THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time, thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders and landholders at Brown's and Scarsdale, in the county of Grenville, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published, as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, declare, that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE, in the county of Grenville.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the municipality of Smythesdale; thence by the south boundary thereof and a line bearing west one hundred and eighty chains; thence south four miles; thence east one hundred and eighty chains, crossing Smythe's Creek; thence north four miles to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Brown's and Scarsdale."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

line bearing S. 30° 48' W. distance forty-eight chains ten links; thence by a line bearing S. 35° 15' W. distance fifty-six chains; thence by a line bearing S. 21° 30' W. distance fifty-eight chains ninety links; thence by a curve of forty chains radius the chord of which bears S. 36° 30' W. distance seventeen chains fifty links; thence by a line bearing S. 55° 23' W. distance thirty-five chains; thence by a curve of twenty chains radius the chord of which bears S. 79° 29' W. distance eleven chains; thence by a curve of fifteen chains radius the chord of which bears S. 53° 30' W. distance ten chains fifty links; thence by a line bearing S. 30° 32' W. distance forty-five chains sixty links to the north-east corner of No. 1 allotment, Scarsdale; and thence by a line bearing S. 18° 30' W. distance fifty-two chains to the proposed terminus at Scarsdale. PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.
ENLARGEMENT OF RICHMOND.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by five hundred and four resident householders of the municipal district of Richmond, and sealed with the municipal seal, praying for the extension of the municipal boundaries.

The petitioners state that they are resident householders and ratepayers of the township of Richmond.

They further state that the western boundary of the township [municipal district] of Richmond commences at the eastern side or alignment of the Punt road and Hoddle street, and that the municipal council have no power to expend their funds on the said road and street and the footpaths thereof, which are beyond their jurisdiction, and that consequently the footpaths and water-tables on the eastern side of the said road and street are in many places in a filthy, dangerous, and almost impassable state, from an accumulation of mud and stagnant water, the latter too being highly injurious to the health of the inhabitants.

They state lastly that the extension of the district in the manner they propose will enable the municipal council to apply a portion of the rates to the maintenance, formation, and repairs of the said road, street, and footpaths, and relieve the inhabitants of the east side of the said road and street from their present anomalous position.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners humbly hope that your Excellency and the Executive Council may in your wisdom deem it expedient to exercise the powers given to you by the 4th section of the before-mentioned Act [18 Victoria No. 15], and the Act of the 18th Victoria No. 32, by proclaiming the extension of the western boundary of the township [municipal district] of Richmond so as to include a moiety of the Punt road and Hoddle street, commencing at a point on the edge of the Yarra River thirty-three feet west from the present boundary of Richmond, and running in a straight and northerly direction to the intersection of Waterloo place and Hoddle street; and then commencing at a point forty-nine feet six inches west from the present boundary in Hoddle street, and running in a straight and northerly direction to the intersection of Hoddle street and Victoria street east, thereby including a moiety of the said road and street, as shown upon the sketch marked upon the margin of the petition."

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

VICINITY OF GISBORNE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by fifty-seven householders, purporting to be the majority resident within an area adjoining to the municipal district of Gisborne, containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile of such contiguous area, praying that their locality may be united with and form part of the said municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident upon lands outside of and adjacent to the municipality of Gisborne, and that they constitute a majority of the residents within an area surrounding the said municipality containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile, which area they are desirous should be annexed to and form part of the said municipality.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency will be pleased to declare, by Proclamation, the respective localities within which we reside be united with and form part of the said municipality of Gisborne, by the following general description, as defined and set forth on the plan [which accompanied the petition], viz.—Commencing at a line from the south-east corner of block XXX, on the Mount Alexander road, running north two miles forty chains to the north-east corner of section 1, known as Todd's paddock; then running west one mile twenty chains to the south-east corner of that part of Early's allotment known as New Gisborne; then north fifteen chains to the south side of the railway line; then along the railway line eighteen chains to the section of the west boundary of allotment 17, known as Hurst's paddock, with the Mount Alexander Railway; then along the west boundary of Hurst's paddock south twenty chains to the north-east corner of the Racecourse paddock; then west twenty-four chains along the Racecourse boundary; then south-west along the same boundary twenty-five chains to the Mount Alexander road; then south along the Mount Alexander road forty-five chains to the section of the west boundary of block XXXIV, with the main Mount Alexander road; then due south along the west boundary of section 34 one mile sixty-four chains to the south-west corner of section 1, known as the Gisborne town common; then due east one mile sixty chains to the south-east corner of section XXX, the starting point."

MUNICIPALITY OF FITZ ROY.

