of imported necessities is enhanced.

That the township, possessing no improvements in the way of street making and draining, is, during several months in the year, all but uninhabitable, and that owing to its isolation in position and interest, local self-government is indispensable to its welfare and progress.

They suggest the following area for a municipal district, viz.:—"Bounded on the west by the western boundary of the parish of Sale, commencing at Flooding Creek, at the south-west corner of lot 101, and bearing north to the north-west corner of the said parish; thence on the north by the northern boundary of the said parish, or two-chain road, bearing east to the one-chain road on the west side of 'The Heart,' thence by a one-chain road bearing south, and a line in continuation till it intersects Flooding Creek; thence by that creek to the point of commencement; comprising an area of about nine square miles, no part of which is distant six miles from any other."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners hereby pray that your Excellency will be pleased to cause the area above described to be proclaimed as 'The Sale Municipal District.'"

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

VICINITY OF SANDHURST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by forty-one persons, stated to be the majority of the householders resident within a defined area adjoining the Municipal District of Sandhurst, praying that their locality may be united with, and form part of, the said municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident upon lands outside of but adjacent to the south-eastern boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst, and that they constitute a majority of residents within an area adjoining the said municipality containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will be pleased to declare by proclamation the locality within which we reside to be united with and form part of the said municipality of Sandhurst, by the following general description, as defined and set forth in the plan [accompanying the petition], viz.:—Commencing from a point in the boundary line of the said municipality of Sandhurst, known as Kirk's post, by a line fifty-two chains fifty links, bearing north fifty-five degrees west to a point at the south-western corner of the Cemetery reserve; thence by a line thirty-two chains, bearing south eighty-seven degrees west to the south-eastern corner of the said Cemetery reserve; thence by a line sixty-eight chains sixty links, bearing south twenty-nine degrees twenty minutes west to the south-eastern corner peg of allotment 88, section II; thence by a line fifty-four chains eighty links, bearing north three degrees east to a point in the boundary of the said municipality of Sandhurst known as Bell Post."

MUNICIPALITY OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—TO PREVENT NUISANCES ARISING FROM CATTLE BEING PERMITTED TO BE AT LARGE IN THE STREETS AND UNENCLOSED PLACES WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make a bye-law for the more certain prevention of the nuisance occasioned from cattle being allowed to be at large in the streets and unenclosed places within this municipal district: Be it therefore enacted, that from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer any kind of swine, or any horse, mare, mule, ass, bullock, cow, goat, or any other cattle belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large in any street or public place, or in any unenclosed place, unless by permission of the owner of such ground, or un-

less the same shall be his or her freehold property, or in his or her occupation, or unless the same shall be a government reserve. Any person who shall commit any neglect or breach thereof of this bye-law, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 3, made by the municipal council of Essendon and Flemington, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF INGLEWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF INGLEWOOD.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, section 26, it is enacted "that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings." Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Inglewood, that from and after the date of the Governor's assent hereto, the proceedings and business of the said council shall be conducted according to the following regulations only, which shall be deemed and called the Standing Orders of the said council, until repealed or altered, that is to say:—

CHAPTER I.—Order of Proceedings.

1. That the sittings of this council shall on all ordinary occasions be open to the public, but a majority of the council may require the exclusion of strangers while the sense of the council is taken as to whether the question proposed shall be discussed with closed doors.
2. The business of the council shall commence with a quorum. If at the expiration of thirty minutes from the time of meeting there is no quorum, no business shall be transacted, and the names of the councillors present shall be recorded in the minutes.
3. The first business of each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting; and no discussion shall take place thereupon, except as to the accuracy thereof.
4. At all meetings the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions.
5. All communications by letter intended for the council shall be made and addressed to the town clerk, and all petitions and memorials shall be addressed to the chairman and council, under cover to the town clerk.
6. No motion shall be decided on at any meeting of the council unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing, shall have been given at the previous meeting of the council; nor shall any report of committee be decided on unless similar notice be given, unless in committee of the whole council, or the whole council be present; and a notice paper, containing a memorandum of all motions and reports to be submitted to the council, shall be left at the residence of each councillor three clear days before each meeting of council.
7. The order of the day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of the council.
8. No notice entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on in order.
9. No bye-law shall be decided on without due notice (as in cases of motions); and a copy of the proposed bye-laws shall be open in the town clerk's office for the inspection of all ratepayers, free of charge, or of any person duly qualified to vote at elections under the Act.
10. All business shall be considered in the order in which notice thereof was given.

CHAPTER II.—Order of Debate.

1. Any member upon proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman; and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down; the member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.
2. Any councillor rising to propose an amendment, or to make any proposition to the council, must state the nature of the same before addressing the council in support thereof; and any member may withdraw a resolution proposed by him previous to its being put to the vote.
3. No proposition shall be entertained unless in writing, and when seconded, handed to the clerk.
4. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.
5. If more than one councillor rise at the same time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-eminence.
6. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment. After such explanation or reply, the question shall be forthwith put to the vote.
7. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion or impute motives, and all personal reflections shall be deemed highly disorderly.
8. The chairman when called upon to decide a point of order or practice shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the

case, without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final.

