## LANDS TO BE PERMANENTLY RESERVED, ETC.

It is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 4th section of the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, that, upon the expiration of one month from the date hereof, it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve from sale the lands hereinafter described, and that thereupon the Governor will grant the same to trustees, subject to the condition that all rules and regulations for the management of the reserve be submitted for the approval of the Board of Land and Works, viz.:-

JIKA-JIKA—RESERVE FOR ZOOLOGICAL PURPOSES, IN THE PARISH OF JIKA-JIKA, being the reserve known as the Royal Park (less that portion thereof occupied by the Experimental Farm).—Five hundred and fifty acres (more or less), county of Bourke, parish of Jika-jika, subject to certain conditions: Commencing at the north-east angle, being a point bearing S. 3° E. one chain fifty links from the south-east angle of allotment 1, section 1, north of Royal Park; thence by a road bearing west forty-five chains fifty links (more or less) to the east boundary of the Experimental Farm; thence south and westerly by the east and southern boundary of the Experimental Farm to its intersection with the western boundary of the Royal Park; by that boundary of the Royal Park south-easterly and southerly till it intersects the northern side of the Flemington road; by that side of the Flemington road south-easterly till it intersects the west side of a road forming the western boundary of the Hay and Corn Market reserve; thence by the western side of said road and a continuation thereof till it intersects the west side of the Sydney road; and by the last-named side of the Sydney road northerly to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in the Office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne.—(62.F.1384.)

## PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT. SALE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and fifty-three householders and landowners, at and near Sale, in the district of Gipps Land, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders and landowners in the township and parish of Sale, and that necessity exists for the erection of the township into a municipal district, to further its improvement and good government.

They further state that it is the centre of a large agricultural district, and that the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are there concentrated; but the greatest inconvenience is caused by the want of proper roads, whereby the outlet of produce is obstructed and the cost of imported necessities is enhanced.

That the township, possessing no improvements in the way of street making and draining, is, during several months in the year, all but uninhabitable, and that owing to its isolation in position and interest, local self-government is indispensable to its welfare and progress.

They suggest the following area for a municipal district, viz.:-"Bounded on the west by the western boundary of the parish of Sale, commencing at Flooding Creek, at the south-west corner of lot 101, and bearing north to the north-west corner of the said parish; thence on the north by the northern boundary of the said parish, or two-chain road, bearing east to the one-chain road on the west side of 'The Heart'; thence by a one-chain road bearing south, and a line in continuation till it intersects Flooding Creek; thence by that creek to the point of commencement; comprising an area of about nine square miles, no part of which is distant six miles from any other."

And the petitioners pray as follows:-

"Your petitioners hereby pray that your Excellency will be pleased to cause the area above described to be proclaimed as 'The Sale Municipal District.'"

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW NO. 34.—A BYE-LAW TO PREVENT NUISANCES, ARISING FROM CATTLE BEING ALLOWED TO BE AT LARGE ON THE STREETS AND UNENCLOSED PLACES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SANDHURST.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15 intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of public health, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the more certain prevention of the nuisances occasioned from cattle being allowed to be at large on the streets and unenclosed places within the said municipal district:

Be it therefore enacted, that from and after this bye-law coming into operation it shall not be lawful for any person to allow any cow, horse, mule, ass, sheep, goat, or any kind of swine or other cattle belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large in any street or public place within the said municipal district. Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds. And be it further ordered and directed, that in case the owner or proprietor of any cow, horse, mule, sheep, goat, or any kind of swine or other cattle, so being at large as aforesaid, cannot be found, every aforementioned animal found at large contrary to the provisions of this bye-law shall be seized and taken to the pound yard, and the town inspector, or any person authorised by the chairman of the municipal council for the time being, is hereby empowered to seize and impound every such animal so found at large accordingly.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 34, made by the municipal council of Sandhurst, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

#### FINANCE.

The assessment for the year 1861-2 amounts to £21,125, on which a rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound has been levied, giving as the total amount of rate for the year £1584 7s. 6d.

The debt of £429 8s. 4d. owing at the last half-yearly report to the Bank of New South Wales, has been paid, with interest, and the council had on the 10th day of March a balance in its favor of £451 6s. 1d.

The repayment of the debt to the bank, and the inability of the council to obtain an overdraft therefrom, has necessarily limited the expenditure of public works. The funds in hand, however, and the rates to be collected during the next half-year, will enable the council to shew a larger amount expended at the date of the next report.

#### BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been made and approved of by His Excellency, viz.:

For an assessment on the annual value of property for the year ending 10th day of September, 1862.

To impose a rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound for the current year ending 10th day of September, 1862.

A bye-law to amend the present market bye-law constituting the Maldon market a daily market.

#### MEMORIALS.

A memorial to the President of Lands and Works, praying that a sum of money may be placed on the estimates for the repair and maintenance of the roads in the district; also for the maintenance of the Maldon Hospital, grant-in-aid of the Cemetery, and for the survey of a line of railway from Castle-maine to Maryborough, *via* Maldon.

A memorial to the President of Lands and Works, praying for a grant of land for recreative purposes, also a grant-in-aid for fencing public reserves.

A memorial to the Honorable the Postmaster General, praying for a second delivery of letters within the municipal boundary.

A memorial to the Honorable the Chief Secretary, praying for the appointment of a resident coroner, as also a Chinese interpreter.

A memorial to the Honorable the President of Lands and Survey, praying for a grant of land as a site for municipal cattle yards and abattoirs.

A memorial to the Honorable the Commissioner of Railways and Roads, praying that the road from Castle-maine to Maryborough *via* Maldon may be proclaimed a main road.

The answer received from the several heads of departments to which the above have been forwarded has been to the effect that, on the introduction of the District Councils Bill, the different requirements will be met, with the exception of the three last, which have been already granted.

#### DEPUTATIONS.

The council, in order to secure the granting of various applications made to Government, have deemed it advisable to send to Melbourne several deputations during the past half-year.

The successful results of the labor of such deputations, as published in the reports of the council's proceedings, has fully justified it in incurring the expense to further the interests of the town.

#### PUBLIC WORKS.

The following public works have been satisfactorily carried out during the past half-year:—

The formation and making of 31 chains of road in Peg Leg.

The formation and making of 8½ chains of road leading to Porcupine Flat.

The repair of a portion of the road near the Springs.

The building of town surveyor's and rate collector's office.

#### HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT.

This officer reports the health of the district as favorable.

#### WATER SUPPLY.

Since the last half-yearly report under this head the cutting of the race along the base of the Mount, and laying down pipes, has been delayed in consequence of a leak in the reservoir; the water has been let off, and a party of men are now engaged to discover and stop the leak, after which the works contemplated will be carried out. The cutting of the race alluded to will increase the drainage area from 74 to 350 acres.