BY-LAW No. 17.—FOR EMPOWERING THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF FITZ ROY TO MAKE AND EXECUTE CERTAIN WORKS AND PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS, OUT OF AND BY A SUM OF FIVE THOUSAND POUNDS RAISED BY MORTGAGING THE MUNICIPAL RATES OF THE SAID COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that any municipal council shall have power to borrow, by way of mortgage or otherwise on the credit of land, funds, or income to which it may be entitled, any sum or sums of money that may be required for the purpose of making, carrying on, or completing any permanent improvements that may directly benefit the municipal district for which such council has been elected, or for the purchase of any railway shares or other stock that may be necessary or desirable for any such improvements, or which may directly benefit such district, but in no case shall the sum or sums so borrowed exceed in the whole the estimated revenue of such municipal corporation for the period of three years; provided that no money shall be borrowed by any such municipal council until the express sanction of the Governor and Executive Council of the said colony has been obtained, not only for the amount to be borrowed, but also for the works, improvements, railway shares, or other stock

upon which it is proposed to expend the sum or sums so to be raised: And whereas the council of the municipal district of Fitz Roy has obtained the express sanction of the Governor and Executive Council of the said colony to borrow a sum of Five thousand pounds, being a sum not exceeding in the whole the estimated revenue of the said municipal council of Fitz Roy for the period of three years, by mortgaging its municipal rates, and to expend that sum upon the works and permanent improvements set forth in schedule A hereunto attached: And whereas the said council proposes to execute the aforesaid works and permanent improvements in accordance with the conditions set forth in the specification given under schedule B hereunto attached: Be it therefore enacted, that the council of the municipal district of Fitz Roy is hereby authorized so to make, execute, and perform the several works and permanent improvements detailed in the said schedule A by the money raised by mortgaging its municipal rates as hereinbefore recited; and all such works shall be executed by contract in writing, in conformity with and under such general regulations as may from time to time be made by any officer or person to be appointed by the Governor of the said colony for that purpose.

SCHEDULE B.

Fitz Roy Council Chambers, 186.

SPECIFICATION.

In the accomplishment of the works proposed the contractor will be required to perform in a workmanlike manner all necessary formation, cutting, and embanking.

The contractor must also execute all finishing necessary to impart to the street a creditable appearance, remove all useless material to such place or places, not distant more than one

mile, as may be pointed out by the public works committee or surveyor, or any person acting for him.

The contractor must provide all labor, implements, and materials necessary for the due completion of the works proposed, except only such materials as earth and gravel, to raise which on the lands to be mentioned he shall have the necessary permission, but he must furnish all cartage and labor thereat.

The lines of ... are supposed to be straight, but should any curve be afterwards proved to exist in the line of houses on either side, the municipal council reserve to themselves the power to follow the same if found expedient so to do.

Kerb to be one foot wide and one foot deep, and not less than two feet six inches long, and to be axed full width of tread and on the face seven inches deep, and the remaining five inches of face to be rough axed. The tread to be dressed with a bevel of three-eighths of an inch. A margin draft of three inches at back for joint to, receive flagging. The tread to be worked true out of winding. The end joints must be worked square throughout. No honeycomb stone will be allowed. Kerbing returned to building line of streets and rights-of-way. One outlet or drain-hole to each allotment to be cut in the kerb, not less than four inches square, without charge; if more outlets are required by the owners of property, such must be cut by the contractor at the cost of One shilling each.

Channel to be ... pitchers wide. Pitchers to be nine inches by nine inches, and not less than six inches deep; to be laid on a bed of sand three inches deep, to be well grouted with clean sharp sand, and well rammed.

Before the work shall be certified for as completed, the contractor shall be bound to clear away all surplus materials from the ground to such place or places as may be pointed out by the surveyor, provided the lead be not greater in length than one mile from the nearest end of the street, or of such section (if a special place of deposit be not named by the surveyor), and there to spread such earth as the surveyor may deem suitable for the purpose, so as to conform with the intended formation lines of such street or streets to which the contractor may cart the same, provided the lead be not greater in length than one mile from the nearest end of the street.

Further, the contractor shall perform everything necessary to impart to the work a creditable appearance.

The time allowed for the full completion of the work shall be calendar month from the date of acceptance of tender by the municipal council of Fitz Roy. No work shall be considered complete until a written certificate to that effect be obtained from the surveyor, who will give the same when it is completed according to specification and his instructions.

Should the contractor fail in completing his work to the satisfaction of the surveyor within the aforesaid period, a sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5) shall be deducted from the per-centage retained or deposit money for every lawful day after the time specified shall have expired, until completion.

Should the contractor fail in carrying through the work proposed in manner specified, also in true accordance with the relative drawings, to the entire satisfaction of the surveyor, it shall be in the power of that officer to take the work out of the hands of the contractor altogether, and complete the same at the latter's expense.

Should the surveyor deem it advisable to make any alterations upon the proposed works as they are herein specified to be carried out, the contractor shall be bound to make each and every alteration, upon receiving a written notice to that effect, the difference in cost to be paid or deducted from payments agreeably to schedule of prices furnished by the contractor along with his lump tender.

No claim for extra work shall be allowed unless the same shall have been specially ordered in writing by the surveyor.

CULVERTS.

DRAINS.

DAMAGES MADE GOOD.

All damages done to the works, from whatever cause, until they shall be taken off the contractor's hands as finished, shall be at his risk, and shall be made good by him before the work is considered complete, unless such damage shall arise from any thing done by order of the surveyor.

MEASUREMENT.

All measurements of work shall be made according to the actual dimensions, notwithstanding any custom to the contrary.

