SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF INGLEWOOD.

PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENBY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the Government Gazette declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbored XXXIX) should extend to and be in operation through out Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the sections of the said Act, numbered from V. to X, were extended to the township of Inglewood, therein described: And whereas it is expedient to extend the operation of the said sections to the municipal district of Inglewood: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid I do hereby declare that the municipal district of Inglewood shall come under the operation of the Sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI, VIII, VIII, X., and X.

The number of the license and owner's name must be legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to each water carrt; and further, every public water carter shall have the words "water cart' and the number of his license legibly painted andnifixed in a manner conspicuous to passers by and the public on the outside of his residence or the premises where the said water cart is kept at night. And further be it ordered, the better to guard against accidents by fire, that the owners of all public water carts shall keep their water carts constantly loaded with water during the night, and also, if called upon by any officer duly authorised by the council,

shall, to the best of their ability, supply water for the extinguishing of any fire that may occur on property within the municipal boundary. And be it further ordered, that it shall be lawful for the treasurer of this municipal council to pay out of the municipal funds as rewards to water carters who shall supply the first, second, and third loads of water in all cases of fire within the municipality the following sums:—

To the water carter supplying the third load of water, Ten

shillings.

BYE-LAW NO. 7.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING THE SLAUGHTERING OF SMALL CATTLE WITHIN THE TOWN-SHIP OF INGLEWOOD.

SHIP OF INGLEWOOD.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Inglewood, that all butchers or other persons whose premises shall have been suitably prepared and properly paved for the purpose of slaughtering, so that in the judgment of the council, after the report of the inspector or other officer, the premises are found to be in a fit and proper state, shall be granted a license and permitted to kill sheep, lambs, swine, or goats; provided that all such persons shall receive, or cause to be received, the blood into tubs, together with all offal or other offensive matter, and remove the same, or cause it to be removed, from such premises at least once in every twenty-four hours.

That all such premises shall be registered at the office of the town clerk, and the same premises shall always be open to the inspection of the municipal council, or their inspector or other officer.

That no butcher, or other person as aforesaid, shall kill any sheen leaves are acceptance.

That no butcher, or other person as aforesaid, shall kill any sheep, lambs, swine, or goats, except upon premises registered as aforesaid, and without being duly licensed, except such butcher or other person be the bond fide servant of a duly licensed

That it shall not be lawful for any licensed butcher or other That it shall not be lawful for any hoensed butcher or other person to kill any sheep, lambs, swine, or goats, on premises distinct and apart, except all such premises are severally registered, and a license be taken out to slaughtor on each of such premises, as though they belonged to different owners and persons. That written notice of application for such license and registration shall be given to the town clerk, at least eight days before the same be granted, made, and entered, and be exhibited at his office.
