NOTICE TO MANAGERS OF COMMONS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the 73rd clause of *The Land Act, 1862*, the Board of Land and Works hereby order and direct that all accounts of Managers of Towns' Commons and Farmers' Commons, of receipts and disbursements of funds derived from commons during the year or period ending 18th June, 1863, shall be rendered to and audited by the Receiver and Paymaster or Land Officer whose office is nearest to the commons in respect to which such audit is required to be made; and all such accounts, when audited in the form prescribed by the Board of Land and Works, shall be published by the managers of commons, in the *Government Gazette*, or some newspaper circulating in the district in which such commons are situated.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS STORE REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the Supply of Stores, &c., to the Department of Victorian Railways.

THE Railway Department, as also the Government Storekeeper, shall be exempt from the Store and Transport Regulations in respect of all supplies for Victorian Railways, the purchase of which shall, as hereinafter specified, be under his control; and in all matters relating thereto he shall be directly responsible to the Commissioner of Railways, and to the Secretary acting under the authority of the Commissioner.

2. The Tender Board, as now constituted, shall open and consider all tenders for supplies, and enter into contracts for the same, in accordance with these regulations.

3. The Railway Storekeeper shall cause lists to be printed (Form A), showing a classified schedule and correct description, by reference to samples or otherwise, of the several articles of probable requirement, and also of the quantities at which the contract rates are to be tendered for per ton, per gross, &c., with blank columns for the insertion of the rates, and minimum quantity to be contracted for of each article.

4. Copies of this list will be furnished as required to the Locomotive and Traffic Superintendents, and they shall, at least once in each year, and not later than 1st May, return a copy to the Railway Storekeeper, filled up with an estimate of the probable quantity of each article required for the year commencing on the 1st January following.

5. It will be the duty of the Railway Storekeeper to revise these lists as to quantities, referring, where necessary, to the Engineer-in-Chief and Traffic Superintendent, and these lists, as revised, approved by the Secretary, together with the necessary samples, will be given to the Government Storekeeper not later than 15th May in each year. All contracts to be entered into by the Government Storekeeper for railway supplies, whether for a year or for any portion thereof, or for unforeseen requirements during the year, shall be upon the authority of such schedules, which shall supersede for such purposes the form of requisition at present used, and constitute a portion of the contract.

6. Contracts for railway supplies shall be made separately from those under the Store and Transport Regulations for the general service, and the Government Storekeeper shall require the contractor to make deliveries direct to the Railway Storekeeper, and to provide that the contract rates include cost of carriage to the place of delivery specified on the schedule.

7. Where samples are necessary and cannot otherwise be procured, the Railway Storekeeper shall have power to purchase the same upon an authorised order in the manner hereinafter directed.

8. The purchase of stores shall be made by the Government Storekeeper only upon the authority of, and in accordance with, an order for the same (Form B), which shall have been previously approved by the Secretary. These orders shall be upon printed forms to be taken from an order book to be kept by the Railway Storekeeper, and shall supersede for that purpose the requisition forms at present used.

9. The Government Storekeeper shall require the merchant to furnish to the Railway Storekeeper, with each delivery of stores, a complete bill of parcels; and in no case shall the Railway Storekeeper give receipts for goods, either as to quantity or

value, until the said bills of parcels are furnished. As a general rule, the Government Storekeeper will require the merchant to make one delivery of the quantity ordered, and not allow repeated and protracted deliveries of small quantities under one order.

10. Claims by the merchant for payment of goods sold and delivered under these regulations shall be made out upon the usual Form 4, 2. The words "Victorian Railways, Stores, Plant, and Material," being substituted for the word "Contingencies," as shown in Form C. This claim will be rendered to and examined and certified by the Government Storekeeper, who will forward the same, through the Railway Storekeeper, to the Accountant. This can be done as soon after delivery and approval of the goods as the merchant may desire.

11. The Railway Storekeeper will issue stores upon the delivery order of such officers only as shall be duly authorised by the Commissioner of Railways, and no articles are to be applied for by such orders unless wanted for immediate use, or required to be available on the lines in case of accident.

12. Unforeseen requirements arising during the year for articles not provided for by any contract schedule, shall be specified by the Locomotive or Traffic Superintendents on schedule (Form A), and dealt with in the manner hereinbefore provided for the contracts for yearly supplies.

13. If it should appear to the Railway Storekeeper that schedules (Form A) are filled up for quantities greater than the nature of the service may seem to demand, or for articles which closely resemble those in stock, or which, from any causes, may not appear to be necessarily required, he will forward such schedules to the Engineer-in-Chief or Traffic Superintendent, with a memorandum stating the facts and requesting instructions.

