WHEREAS by The Land Act, 1862, it is amongst other
things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or
within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of
any town not contained in any municipal district, or within
any agricultural a rea of which at less one-lourth part has been
selected, the Gover nor in Council n.ay proclaim such land to be
a municipal com mon, or a gold fields common, or a town
common, or a farn 1875 common respectively, as the case may be;

and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act. Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, alter, and abolish the commons as hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

ELSTERNWICK TOWN COMMON shall be and comprise the land hereafter described, viz.:—One hundred acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the town boundary of Elsternwick, as shown on a plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(60.B.8675.)

EMERALD HILL MUNICIPAL COMMON.—The common described in a Prochanation bearing date the fifth day of August, 1862, as the municipal common for all householders in the municipal district of Emerald Hill, is hereby abolished; and the area hereafter described shall be and constitute the Municipal Common for Emerald Hill, viz.:—Nine hundred acres, more or less, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries of the municipal district of Emerald Hill, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Oflice, Melbourne.—(62.F.7596.)

#### PROCLAMATION.

Whereas His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to delegate under the Deseased Cattle Act, 1861, to the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, the several powers rested in the Governor by the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 7th, and 10th sections of the said Act, subject to the regulations contained in the Order in Council of 1st October, 1861: And whereas by a Proclamation given under my hand, dated 26th December, 1862; it was declared that the inspector under the said Act would not be authorised to grant certificates to land in the Province of Southland, cattle coming from any of the Australian colonies: And whereas it is expedient to make further provision in that behalf: Now therefore I, the said Superintendent, in virtue of the powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare that the inspectors of cattle in the Province of Southland, under the said ordinance, are hereby authorised to grant certificates to land in this Province cattle shipped in the colonies of Queensland, South Australia, and Western Australia, and at the ports of Newcastle and Twofold Bay, in the colony of New South Wales, provided that the same are free from disease: and provided moreover, that the master of the vessel, on board of which such cattle shall have been imported, shall deliver to such inspector a certificate from the collector of customs, or, if there be no collector of customs, from the police magistrate, or from two justices of the peace, at the port or place where such cattle were shipped, to the effect that the district wherein such port or place is situate was, to the best of his or their belief and knowledge, free from infectious disease in cattle at the time of shipment, and that the cattle shipped were free from any such disease; and in case the master of any such vessel shall be unable to produce any such certificate, the said inspector of cattle shall not grant a certificate to land the cattle on board such vessel until the m
