REGISTRAR GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1862.

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keltor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at Melbourne, deduced from the mean of twenty-four hourly observations taken at the Flagstaff Observatory on each day during the month of April, 1862:—

The number of deaths reported as occurring in April was 265, against 340 for the same month in 1861, and against 314 for the same month in 1860, the returns thus showing a reduction, as compared with the two months, of 84 and 49 deaths respectively. The average in April was 8.83 deaths daily, against 11.16* deaths in March, and against 12 deaths in February.

The mean temperature of the month, as recorded at the Flagstaff Observatory, was 57.2°, against 59.3° for April, 1861, and against 55.8° for April, 1860. The days of highest and lowest temperature were the 15th and 16th; at noon on the former the thermometer reached 75.9°, and at 11 p.m. on the latter it had descended to 41°. The greatest range of temperature (30.6°), occurred on the 14th, from a maximum of 73.2° to a minimum of 42.6°; and the least (6.1°) on the 5th, from a maximum of 62.2° to a minimum of 56.1°. The range between the highest and lowest of the month was 34.9°, and the mean daily range 16.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure during the month was 29.950 in., against 29.979 in. for April, 1861, and against 29.923 in. for the same month in 1860. The highest point attained by the barometer (30.181 in.), was at 10 a.m. on the 12th, and the lowest (29.506 in.) at 1 a.m. on the 17th, the range for the month thus being .675 in.

The mean temperature, number of deaths, and daily average of mortality for the first four weeks in April, were as follow:—

Of the 265 deaths which occurred during the month, 162, or 61 per cent., were of males, and 103, or 39 per cent., were of females. 141 deaths, or slightly over 53 per cent., were of children under five years, and 124, or rather less than 47 per cent., were of persons over that age. In April, 1861, the proportions to the total of children under five, and those of older children and adults, were respectively 53 and 42 per cent., and in April, 1860, the same proportions were 61 and 39 per cent.

No particular day during the month was remarkable for any large amount of mortality. The highest number of deaths (13) occurred on the 4th and 11th, 12 on the 1st, 9th, and 16th, and 11 on the 3rd and 7th.

The oldest individuals whose deaths were recorded were two males, one of whom at the age of 76 died of diarrhoea, and the other at that of 77, died of disease of the heart.

* The deaths in the published report for March numbered 339, and the daily average was 10.94. Seven deaths which occurred in that month have since been registered, bringing the total number up to 346, and the daily average up to 11.16 as stated.

Only eight deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, which, with the exception of October last, when eight also occurred, is the smallest number of violent deaths which any one of these reports has brought to the notice of the public during the last fourteen months. They were as follow:—A male vagrant aged 60 and a seaman aged 30, accidentally drowned in the Yarra; four boys and one girl, between 2 and 6 years of age, accidentally drowned at Yarraberg, Yarrabank, Sandridge, and Brunswick (two at the last-named place); and a male aged 30, poisoned by strychnine, and found dead under the railway arch at Emerald Hill.

The deaths in charitable or public institutions were 42 in number, or 16 per cent. of the total. They occurred as follow:—Melbourne Hospital, 32; Benevolent Asylum, 1; Immigrants' Home, 1; Western Gaol, 2; Immigrants' Hospital, 1; Lying-in Hospital, 1; Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages according to the last census, the number of deaths of persons under and over five years of age, the total at all ages, and the number of deaths to every 1000 of the population during the month of April, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

NOTE.—The population of the different sub-districts according to the recent census is given subject to future revision, but it is believed that when finally corrected the figures will not differ materially from the above.

Of the 141 deaths which occurred to children under five years of age, 81, or rather over 57 per cent., were of males, and 60, or rather less than 43 per cent., were of females; of both sexes, 90 were under a year old, 34 between one and two years, 11 between two and three years, 2 between three and four years, and 4 between four and five years.

