# PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by the Diseased Cattle Act, 1861, it was provided that the Governor in Council might, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any province within the colony of New Zealand, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time rescind such delegation: And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to John Williamson, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the province of Auckland, the several powers vested in the said Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made:

Now therefore I, the said John Williamson, by virtue of such

Now therefore I, the said John Williamson, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare, that after the date hereof the several colonies of Australia, that is to say, the colony of New South Wales, of Victoria, of South Australia, of Western Australia, and Queensland, as well as the colony of Tasmania, and the colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and the islands of Great Britain and Irland, shall be deemed to be, for the purposes of the above-recited Act, infected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and no cattle shall be allowed to be imported from the above-mentioned districts into the province of Auckland until further notice; and that in case any cattle shall be imported from the said districts contrary to this Proclamation, such cattle shall be destroyed forthwith, in such manner and at such places as the Superintendent may proclaim and appoint: Provided, however, that the Superintendent of the province may allow any cattle to be landed from vessels from the islands of Great Britain and Ireland subject to such conditions and restrictions as he may deem expedient, and the circumstances of the case may require.

#### PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT. SALE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and fifty-three householders and landowners, at and near Sale, in the district of Gipps Land, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders and land-owners in the township and parish of Sale, and that necessity exists for the erection of the township into a municipal district, to further its improvement and good government.

They further state that it is the centre of a large agricultural district, and that the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are there concentrated; but the greatest inconvenience is caused by the want of proper roads, whereby the outlet of produce is obstructed and the cost of imported necessaries is enhanced.

That the township, possessing no improvements in the way of street making and draining, is, during several months in the year, all but uninhabitable, and that owing to its isolation in position and interest, local self-government is indispensable to its welfare and progress.

They suggest the following area for a municipal district, viz.:—"Bounded on the west by the western boundary of the parish of Sale, commencing at Flooding Creek, at the southwest corner of lot 101, and bearing north to the north-west corner of the said parish, or two-chain road, bearing east to the one-chain road on the west side of "The Heart," thence by a one-chain road bearing south, and a line in continuation till it intersects Flooding Creek; thence by that creek to the point of commencement; comprising an area of about nine square miles, no part of which is distant six miles from any other."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners hereby pray that your Excellency will be pleased to cause the area above described to be proclaimed as 'The Sale Municipal District.'"

# PROPOSED ROAD DISTRICT.

INGLEWOOD OR KINGOWER.

TWO several memorials for the constitution of a road district have been received, both of which refer to an area nearly identical, viz.:—

No. I.—The chairman of the municipal council of Inglewood represents that the ill state of the communications around Inglewood, and the refusal of the Government to render any

assistance except through a road board, necessitate the incorporation of a district, proposed to be designated "The Inglewood Road District," and to comprise as large an area as possible. The chairman states that the area at present unrepresented by a road board is bounded on the south by the Bet-bet road district, on the east by the Marong road district, on the west by the St. Arnaud road district, and on the north by the River Murray.

Murray.

No. II.—In a memorial, bearing the signatures of eighty-five "settlers, merchants, storekeepers, miners, and other residents in that part of the Avoca district not included in any road district and enclosed by the boundary lines of the Bet-bet, Sandhurst, and St. Arnaud road districts on the north-west and south-east, and extending to the River Murray on the north," the memorialists express a desire that the country embraced within the outside boundary lines of the abovementioned districts, and to such an extent in a northerly direction as to His Excelency may appear good and convenient, may be forthwith proclaimed as "The Kingower Road Board District." They draw attention to the position of Kingower as a central point, and one most convenient of approach for the numerous persons on whom the burther of forming the roads will devolve.

In a separate communication, the secretary of a public meeting
