TOLLS AT SEYMOUR AND RICHMOND PUNTS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &q.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare that tolls shall be payable and collected at any punt or ferry which shall be constructed, repaired, or supported at the public expense, and to cause such toll-houses and ferry-houses, gates, bars, chains, rails, and fences to be built and set up as shall be deemed necessary to prevent any person, beast, or carriage from passing by or over such ferry or punt, unless there shall be paid the tolls lawfully payable thereat under the authority of the said Act; and that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the tolls to be payable at such punts and ferries, and such rates and tolls from time to time to vary and alter, and any such proclamation to revoke: And, whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, certain tolls therein mentioned were authorized and made payable at the punt or ferry at Seymour, on the Goulburn River: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, certain tolls therein mentioned were authorized and made payable at the punt or ferry at Richmond, on the Yarra Yarra River, in the county of Bourke: And whereas it is expedient to alter the rates of tolls payable at the said punts or ferries: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamations as declares the rates of tolls to be collected at the said punts or ferries respectively; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare that rates of tolls not exceeding the rates herein-after mentioned shall be payable and collected at the punts or ferries aforesaid respectively at Seymour on the Goulburn River and at Richmond on the Yarra Yarra River, in the county of Bourke, that is to say:—

PORT OF BASSEIN.

BASSEIN, captured from the Burmese on the 19th May, 1852, in latitude 17° 45' N. and longitude 94° 45' E., is situated about 64 miles from the sea, in the centre of a rice cultivating district, has of late years become of importance on account of its rice trade, and bids fair to become one of the largest and cheapest rice marts in these latitudes. The agriculturists being all Kareens, and mostly Christian, are fast increasing; and every year the crops are on the increase and the article of better quality. The following is a list of exports of grains for the few past years:—

The principal grain brought to the market is the Neaseing and Ngakyouk. Paddy is brought in large quantities and husked by the merchants, the husking is carried on with great care in large sheds adjoining the merchant's godown; it is then bagged and shipped, paying duty at the rate of 2 annas per Indian maund (82 lb.), each bag containing about 2½ baskets. The great advantage ships have by loading at this port is that they lie alongside the bank of the river, that a covering can be raised leading from the godown to the ship's hatchway, securing the cargo from any chance of damage by rain, &c.; the ordinary time of despatch a vessel of 600 tons gets is about 25 to 30 days, but there are cases of much shorter periods. "An American ship of 1297 tons, carrying a cargo of 28,000 bags of rice, draught 21 feet, and now bound to Europe, has landed 500 tons of ballast and has cleared within 30 days; and including the expenses of caulking, her charges have amounted to 3000 rupees—this includes the cost of dunnage, &c." The expenses of a vessel of about 600 tons would amount to about 1 rupee 8 annas per ton; provisions are cheap and plentiful, especially poultry and pigs. The mail leaves for Rangoon and *vice versa* twice a week, and an express boat with Europe mail twice a month. Electric communication is understood to be projected. Bamboos and mats are obtainable for dunnage at a moderate price. Cabin stores are to be obtained from the native merchants. Port dues are paid at the rate of 4 annas per ton. The Government steamer is now off the station, which made periodical trips to Rangoon. It is understood that steam communication between the two ports, and the creeks, will be re-opened at an early date.

I. Vessels of 14 feet draught and upwards should on no account attempt the passage to the westward of Negrais Island.

II. Vessels coming from the southward should bring Diamond Island to bear north-west, then steer for it until the fairway buoy is visible, which is situated 1½ miles north-east of the island. Steer north-north-east from this buoy until black buoy bears east, then north-east by north.

III. Vessels entering from the westward in latitude north of Diamond Island should bring it to bear south-east, steer in for it until the fairway buoy is made, then proceed as above directed for vessels entering from the southward. This passage, however, should be attempted by sailing vessels only in the north-east monsoon.

IV. Vessels unable from stress of weather to distinguish the different marks should anchor under Diamond Island, where good anchorage and smooth water is to be found.

Pilots are generally to be had at or near Diamond Island; but vessels not finding one, and being provided with Lieut. Ward's chart of the Bassein River, need have no hesitation coming in as far as Dalhousie Bay, where they can generally obtain one from the Master Attendant's department.

A first-class red buoy, marked "Fairway" in white letters, is placed 1½ miles north-east of Diamond Island.

N.B.—The shoal extending south of Negrais Island is now called the Orestes Shoal, and that extending from the Porian shore, westward, the Porian.

SAILING DIRECTIONS FROM DALHOUSIE OR NEGRAIS ISLAND TO BASSEIN.

I. A vessel should proceed up the river about ½ a mile from the shore until up to Yea Jone Creek; from thence she should sheer over to eastern bank gradually until the black buoy on the south No. 57.—JULY 22, 1862.—2.

end of the ridge shoal is seen, which is to be passed, keeping it on the port hand about 2 cables' length, and keep eastern bank until after passing the red and white buoys in the same manner as the black; then stand up mid-channel passing the Sesostris Rocks, which are buoyed with a red buoy. The rocks lie in shore of the buoy. Keep on mid-channel until close to "Enterprize" Island, taking care to give the spit a berth that extends a little way down from the south end of the island. There is a passage on each side of the island, one to the east and one to the west. The passage to the left is preferable for a ship of light draught, as it is wide, and there is more room for work.

The passage to the eastward is taken by vessels of large draught. Vessels should keep close to the eastern shore in order to avoid the Pariah Rock.

In sailing up the passage left of "Enterprize" Island, care must be taken not to approach too close to the spit that extends north of the island. Proceed up as far as the village of Toman Dow, that lies in a creek on the port hand; then steer across to eastern bank between the red buoys and Elephant Island, going nearer to the island than the buoy, until you get into 7 fathoms; then steer up on the eastern shore until abreast of the Pama-waddie River; from this steer over towards Ashby Rocks' buoy, giving the Cackatoo Rocks a berth of at least 2 cables' length. These rocks are seen above water, except at spring tides, when they are covered. There are three patches; two of them show above water half ebb to half flood; one is sunken, and extends to 138 yards outside the others—the least water on it at dead low water spring tide is 16 feet. Keep the port shore until you reach the second creek, when the channel becomes much wider.

The Junction is so called from being at the top or north end of Napoota Reach, where two branches of the river meet, the one from the east being the way to Bassein.

At Napoota Reach you may steer up until approaching the Junction, where, on the eastern shore, a mud bank extends quarter of a cable length from the bushes; there is also a bank extending from the port side. These can be avoided by keeping in nearly mid-channel. In the third reach there is a bank of mud which will be known by a white board in the bushes. On the port hand this shoal extends nearly half-way over, and the whole length of the reach in which it is, so that vessels must keep the starboard hand going up, and *vice versa* coming down. The remainder of the passage upwards is without danger, and easy of navigation.

There is deep water close to the bank, and the ground chiefly very soft mud. Vessels should have a small warp anchor in readiness to run out if required, and should use a light working anchor for dropping; this will relieve the crew of a quantity of labor.

Vessels should show their number before arriving at the village of Takoin, and masters should report their arrival at the Master Attendant's Office and Custom House as soon as possible.
