## THE MARYBOROUGH DISTRICT COURT OF MINES TO BE HOLDEN AT ST. ARNAUD.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the fifth day of October, 1863.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is enacted that within and for every mining district there shall be a court to be called "The Court of Mines," and such court shall be holden at such intervals and at such places within such district as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the Court of Mines for the Mining District of Maryborough shall be holden within the interval and at the place hereinafter mentioned, in addition to the places already appointed, that is to say:—

At St. Arnaud, within the said district, once at least in every three calendar months.

And the Honorable Archibald Michie, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farm lands common respectively, as the case may be;

and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, alter, and abolish the commons as hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

ELSTERNWICK TOWN COMMON shall be and comprise the land hereafter described, viz.:—One hundred acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the town boundary of Elsternwick, as shown on a plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(60.B.8675.)

EMERALD HILL MUNICIPAL COMMON.—The common described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifth day of August, 1862, as the municipal common for all householders in the municipal district of Emerald Hill, is hereby abolished; and the area hereafter described shall be and constitute the Municipal Common for Emerald Hill, viz.:—Nine hundred acres, more or less, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries of the municipal district of Emerald Hill, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(62.F.7596.)

KINGOWER GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The description of the said Common (comprised, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of August, 1863, page 1823, of the *Government Gazette*) is hereby corrected by substituting the words "west two hundred and sixty," in lieu of the words "east two hundred and sixty" which occur in the thirteenth line of the said description.—(63.H.9006.)

MORRISON'S GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The common described under the designation of Morrison's Diggings Gold Field Common, in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the tenth day of June and the twenty-sixth day of August, 1861, is hereby abolished; and the area hereafter described shall be and constitute Morrison's Gold Field Common, viz.:—Morrison's Diggings, county of Grant, parishes of Borneyhughurk and Ballark, Four thousand two hundred and thirty-two acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the following described area: Commencing at the junction of Stony Creek with the Moorarbool River; thence by Stony Creek westerly to a point about twelve chains easterly of the north-west angle of Morrison's pre-emptive right on the Moorarbool River; thence by a straight line bearing about N. 32° W. two hundred and sixty chains, more or less; thence by a straight line bearing about N. 72° E. one hundred and sixty-eight chains, more or less, to the Moorarbool River; and by that river southerly to the point of commencement. Also allotments 28, 29, 30, 31, and 32, and the portion of land lying between allotment 29 and the Moorarbool River, in the parish of Ballark. As shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.G.8350.)

NORTH AND SOUTH WOORAGEE FARMERS' COMMON (described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the twentieth day of July, 1863) is hereby increased by adding thereto the area hereafter described, viz.:—Two thousand five hundred acres, more or less, Murray district, county unnamed: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 3, section H, North Wooragee; thence by a straight line southerly to the north-east angle of allotment 4, section H, South Wooragee, about two hundred and sixty chains, more or less; thence by the present common north-easterly and north-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 1, section G, North Wooragee; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotment 1 of section G, and allotment 2, section H, both in the parish of North Wooragee, to the point of commencement; deducting from above-described area all sold or legally appropriated land. Total area of common, inclusive of the area proclaimed on 31st July, 1863, Six thousand nine hundred acres, as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.G.8894.)

SANDRIDGE MUNICIPAL COMMON.—The common described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifth day of August, 1862, as the municipal common for all householders in the municipal district of Sandridge, is hereby abolished; and the area hereafter described shall be and constitute the Municipal Common of Sandridge, viz.:—Two thousand one hundred acres, more or less, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries of the municipal district of Sandridge, as described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July, 1863, and as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.H.8161.)

**PROCLAMATION.**

By JAMES A. R. MENZIES, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Southland.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to delegate under the *Diseased Cattle Act, 1861*, to the Superintendent of Southland, the several powers vested in the Governor by the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 10th sections of the said Act, subject to the regulations contained in the Order in Council of 1st October, 1861: And whereas by a Proclamation given under my hand, dated 26th December, 1862, it was declared that the inspector under the said Act would not be authorised to grant certificates to land in the Province of Southland, cattle coming from any of the Australian colonies: And whereas it is expedient to make further provision in that behalf: Now therefore I, the said Superintendent, in virtue of the powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare that the inspectors of cattle in the Province of Southland, under the said ordinance, are hereby authorised to grant certificates to land in this Province cattle shipped in the colonies of Queensland, South Australia, and Western Australia, and at the ports of Newcastle and Twofold Bay, in the colony of New South Wales, provided that the same are free from disease: and provided moreover, that the master of the vessel, on board of which such cattle shall have been imported, shall deliver to such inspector a certificate from the collector of customs, or, if there be no collector of customs, from the police magistrate, or from two justices of the peace, at the port or place where such cattle were shipped, to the effect that the district wherein such port or place is situate was, to the best of his or their belief and knowledge, free from infectious disease in cattle at the time of shipment, and that the cattle shipped were free from any such disease; and in case the master of any such vessel shall be unable to produce any such certificate, the said inspector of cattle shall not grant a certificate to land the cattle on board such vessel until the master shall have made a declaration in the usual statutory form before a resident magistrate or justice of the peace to the effect that such cattle were shipped at a port in a district free from such infectious disease aforesaid, and that such cattle are to the best of his knowledge and belief free from such infectious disease.