9. The presiding chairman shall rise when addressing the council.

10. Any councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other councillor, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expressions, and make a satisfactory apology to the council, under a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

11. Any councillor may require the clerk of the council to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.

12. Any councillor may, of right, demand the production of any documents of the council bearing on the question under consideration.

13. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, and if lost, another amendment may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and it shall be competent to any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

14. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and in case of a division, the votes of all councillors shall be entered in the minutes.

15. The council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of elections.

16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion of adjournment, and if the question be negatived, the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be again entertained. Provided the motion be carried, any business left undecided shall take precedence at the next meeting of the council.

17. Any councillor may record his protest against any decision of the council, provided the same be made in writing before the next meeting of the council, and be couched in respectful language, and be consistent with truth; notice, however, of such intention must be given on the adoption of the resolution.

18. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the council which shall have been negatived by the council, shall be again entertained during the same municipal year.

19. The chairman of the council when appointed on committee, shall be chairman thereof, and the standing orders of the council shall be observed in all committees, except as to the number of times limited for speaking or rising to address the chairman.

CHAPTER III.—Elections.

1. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until five days' notice shall have been given in one or more of the local newspapers, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year preceding the election.

2. At all such elections, and on all occasions of accepting tenders or contracts, the voting shall be on cards or papers to be provided for the purpose, on which each councillor shall write the name of the party or candidate he supports, and the chairman shall then declare the result of such voting.

3. No councillor shall be received as surety for any officer, nor shall any auditor or other officer become surety for any other employé of the council, or for any work to be done for the council; and in all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

CHAPTER IV.—Miscellaneous.

1. Any one or more of the standing orders of the council, except No. 18, Chapter II., may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, provided that the majority of the council present deem it necessary.

2. For the consideration of any bye-law, or for the raising and appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in the standing order No. 18, Chapter II., it shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given in the notice paper for the day or notice of motion for which such call was made is set down for consideration; and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five shillings, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

3. The clerk of the council shall have the charge of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be responsible for the safe custody and proper use of the same, and each impression to any corporate document shall be verified by the signature of the chairman and clerk of the council. The common seal shall not be affixed to any document without the order of the majority of the council, and for using the same to verify documents not belonging to the council or for the use of the council the clerk shall charge a fee of Ten shillings.

4. That no moneys be paid by the council except by cheque, signed by the chairman or treasurer and one member of the finance committee, and countersigned by the town clerk.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT MUNICIPAL YEAR, COMMENCING 31ST DECEMBER, 1861, AND ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1862.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised and required to assess all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to Her Majesty) according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current municipal year: And whereas the council of the municipal district of Inglewood has caused a valuation of all rateable property within the said district to be made for the purpose of assessing the same, and which said value, after all objections have been heard, amounts to the sum of Thirteen thousand two hundred and eighty-three pounds ten shillings (£13,283 10s.): Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said municipal council of Inglewood, that the said valuation or assessment be confirmed, and that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound for the current municipal year, commencing 31st December, 1861, and ending 31st December, 1862, on the said annual value of the said respective properties, be, and the same is, hereby imposed and levied.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 6, made by the municipal council of Inglewood, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF MALMSBURY.

BYE-LAW No. 3.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws for the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas by a proclamation of His Excellency the Governor, dated the 14th day of October, 1861, the district of Malmesbury was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore enacted and directed by the municipal council of the district of Malmesbury, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor as required by the provisions of the said Act (as much damage, inconvenience, and annoyance arise to the public owing to pigs being allowed at all times to run at large through the streets), that no pigs shall be allowed at large in any of the streets of this municipality, but the owners thereof shall keep them confined; and any person or persons being the owners thereof, allowing the same to roam uncontrolled in and through the streets of the said municipality contrary to this bye-law, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds for every pig thus at large.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 3, made by the municipal council of Malmesbury, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

REGULATIONS FOR LODGING-HOUSES.

NOTICE is hereby given that in conformity with the provisions of the Public Health Act (18 No. 14, section 23), and of the Common Lodging-house Act (18 Victoria No. 8, section 10), the following regulations have been made for the purpose of preventing the overcrowding of lodging-houses, and to provide for the better ventilation of such establishments:—

1st. In sleeping apartments in wooden buildings, not lathed and plastered, where there is a fireplace and doors and windows in proportion to the size of the room, a space of 300 cubic feet shall be allowed for each person.

2nd. In wooden buildings lathed and plastered inside, and in brick and stone buildings with a fireplace and doors and windows in proportion to the size of the room, 400 cubic feet.

3rd. In all buildings where there is no chimney, 500 cubic feet shall be allowed.

4th. In cases where there is no chimney, the inspector has power to order that there are proper means of admitting a plentiful supply of fresh air near the bottom of the room, and also for permitting the foul air to escape at the upper part of the room; and no building must be occupied as a sleeping place without a proper amount of ventilation.

Any person or persons neglecting to comply with the above regulations shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and in case of a continuing offence, a further penalty of a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for each day during which such offence shall be continued after written notice from such local authority, or his or their officer appointed aforesaid, of the offence having been committed.
