WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereinbefore mentioned into any number of divisions and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the fifth day of January instant, the mining district of Beechworth was split into the divisions therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order determine that the number of members of the mining board of the said mining district of Beechworth which shall be elected within and for each division thereof shall be that set immediately under the name of each such division respectively in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, that is to say:—

COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains un-sold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BALLAN FARMERS' COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861) shall be and the same is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom an area of about 583 acres, which are hereinafter described as an addition to the Mount Egerton Gold Fields Common.—(62.F.10283.)

MOUNT EGERTON GOLD FIELDS COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of August, 1861) shall be and the same is hereby increased by adding thereto the following area, viz.:—County of Grant, parish unnamed: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 4, in the parish of _____; thence southerly by the western boundary of said allotment and a line to the northern boundary of the Mount Egerton township reserve; thence easterly by northern boundary of said township to the north-east angle thereof; thence northerly by a line and the eastern boundary of allotment 1, section 4, in the parish of _____ to the north-east angle of said allotment; thence by the northern boundary of said allotment, being a line bearing S. 63° 15' W. to the point of commencement.—(62.F.10283.)

TERANG TOWN COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifteenth day of April, 1861) shall be and the same is increased by adding thereto four hundred and fifty acres

of land, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands situate within the town boundary of Terang, as indicated on a plan deposited at the office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne.—(62.E.11826.)

WILLIAMSTOWN TOWN COMMON (described in two several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the eighteenth day of February and the thirtieth day of May, 1861) shall be, and the same is hereby increased by adding thereto the following area, viz.:—375 acres, more or less, county of Bourke, parish of Truganina, being the unappropriated land within the area hereinafter described: Commencing at the embouchure of the Kororoit Creek; thence by the sea coast at highwater mark south-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment A, section 9, parish of Truganina; thence by the eastern boundaries of allotments A and B northerly and north-easterly; thence by the northern boundary of allotment B westerly to the margin of a lagoon, and by the eastern and northern boundaries of that lagoon northerly and westerly to the eastern boundary of block 3, Truganina; thence by that eastern boundary northerly to the north-east angle thereof; thence east to the Kororoit Creek, and by that creek southerly and easterly to the point of commencement; deducting therefrom all sold or otherwise appropriated land.—(62.F.11521.)

YANDOIT GOLD FIELDS COMMON (described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861) shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and the Yandoit Gold Fields Common shall comprise the area hereinafter described, viz.:—County of Talbot, parish of Yandoit, containing all the unsold and unappropriated land within the following boundaries: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 7 of section 4, parish of Yandoit, and bounded on the east by the Jim Crow Creek, bearing northerly to the north parish boundary of Yandoit; on the north by the said boundary, bearing west about thirty-seven chains fifty links to the north-west corner of the parish; on the west by the parish boundary, bearing south about four miles and forty-eight chains; and on the south by a line and the south boundary of allotment 7 of section 4, bearing east about two miles to the commencing point. Approximate area equal to 3000 acres.—(62.F.11043.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field [or, as the case may be] Common of _____" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that each of the neighboring Commons hereinafter mentioned shall respectively be a United Common, under the following names, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF ELTHAM AND GLENGLOY shall comprise the Eltham Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, and the Glengloy Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the sixteenth day of September, 1861, and shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons.—(62.E.11798.)

THE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD FIELD COMMON OF MALDON shall comprise the Maldon Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, and the Maldon Gold Field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the third day of June, 1861, and shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons.—(63.G.11.)

THE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD FIELD COMMON OF MARYBOROUGH shall comprise as well the commons referred to in the Proclamation thereof bearing date the twenty-seventh day of October, 1862, and the addition thereto described in another Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of November, 1862, as the Adelaide, Waterloo, Lukerman, and Blacksmith's Leads Gold Field Common, also described in the lastmentioned Proclamation, and shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on each or any of the said commons.—(62.E.11722.)

TOLLS ON ROADS WITHIN THE NEWSTEAD ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the rates of tolls to be collected by any district road board, as thereinafter mentioned: And whereas the Newstead District Road Board deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls within their district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and proclaim that the Newstead District Road Board are hereby authorised to collect tolls for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through or by any toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses, now or hereafter erected and built by the said board in or upon public roads within the said Newstead Road District, at rates not exceeding the rates hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

No. 10.—JANUARY 27, 1863.—5.

In addition to the above, the council have accepted tenders for the execution of the following works, all of which are in active progress, viz.—Completion of the formation, &c., of Montague, Coventry, and Dorcas streets; metalling Napier street; forming, metalling, kerbing, and channelling the Eastern road; channelling portion of Cecil street; supply of rubble for metalling the Eastern road and continuation of Moray street. The council regret that want of funds prevents the execution of many important works, amongst which may be mentioned the construction of the proposed large drain on the eastern side of the district. Mr. John Williams having, in consequence of absence, forfeited his seat in the council, an election took place in November to supply the vacancy, and resulted in the return of Mr. William G. Sprigg. During the half-year, a bye-law has been passed for the establishment of a toll on the Yarra Bank road, and when in operation arrangements will be made for the Sandridge road and this toll to free each other. The council have also passed, and forwarded for the Governor's assent, a bye-law for reducing the rate of tolls leviable on the Three-chain road. The council anticipate an early settlement of the matters in dispute with the railway company, either by arrangement, or the passing of the bill now before Parliament.
