## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

HER Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 11th day of December, 1861, intimated to the Governor that the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 25th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates whereof are hereto subjoined, have been laid before the Queen, and have been left to their operation, viz.:-

No. 124.—An Act to appropriate the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one and for other purposes. [Assented to 3rd July, 1861.]

No. 125.—An Act to amend the law relating to Divorce and Matrimonial Causes. [Assented to 3rd July, 1861.]

No. 126.—An Act to authorise the Melbourne and Essendon Railway Company to make a Branch Railway to the race-course and for other purposes. [Assented to 3rd July, 1861.]

No. 127.—An Act to enable the St. Kilda and Brighton Railway Company to extend their Railway to the shore of Port Philip Bay, to make a deviation in their Main Line, to construct a pier and other works, to raise further sums of money, to issue preference shares, and for other purposes. [Assented to 3rd July, 1861.]

No. 128.—An Act to amend the Act, intituled, *An Act so limit the number of persons holding offices under the Crown who may sit and vote in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria.* [Assented to 3rd July, 1861.]

No. 129.—An Act to alter an enactment respecting the opening with a double line of rails of the Melbourne and Suburban Railway, and to substitute another provision in lieu thereof. [Assented to 3rd July, 1861.]

No. 130.—An Act to amend the law relating to Pawnbrokers in the colony of Victoria. [Assented to 3rd July, 1861.]

## FEES FOR THE OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS FOR OTHER THAN PASTORAL PURPOSES.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, the Board of Land and Works has directed the Fees hereinafter mentioned to be charged, in lieu of the Fees specified in the schedule bearing date the 16th of May, 1861 (page 1018 of the *Gazette* of 1861), for the same purposes, viz.:-

Nature of License.	Fee and Conditions.
For cutting black wood	£10 per annum, payable quarterly. No licenses to be granted for removal of such wood from any Crown lands situated within 24 miles from Melbourne, or from any lands not available under the ordinary timber licenses, or which may be excluded by proclamation.
For a Rural Store	£10 per annum (instead of £25), within three miles of the boundaries of proclaimed townships.

## MUNICIPALITY OF AMHERST.

BYE-LAW No. 15.—A BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING AND LICENSING PERSONS TO SLAUGHTER CERTAIN ANIMALS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF AMHERST.

WHEREAS, by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district, established under this Act, to make bye-laws for the regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat, the establishment of slaughter-houses, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the Municipal Council of the district of Amherst, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act:

That all persons whose premises shall have been paved and suitably prepared so that such premises can be kept inoffensive, shall be permitted to kill sheep and lambs, provided all such persons shall receive the blood into tubs, and cause its removal, together with all offal or other offensive matter, from such premises, at least once in every twenty-four hours.

Several premises to be registered and licensed.—And for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this bye-law such premises shall be registered at the Municipal Offices, and shall at all times be open to the inspection of the council or their duly appointed inspector:

Be it therefore ordered, that it shall not be lawful for any licensed butcher to kill or cause to be killed sheep or lambs on premises which are situate distinct and apart, except such premises are severally registered and a license taken out to slaughter on such several premises as though they belonged to different owners:

And every person who shall kill any sheep or lamb, except on registered premises as aforesaid, or whose premises shall not be kept and maintained inoffensive as above required, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any other regulations herein made, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*The foregoing Bye-law, No. 15, made by the municipal council of Amherst, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.*




