BALLAARAT AND ARARAT ESCORT.

THE following alterations in the arrangements of the Ballaarat and Ararat Escort will take place on the dates undermentioned, viz.:-

The escort will leave Ararat on alternate Mondays (commencing on 12th May), reaching Ballaarat on Tuesday afternoon; and will return on the following Friday, reaching Ararat on Saturday.

After the expiration of the present week, a weekly escort will be despatched from Ballaarat on Wednesday (commencing on the 14th May), leaving Ballaarat by the mid-day train, and arriving in Melbourne about Four p.m. It will return to Ballaarat by the train starting at Noon on Thursday.

The Ararat escort will thus take six days in coming to Melbourne and returning.

THE PENTRIDGE ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the third day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of "The Pentridge Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Pentridge Road District shall be the boundaries herein-after specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-western angle of the section CXXXIII. in the parish of Jika-jika; thence due east to the Merri Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the southern boundary of the village reserve of Pentridge; thence west by a portion of the southern boundary, and north by the eastern boundary of the said reserve to the south-east angle of section CXLVIII. in the parish of Jika-jika; thence by the eastern boundary of the said section to its north-east angle; thence due west to the north-west angle of section CL. in the said parish of Jika-jika; thence south to the northern boundary of section CXLII. of the said parish; thence west to the Moonee Ponds; thence southerly by the Moonee Ponds to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of November, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the boundaries of "The Broadmeadows Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Broadmeadows Road District shall be the boundaries herein-after specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of section CL. in the parish of Jika-jika; thence south to the northern boundary of section CXLII. in the said parish; thence west to the Moonee Ponds; thence southerly by the Moonee Ponds to the northern boundary of the municipality of Essendon; thence west by the northern boundary of the said municipality to the centre of the Deep Creek road; thence north-westerly by the centre line of the Deep Creek road to the western boundary of section VI. parish of Tullamarine; thence north by the western boundary of said section VI. and a right line to the Moonee Ponds; thence northwards by the Moonee Ponds, being the western boundary of the parish of Will-will-rook to the parish of Bulla-bulla; thence east by the southern boundary of the parish of Bulla-bulla to the parish of Yuroke; thence north by the western boundary of the parish of Yuroke to the parish of Mickleham; thence west by the southern boundary of the parish of Mickleham aforesaid to the Deep Creek; thence by the said creek north-easterly, being the western boundary of the parish of Mickleham aforesaid to the northern boundary thereof; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said parish of Mickleham to the parish of Yuroke; thence by part of the northern and by the eastern boundaries of that parish to the parish of Will-will-rook; thence by part of the northern and by the eastern and southern boundaries of the parish of Will-will-rook to the commencing point.

FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS about Eleven o'clock on the night of Thursday,

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

SALE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council,
has directed the publication of the substance and prayer
of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and
fifty-three householders and landowners, at and near Sale, in
the district of Gipps Land, praying for the erection of their
locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders and land-
owners in the township and parish of Sale, and that necessity
exists for the erection of the township into a municipal district,
to further its improvement and good government.

They further state that it is the centre of a large agricultural
district, and that the elements of wealth, such as a large and
increasing population, genial soil, and mineral productiveness,
are there concentrated; but the greatest inconvenience is
caused by the want of proper roads, whereby the outlet of
produce is obstructed and the cost of imported necessities is
enhanced.

That the township, possessing no improvements in the way of
street making and draining, is, during several months in the
year, all but uninhabitable, and that owing to its isolation in
position, and interest, local self-government is indispensable to
its welfare and progress.

They suggest the following area for a municipal district,
viz.:—"Bounded on the west by the western boundary of the
parish of Sale, commencing at Flooding Creek, at the south-
west corner of lot 101, and bearing north to the north-west
corner of the said parish; thence on the north by the northern
boundary of the said parish, or two-chain road, bearing east to
the one-chain road on the west side of "The Heart," thence
by a one-chain road bearing south, and a line in continuation
till it intersects Flooding Creek; thence by that creek to the
point of commencement; comprising an area of about nine
square miles, no part of which is distant six miles from any
other."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
"Your petitioners hereby pray that your Excellency will be
pleased to cause the area above described to be proclaimed as
"The Sale Municipal District."

MUNICIPALITY OF CHEWTON.

BYE-LAW No. 10.—A BYE-LAW FOR MAKING AN ASSES-
MENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE
POUND FOR THE YEAR EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SIXTY-
TWO.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled,
*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in
Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised and
required to assess all property in houses and lands within the
limits of such municipal district (except belonging to Her
No. 55.—MAY 6, 1862.—2.

Majesty) according to its fair annual average value, and to im-
pose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it
therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of
Chewton, that all the several properties within the limits of the
said district shall be assessed for the year 1862 according to the
several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the
same in the assessment roll, confirmed by a bench of magistrates
on Wednesday, the ninth day of April, 1862, and amounting to
a total sum of Twelve thousand three hundred and seventy-
three pounds nineteen shillings; and also that a rate of One
shilling in the pound of the said annual value is hereby im-
posed on all the properties for the year 1862, the first moiety to
be due and payable on or after Tuesday, the 29th of April, and
the second moiety thereof on Wednesday, the 29th of October,
1862.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 10, made by the municipal council of
Chewton, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

BYE-LAW No. 72.—A BYE-LAW FOR IMPOSING A RATE.