FORMING.

The contractor shall be bound to furnish and securely put up sufficient fences, to maintain all necessary lights from sunset to sunrise, and otherwise to guard against the possibility of any accident occurring during execution, the consequence of which (if any such occur) shall rest with the contractor.

SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES.

In case of any difference or dispute between the surveyor and contractor, the same shall be referred to the honorary consulting engineer of the metropolitan councils, whose decision shall be final.

MAINTENANCE.

The contractor shall be bound to maintain in good order and condition the whole of the proposed works hereinbefore specified for a period of ... after certificate of completion has been granted by the surveyor, as a part guarantee for which the 15 per centum retained as after mentioned shall not be paid over to the contractor, or his order, until the expiration of the said term of maintenance.

PAYMENTS.

Payments will be made in fortnightly instalments during the progress of the proposed work. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the sum of each or any instalment shall in no case exceed 85 per cent. of the full value of the actual work computed. Any balance remaining owing shall be paid at the expiration of the specified period of maintenance.

SECURITY.

Besides the retention of 15 per cent. from the full value of the work completed, the contractor shall be required to furnish a cash security equal to five per cent. on the amount of his tender to the municipal council of Fitz Roy for the due performance of the terms of this specification. Two and a half per cent. shall be paid down on conditional acceptance of his tender by the public works committee, such acceptance being subject to approval of council. Should the council decline to accept such tender, the amount so deposited shall be repaid; and in case the said bond be not duly executed by the contractor within one fortnight of the date of the acceptance of his tender, it shall be lawful for the municipal council, if they think fit, to set aside the contract, and enter into any other arrangements for the work that may be deemed requisite.

CONTRACTOR TO FIND PLANS, ETC.

The contractor must provide his own copies of the drawings and specification.

FORM OF TENDER.

Intending contractors shall send in their tender according to the annexed form of tender, and shall give such details as regards the prices of the various descriptions of work as are therein required.

Offers not in strict conformity with this clause will not be entertained by the municipal council of Fitz Roy.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

The words "council" or "municipal council," wherever used in this specification, shall mean the municipal council of Fitz Roy; the word "contractor," wherever used, shall mean the plural as well as singular, that is, "contractor" or "contractors," as the case may be; and the "surveyor," wherever used, shall mean and imply Mr. James Edward Austin, surveyor to the municipal council of Fitz Roy.

ACCEPTANCE OF TENDERS.

Lowest or any tender not necessarily accepted.

N.B.—The above conditions are subject to such general regulations as may from time to time be made by any officer or person to be appointed by the Governor for that purpose.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 17, made by the municipal council of Fitz Roy, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

REPORT of the Proceedings of the Council during the Half-year ending 30th June, 1862.
PUBLIC WORKS.

The abattoirs for the district have been completed and fitted up, and are now in full operation.

Channelling has been laid down along portion of the Three-chain road, and in Napier, Church, York, Coventry, Dorcas, Park, Cecil, and Raglan streets; and crossings along the Eastern road, and in other parts of the town.

Metal has been supplied for and spread in a number of streets, and a contract entered into for a further supply for the Three-chain road, tenders for the formation of which have been invited.

Moray street has been reformed and metalled between York street and the Sandridge road, and the formation and metalling of portions of Montague, Coventry, and Dorcas streets nearly completed. The formation of Grant street, and the continuation of Market street west of Cecil street, is in progress.

Drains have been made through the Eastern Swamp, and several footpaths constructed in line of the main streets. Bridges have been erected along the line of the Yarra Bank road. The roadway and other works in the South Park have been finished; also, a number of works of a minor character. The council contemplate completing the continuation of Moray street north of the Sandridge road, and also the approaches to the bridge at the Falls, with as little delay as possible. The execution of

other equally important public works will be considered by the council, who are in communication with the Government, with a view to endeavoring to secure the deposit along the south bank of the river of the silt to be dredged from the Yarra.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The municipal council have by the establishment of the abattoirs removed all slaughtering from the town, and intend to carry out several other important sanitary improvements. A bye-law was framed for the establishment of a free library, to which, however, the Government declined to assent; but the council are pleased to find that the committee of the mechanics' institute have taken up the matter by opening a free reading-room to the public. The water department have laid down pipes in the smaller streets of the town not hitherto reticulated. During the half-year there have been 21 meetings of the council, out of which Councillor Thistlethwaite attended 21; Councillor Stead, 21; Councillor Fausset, 20; Councillor Greig, 20; Councillor Williams, 22; and Councillor Atkinson, 20. The late chairman (Councillor Palk) left the district in April, and Councillor Thistlethwaite was appointed in his stead during the remainder of the municipal year. An election took place on the 27th and 28th June, to supply the vacancies caused by the retirement, by rotation, of Councillors Thistlethwaite, Fausset, and Atkinson; and also to fill up the vacancy caused by the absence of Councillor Palk. Councillors Thistlethwaite and Fausset were re-elected; and Messrs. John Finlay and John Balston were elected to the other vacancies, the latter gentleman in place of Councillor Palk. On the new council assembling, Councillor Fausset was appointed chairman for the ensuing year.
