## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF INGLEWOOD.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intitled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the sections of the said Act, numbered from V. to X., were extended to the township of Inglewood, therein described: And whereas it is expedient to extend the operation of the said sections to the municipal district of Inglewood: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid I do hereby declare that the municipal district of Inglewood shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## THE CAMP RESERVE, HEATHCOTE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 28th day of April, 1862, temporarily reserved from sale the portion of the land called and known as the Camp Reserve at Heathcote, hereinafter described, and has directed that the remaining portion of the said camp reserve be thrown open to mining operations on the following conditions, viz.—

1. No person shall be allowed a preferential claim to mine on any part of the reserve in consequence of any application having been made by him prior to the date of proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the intention to throw open part of the reserve.

2. The warden, prior to allowing any claims to be worked on the reserve, shall exact from the claimholders a sufficient money deposit to ensure the filling up of the excavations after the claims are abandoned.

### DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND RESERVED OUT OF THE SAID CAMP RESERVE AT HEATHCOTE FOR PUBLIC BUILDINGS.—

**ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.\***

BYE-LAW No. 1.—FOR REGULATING THE NUMBER OF HORSES AND CATTLE WHICH THE HOLDER OF A MINER'S RIGHT, BUSINESS LICENSE, OR CARRIER'S LICENSE, SHALL BE ENTITLED TO DEPASTURE ON THE GOLD-FIELDS COMMONS OF THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

At a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board Room, Ararat, in the said district, on the seventh day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. Every holder of a miner's right or business license, and other residents, shall be entitled to depasture on the gold-fields commons of the Ararat district three (3) horses or six (6) head of cattle, two (2) horses and two (2) head of cattle, or one (1) horse and four (4) head of cattle.
2. Every holder of a carrier's license shall be entitled to depasture any number of horses not exceeding four (4), or any number of cattle not exceeding ten (10).
3. The holder of a miner's right, business license, or carrier's license, or the holder of two or more of the above licenses, shall only be entitled to depasture the number of horses or cattle allowed for one of the said licenses.

**MUNICIPALITY OF AMHERST.**

BYE-LAW No. 18.—REPEAL OF BYE-LAW No. 8, AND AMENDMENT OF SO MUCH OF THE 1ST CLAUSE OF BYE-LAW No. 1 (STANDING ORDERS) AS RELATES TO THE DAY OF GENERAL MEETINGS.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal Bye-law No. 8, and to amend so much of the 1st clause of Bye-law No. 1 (Standing Orders), made by the Municipal Council of Amherst, as relates to the day of General Meetings of such council:

Be it, and it is hereby ordered and directed by the Municipal Council of Amherst, that Bye-law No. 8 be and is hereby repealed, and that from and after the date of this receiving the assent of his Excellency the Governor, the day of General Meetings of such council shall be Wednesday of each week, and not Thursday, as heretofore.

**MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.**

BYE-LAW No. 33.—A BYE-LAW FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND FOR THE YEAR ENDING 16TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1863.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to assess all property in houses and lands within the limit of such municipal district, according to its fair annual average value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Ballaarat, that all the several properties within the said municipal district shall be assessed for the year ending the sixteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll or book confirmed by the said council on the fourteenth day of April, 1862, and amounting to, after the appeals have been heard and decided on, to a total sum of £32,460 5s.; and also that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the said annual value is hereby imposed on all the said property for the year ending the sixteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and payable in equal proportions as follows: the first moiety thereof to be due and payable on the fifteenth day of May, the second moiety to become due and payable on the first day of October, both in the year 1862: Provided nevertheless, where the total rate for the whole year does not exceed the sum of Ten shillings, then such rate shall be due and payable in full on the first day of June, 1862.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15 intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for regulating and licensing public water carriers: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Inglewood, that every water carrier plying within the said municipal district shall register his name and place of abode in the municipal office, and shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, the number of the license, and also the rewards and amounts which the council shall agree to pay to water carriers supplying water in case of fire. The number of the license and owner's name must be legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to each water cart; and further, every public water carter shall have the words "water cart" and the number of his license legibly painted and affixed in a manner conspicuous to passers by and the public on the outside of his residence or the premises where the said water cart is kept at night. And further be it ordered, the better to guard against accidents by fire, that the owners of all public water carts shall keep their water carts constantly loaded with water during the night, and also, if called upon by any officer duly authorised by the council,

shall, to the best of their ability, supply water for the extinguishing of any fire that may occur on property within the municipal boundary. And any person who shall commit any neglect or breach thereof of this bye-law, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

And be it further ordered, that it shall be lawful for the treasurer of this municipal council to pay out of the municipal funds as rewards to water carters who shall supply the first, second, and third loads of water in all cases of fire within the municipality the following sums:—

- To the water carter supplying the first load of water, Two pounds.
- To the water carter supplying the second load of water, One pound.
- To the water carter supplying the third load of water, Ten shillings.

