Any person objecting to any other person as not entitled to have his name retained or inserted in any roll, may give notice thereof either in the manner prescribed by the 13th and 23rd sections of the Act No. 81, or by publishing a notice in some newspaper, as prescribed by the 5th section of the Act No. 137.

Such further information as may be required will be afforded by the Electoral Registrars, from whom also, as well as from all postmasters, clerks of petty sessions, deputy registrars of births and deaths, and officers in charge of police stations, forms may be obtained free of charge.

LANDS TEMPORARILY RESERVED FROM SALE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf by the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, has temporarily reserved from sale the lands hereinafter described, viz.:-

BAIRNSDALE—SITE FOR POLICE PURPOSES AT BAIRNSDALE, in lieu of the site previously set apart for those purposes on the 21st of January, 1862 (pursuant to Order of 14th April, 1862).—Two roods thirty-nine perches, county unnamed, parish of Bairnsdale, being allotments 1 and 6, section 1: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 2; bounded on the north by a line bearing N. 89° 25' E. two chains; on the east by a line bearing S. 0° 35' E. three chains seventy-five links; on the south by the main road, bearing S. 89° 25' W. two chains; and on the west by allotment 2, bearing N. 0° 35' W. three chains seventy-five links to the point of commencement.—(62.E.1985.)
