GRANT IN AID TO PUBLIC WORSHIP.

In pursuance of the provisions of the Imperial Act, 18 and 19 Victoria, cap. 55, § 53, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 6th day of October, 1863, rescinded No. 12 of the Regulations for the distribution of the grant in aid of Public Worship, bearing date the 12th of January, 1861, which determines the minimum amounts of private subscriptions to be raised before any grants in aid of the erection of Churches and Ministers' dwellings respectively can be claimed; and has made the following Regulation in lieu thereof, viz.:

12. No application for aid towards the erection of a church or chapel can be entertained until One hundred and fifty pounds at least shall have been raised by private contributions and actually paid over to the trustees; and in like manner Fifty pounds at least must have been raised and paid over in the case of an application being made for aid towards the erection of a minister's dwelling.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected as thereinbefore mentioned, the Governor in council may proclaim any unselected portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected, to be a temporary common for the use of the selectors: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, proclaim the unselected lands herein-after mentioned to be a Temporary Common in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, viz.:

EURAMBEEN TEMPORARY COMMON for selectors in the agricultural Area of Strath Service.—Two thousand seven hundred and thirteen acres, more or less, county of Ripon, parish of Eurambeen, being allotments 6, 7, 8, 9, and 12, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.H.7953.)

BRIGHT PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY ESTABLISHED AT BRIGHT.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.

2. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees in Bright, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. the previous day.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the funeral.

5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st of September to 30th of April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.

6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the cost and charges.

7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A.

8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them. And in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a copy of every proposed epitaph, must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper order and repair, must be removed by the order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.

13. A plan of the cemetery will be kept, together with a registry, and may be inspected at the office of the trustees.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. Any person wantonly or willfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to, any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.

16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery, when fenced.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

BYE-LAWS FOR THE REGULATION OF THE BEAUFORT, RAGLAN, AND CHARLTON GOLD FIELDS' COMMON.

THE bye-laws for the regulation of the above common, made and dated "the 13th October, 1862," and "the 29th October, 1862," respectively, are hereby repealed.

2. In the following bye-laws, the word cattle shall mean and include horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, mules, cows, oxen, heifers, steers, calves, goats, or pigs, and shall apply to any one or more animal or animals of the said several kinds.

4. All fees must be paid quarterly in advance; quarters to commence on the 1st August, 1st November, 1st February, and 1st May; and unless paid within one month from the above dates the cattle or sheep will be dealt with as trespassers.

5. The managers shall grant special licenses to "butchers," "dairymen," and others depasturing more than four head of cattle or sheep upon the payment of one shilling upon the issue of each license, in addition to the fees charged according to the above scale.

6. Widows with helpless families, upon application to the managers, may be permitted to depasture their cattle without payment of fees; and no fees will be charged for calves under twelve months old or pigs under six months old.

7. All persons depasturing cattle or sheep on the above common, for slaughtering purposes, must give notice to the herdsman six hours before turning his, her, or their cattle or sheep upon the common, and on receipt of such notice the herdsman shall proceed to inspect such cattle or sheep, shall take a correct account of the number of said cattle or sheep, and shall, provided always that such cattle or sheep be free from disease, and intended for slaughtering purposes only, give a permit to the owner or owners of said sheep or cattle to depasture them on the common; such permit or permits must be produced at the first meeting of the managers held in each quarter respectively, and the fees on the average of the number of sheep or cattle so permitted during the quarter paid.

8. No bulls or entire horses will be permitted on the common without the consent of the managers, and calves not the progeny of registered stock will not be permitted.

9. Notice must be given to the secretary of the removal of any registered cattle, except cattle intended for slaughtering purposes, from the common; and the owner or owners are hereby made liable to the payment of fees for all cattle once registered until such notice as is herein and above required be given to the secretary.
