WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, inituled, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a certain area, therein described, situate on the north side of Kyneton and east of the Campaspo River, was proclaimed to be a Farmers' Common: And whoreas it is expedient to substitute another area in lieu of the said common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the Farmers' Common aforesaid, and I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be the Farmeng Common for the use of the occupiers of purchased land at or near the locality hereinafter mentioned, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—