**BYE-LAW No. 7.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING THE SLAUGHTERING OF SMALL CATTLE WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF INGLEWOOD.**

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Inglewood, that all butchers or other persons whose premises shall have been suitably prepared and properly paved for the purpose of slaughtering, so that in the judgment of the council, after the report of the inspector or other officer, the premises are found to be in a fit and proper state, shall be granted a license and permitted to kill sheep, lambs, swine, or goats; provided that all such persons shall receive, or cause to be received, the blood into tubs, together with all offal or other offensive matter, and remove the same, or cause it to be removed, from such premises at least once in every twenty-four hours.

That all such premises shall be registered at the office of the town clerk, and the same premises shall always be open to the inspection of the municipal council, or their inspector or other officer.

That no butcher, or other person as aforesaid, shall kill any sheep, lambs, swine, or goats, except upon premises registered as aforesaid, and without being duly licensed, except such butcher or other person be the *bona fide* servant of a duly licensed person.

That it shall not be lawful for any licensed butcher or other person to kill any sheep, lambs, swine, or goats, on premises distinct and apart, except all such premises are severally registered, and a license be taken out to slaughter on each of such premises, as though they belonged to different owners and persons.

That written notice of application for such license and registration shall be given to the town clerk, at least eight days before the same be granted, made, and entered, and be exhibited at his office.

That any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

**BYE-LAW No. 10.—PROHIBITING DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATERCOURSES, AND REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS.**

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is stated amongst other things that the council of any municipal district shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, and public thoroughfares, and shall and may make such bye-laws for carrying out these objects as shall to such council seem fit: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Inglewood, that no person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse or beast, or shall drive or wheel any cart, barrow, carriage, or other vehicle, upon or across any of the public footpaths or watercourses of the municipal district of Inglewood, or shall in any way cause damage to the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them; provided that every owner or occupier of any gateway, yard, or lane, to which access by horses, beasts, carriages, or other vehicles, can be obtained only by riding, leading, or wheeling upon or across any of the said public footpaths or watercourses, who shall make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, as may be necessary for approach and access to any such private gateway, yard, or lane, at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said municipal council may appoint for that purpose, shall be allowed to use such crossing without being liable to the penalty hereinafter imposed. That the owner or occupier of any building or premises shall not cause or suffer any water to be discharged into or over any public footpaths within the said district; provided that if the owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building or premises into the public water tables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said council may appoint for that purpose, he shall not be liable to the penalty hereinafter imposed. And any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

**BYE-LAW No. 11.—TO PREVENT THE NUISANCES ARISING FROM SUFFERING CATTLE AND OTHER ANIMALS TO BE AT LARGE OR TO WANDER IN THE STREETS OF THE MUNICIPALITY.**

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and the general good

rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Inglewood, that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to suffer any cow, bull, ox, or other horned animal, or any cattle whatsoever, or any horse, ass, mule, sheep, goat, or swine, belonging to him, her, or them, or under his, her, or their care, to be at large, or to wander in any street or public place within the municipal district. Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

*The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 5, 7, 10, and 11, made by the municipal council of Inglewood, have been assented to by the Governor in Council.*

**MUNICIPALITY OF SANDRIDGE.**

**BYE-LAW No. 13.—FOR THE SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES CAUSED BY THROWING DELETERIOUS MATTERS INTO THE SALTWATER LAGOON.**

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and for the preservation of public health: And whereas it is desirable for the preservation of the health of the inhabitants of the municipal district of Sandridge, to suppress the nuisances frequently caused by parties throwing into the Saltwater Lagoon at Sandridge sundry offensive and deleterious matters: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Sandridge, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria:—

1. That no person or persons shall drown any animal, or pour, throw, or deposit, or cause to be poured, thrown, or deposited, in any part whatsoever of the Saltwater Lagoon at Sandridge, or in any open drain, ditch, or tributary creek, connected with or running into any part of said lagoon, any butcher's offal, dead animal, night-soil, or any other offensive or deleterious matter, fluid, or thing.

2. Any person or persons guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

*The foregoing Bye-law, No. 13, made by the municipal council of Sandridge, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.*