Of the 124 deaths of persons over five years of age, 81, or rather over 65 per cent., were of males, and 43, or about 35 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 6 were between five and ten, 2 between ten and fifteen, 1 between fifteen and twenty, 10 between twenty and twenty-five, 14 between twenty-five and thirty, 15 between thirty and thirty-five, 18 between thirty-five and forty, 18 between forty and forty-five, 10 between forty-five and fifty, 12 between fifty and fifty-five, 7 between fifty-five and sixty, 4 between sixty and sixty-five, 2 between sixty-five and seventy, 3 between seventy and seventy-five, and 2 of seventy-five and upwards.

By the above table it is seen that most deaths occurred during the month from local diseases, which numbered 84, or 32 per cent. of the total, whilst deaths from zymotic diseases amounted only to 73, or about 28 per cent. of the total. The month reported on is the first since October last in which any other class of diseases has been more fatal than the zymotic.

RESIGNATION OF COUNCILLOR.

Councillor Cameron tendered his resignation on the 9th of April, which was duly accepted.

APPOINTMENTS.

On the 15th of November, 1861, Mr. T. B. Golden was appointed town clerk and collector at a salary of £100 per annum, and 5 per cent. for collection.

On the 20th of January, 1862, Mr. C. H. Raven was appointed town surveyor, at a salary of £50 per annum.

FINANCE.

The total assessment for the year amounted to £9919 10s., which was reduced on appeal £935, and by property discovered to be without the boundary, £695; a supplementary assessment finally settled the total value of rateable property at £8689 10s.

In the face of the urgent requirements of the town for public works of primary importance, the council have found it necessary to use the strictest economy in management. The present council chambers and office have been rented at Twenty-five pounds per annum, and although a building or hall belonging to the council would be more desirable and be of great public utility and convenience for divers purposes, it is feared that some time must elapse before the council can spare funds from the road works.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Unlike the majority of towns that have availed themselves of the advantages of municipal government, St. Arnaud is situated at a distance from the line of any main road. Under these circumstances the council urged the extension of the present mail road from Castlemaine through Maldon as a main road to St. Arnaud, and the matter was brought before Parliament by the member for the district, John Woods, Esq., who forcibly seconded the arguments put forth by the council. The Government, however, opposed the extension, and the district road board has undertaken the construction of the roads to Castlemaine and Ballarat, and has invited the council to continue the line through the municipality, a distance of four miles. This important and necessary work has been approved of by the Board of Land and Works, and a minimum outlay of £2300 will be required to execute it. The smallness of the preliminary endowment for 1861, viz., £500, has prevented the council from proceeding with the work in its entirety, but the worst portions of the road are now under contract, and the largest of the five bridges and culverts on the line is in course of erection. It is proposed to renew the application for a special grant in aid of the road, as the council find that many other useful improvements in the town have to be postponed owing to the great outlay on it.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have passed the council:—
Bye-law No. 1. For regulating the proceedings of the council. Not yet assented to.
Bye-law No. 2. For making an assessment and imposing a rate of One shilling in the pound.—Assented to.

Applications have been made to Government on the following subjects:—

The establishment of a daily mail to St. Arnaud.—Granted.
To transfer the police camp to the reserve in Napier street, and for the erection of suitable accommodation.—Granted.

For the construction of a reservoir.—The council obtained a promise from the Department of Public Works, that the scheme should be proceeded with at the commencement of the year. In consequence of the great importance of the subject to the district, and no steps having been taken in the matter by Government, the council were induced to make a second application, which has resulted in the information that plans, &c., were ready, and that the consent of Government would be asked to proceed with the works immediately on the passing of the vote by Parliament.

For the survey of agricultural land to the westward of the town.—Granted.

To appoint a receiver and paymaster for the district.—The Treasurer, whilst declining to accede to the request at the

present time, has promised that the matter shall be kept under notice.

For the establishment of a county court and court of mines. Not yet decided.

For the appropriation of a sum of money, out of the vote of 1861, to St. Arnaud.—£500 granted.

For the amendment of the municipal boundary.—Not yet decided.

To cause such a divergence of the proposed line of telegraph to Swan Hill that St. Arnaud might be included in the route.—Refused.