WHEREAS by Act of Council, 19 Victoria, *An Act to
amend "An Act for the establishment of Municipal
Institutions in Victoria"*, it is amongst other things enacted,
clause 10, that notwithstanding anything in the recited Act, no
toll, rate, or due shall be imposed by the council of any munici-
pal district save by bye-law, subject to the assent of the
Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore
enacted by the council of the municipal district of Prahran,
that a rate of One shilling in the pound be struck for the
current year upon all rateable property within the municipal
district of Prahran.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 72, made by the municipal council
of Prahran, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 36.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE REGULATION OF
THE BOTANICAL GARDEN AND OTHER RESERVES IN THE
MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15,
intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal
Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that
it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district
established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-
laws for the establishment of botanical gardens or other public
places of recreation, and the maintenance and management of
the same, and also for the preservation of public decency and
the general good rule and government of such municipal dis-
trict: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal
council of Sandhurst, from and after this bye-law receiving the
assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the pro-
visions of the said Act, that—

1. It shall be lawful for the said municipal council to appoint
keepers to have charge of the Botanical Garden Reserve, White
Hills, and also of the reserve for recreation, formally known
as the Camp Reserve, and defined in page 1124 of the *Govern-
ment Gazette*, dated 10th June, 1861.

2. The said reserves shall be open to the public every day
from sunrise to sunset, at which hour the keepers shall close
the entrances; and no person shall remain therein or enter
the same after sunset, save and except officers of police in the
execution of their duty.

3. All persons visiting the reserves shall conduct themselves
decorously, and shall not walk upon the borders or cultivated
ground, or pluck any flowers or leaves, or in any way interfere
with the plants, shrubs, or trees, or molest or tease the birds
and animals.

4. It shall be lawful for the keeper of the several reserves to
turn out any person who is intoxicated, or behaving contrary
to the provisions of this bye-law.

5. No person shall affix bills upon, write upon, deface, or
climb upon the fences, gates, and stiles of the said reserves, or
of any other reserves that may be gazetted as under the control
of the municipal council.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions
of this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before any two or
more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceed-
ing Five pounds.

The foregoing bye-law, No. 36, made by the municipal council of
Sandhurst, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 35.—FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING
IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY IN THE
MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA, FOR THE CURRENT
MUNICIPAL YEAR 1862-63.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15,
intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal
Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district
is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within
the limits of such municipal district according to the fair
average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed Two

On the 29th October Councillor Henningham resigned his seat, and on the 27th December Councillor Lethaby was elected in his stead. On the 15th December Councillor Gordon's seat became vacant by his absence from the colony, and a meeting of the ratepayers was called for the 31st January, 1862, to elect a member to fill the same.

INCOME.

An assessment has been made on all property in the district for the year ending 30th June, 1862, amounting to £13,868 5s., upon which a rate of 1s. in the pound has been imposed by by-law No. 13, duly gazetted.

POPULATION AND HEALTH.

The census completed on the 18th July last gives the number of persons in the municipality as 547 males and 542 females, total 1069. The general health of the district compares favorably with all the other suburbs of Melbourne, and the return shows 35 births and 6 deaths; of the latter 4 were accidental and 2 from natural causes.

ELECTIONS.

On the 20th December, 1861, Councillor Geo. B. Kerferd having resigned the chair, Councillor Alexander Rodgers was unanimously elected chairman in his stead.

Councillor P. D. Ramsay having resigned his seat in the council on the 17th February, 1862, William Witt, Esq., was, on the 1st April, elected his successor.

WATER SUPPLY.

The council, after sending a deputation to the Government, at length, so far satisfactorily, concluded the negotiations relative to a subsidy as to be enabled to enter into contracts for at once carrying out the municipal water scheme, now known as the Beechworth water works.

This undertaking was commenced with the new year, and is progressing in a very satisfactory manner.

The details of the arrangement with the Government were duly published on the return of the deputation from Melbourne.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Little beyond necessary repairs have been carried out during the past half-year, the council deeming the water works a project of primary importance to the town and district, and therefore demanding their utmost consideration.

They may, however, state that Edward Clarke, Esq., barrister-at-law, and Dr. Gemmell, have kindly presented them with land sufficient for a new road twenty chains in length by a chain and a half wide, leading from Loch street to the public recreation reserve, upon condition that it be at once cleared and fenced. The council have therefore taken the necessary steps to have that condition complied with.

FINANCE.

The council append their usual half-yearly balance sheet, and would remark, with respect to the overdraft therein shown, that it arises in a great measure from the delay on the part of the Government in remitting the annual grant-in-aid, the first instalment of which is usually to hand long prior to this date.

Under this head the council would also mention that, fully recognising the vast importance to this municipality of the speedy completion of the Beechworth water works, they have deemed it advisable to levy a 1s. 6d. rate, to assist in meeting the outlay required in the execution of so beneficial an undertaking.
