DRILL INSTRUCTION OF MEMBERS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

It is the desire of the Government that the greatest facilities shall be afforded for the attendance on parade of members of the Civil Service who are Volunteers, consistently with the due performance of their other public duties.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE VOLUNTEER FORCE.
CAVALRY.
Definition of an effective mounted volunteer, to take effect on

Definition of an effective mounted volunteer, to take effect on 1st January, 1864:—

Any enrolled volunteer who has, during the preceding year, attended exercise underarms twenty-four times, twelve of which shall have been mounted parades, the remaining twelve to be either mounted or dismounted, and has been present at, and has passed one official inspection, of which there shall be three in the course of each year.

After the 1st of January, 1864, no mounted parades will count towards classification at which less than fifteen members were present, and no other parades or drills will count at which less than 10 members were present.

The services of no troop of cavalry shall be retained unless it be composed of at least twenty effective members. Any members in excess of this number are to be considered as supernumerary.

On the 1st of January in each year, the commanding officer of each troop will be credited with the sum of 27 for each effective member of his troop, beyond which no assistance will given by Government.

Fines.

Every volunteer who fails to attend muster for parades twice in each month shall pay 2s. 6d. fine to his troop; every corporal or sergeant 5s.; every commissioned officer 10s.—unless on leave of absence or medical certificate.

Any volunteer who shall not, during the times of training and exercise, conduct himself in an orderly manner, or shall not obey the command of his superior officer, may be placed in the custody of members of the volunteer force for the period of such training or exercise.

Courts of enquiry shall be held in conformity with the regulations in force in Her Majesty's service.

ENGINEERS.

The regulations approved of by His Excellency the Governor in Council, for naval, artillery, and rifle corps, shall apply to engineer corps, with the following alterations:

1. That in the definition of an effective, in addition to other qualifications, it shall be necessary that each volunteer engineer shall have been educated as an architect, surveyor, civil, mechanical, or mining engineer, or as an assistant to one or other of them, or that he shall be a skilled mechanic.

2. That the minimum number of effectives for the formation of the corps shall be 35, in lieu of 50.

3. That the minimum number of effectives, to enable the corps to be kept up, shall be 50 in lieu of 75.

4. That the number to constitute a parade shall be 30 in lieu of 40, but in 1863, 25 in lieu of 30, and for company drill 15 in lieu of 20.

5. That the allowance to each effective volunteer for drill instruction shall be £3 in lieu of 30s. if the corps be under 60 in number, the allowance to be decreased pro rata as the corps increases in number.