14. The rates of articles issued by the Railway Storekeeper shall be accepted by those to whom stores are delivered by him, as the basis of their returns of consumption; and the Railway Storekeeper shall forward weekly to each officer an account of stores delivered to him, and debit him with the amount.

15. Each officer to whom stores are issued under these regulations shall give a receipt for the same at once to the Railway Storekeeper.

16. The Railway Storekeeper shall prepare, yearly, or as often as the Secretary may direct, an inventory of stores unserviceable or not required, and forward the same to the Commissioner of Railways, who will appoint a board to survey and report upon the stores, with a view to their disposal.

17. Stock shall be taken at 30th June and 31st December in each year, and all officers to whom stores are issued shall make returns of stock in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and forward the same to the Railway Storekeeper.

18. The stock taken at 30th June in each year shall show the value of each item, as ascertained from the books merely, without actual weight and tale of the several items, unless the same should be required by the Railway Storekeeper.

19. The stock taken at 31st December in each year shall be ascertained by actual weight and tale thereof, and the return shall show the value and total stock of each item on hand.

20. The rates of imported plant and material, as stated in the Railway Storekeeper's return of stock and general issue, shall be furnished by the Railway Accountant; but the rates of stores in such returns shall be stated at the actual cost price, as shown by accounts for the purchase of the same entered in the store books.

21. With a view to simplify the records of stock and the details of general issue, the Railway Storekeeper may, as often as he finds necessary, average the several prices of any single item to one uniform rate; provided only that this rate, when computed on the total stock of that item, correctly represents the actual cost of it, and that every such average be reported to the Secretary.

22. A return (Form D) shall be forwarded by the Railway Storekeeper to the Accountant, showing the accounts passed by him monthly, half-yearly, and yearly.

23. A summary of the plant and material imported (Form E) shall be made by the Railway Storekeeper half-yearly, at 30th June and 31st December in each year, and forwarded to the Accountant.

24. There shall be furnished to the Railway Storekeeper, by each receiver of stores, monthly or half-yearly as may hereafter be directed, a summary (Form F) of the gross value of stores received or in stock, the uses to which they have been applied, and the balance of stock on hand. This summary shall be certified by the officer making the return.

25. A summary of the Railway Storekeeper's stock and general issue (Form G) shall be forwarded by him half-yearly to the accountant.

26. Supplies of water and gas, though not actually in charge of the Railway Storekeeper, must be assumed to be under his control and issued by him, as it will be his duty, under these regulations, to check these supplies and debit the cost of the same to the officer responsible for their consumption, who will include this cost in their returns, in accordance with rule 24, Form F.

27. No articles whatever are to be lent, sold, or exchanged, except under competent authority in writing.

28. These regulations shall apply to, and the Railway Storekeeper shall be held responsible for, only such stores, plant, and material as are actually delivered into his custody or are certified by him in Form C as under his charge.

29. The Railway Storekeeper shall exercise a strict supervision over all stock and returns, by verifying the same, obtaining explanations of apparent discrepancies or errors, and reporting generally to the Secretary upon any irregularities, defects, or omissions in the working of these regulations.

30. The Railway Storekeeper shall, in all matters pertaining to his duties, and subject to these regulations, be held directly responsible to the Secretary of Victorian Railways, from whom he will receive such instructions as may from time to time appear necessary.

GRANT FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

 BY-LAWS MADE BY THE PENTRIDGE ORIGINAL DISTRICT ROAD BOARD, TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS THEREOF.

1. THAT the regular meetings of this board shall be held at the office of the board every alternate Monday, at Seven o'clock p.m., and that the business shall commence as soon as the legal quorum is present; but should such quorum not be present at the expiration of an hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the names of members present, in the minute book, and such meeting shall accordingly be adjourned as per clause 133. Clerk shall give notices of such adjournment to members.

2. The board may hold special meetings, and any three or more members may require a special meeting to be held; but no such meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given, as per clause 139 of *The Local Government Act*.

3. That the first business at all meetings of this board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting for confirmation, and that no discussion shall be allowed thereupon except as to their accuracy. The reading of correspondence, presentation of petitions, and bringing up of reports, shall have precedence of the regular business at all meetings.

4. On the presentation of any petition, the same shall lie on the table until the next meeting of the board previous to the same being discussed.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under the notice of the members.

6. Notices of motion (excepting as appears by rule 8) shall be given in writing to the clerk of the board one board night previous to the meeting of the same, and such notices shall be considered in the order in which they are given.

7. No notice of motion shall be proceeded with unless the member giving notice, or some member authorised by him, be present when the business is called on; and any notice of motion not disposed of shall stand over until next night of meeting.

8. Motions involving the expenditure of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling may be acted upon immediately on the same being brought forward, as also orders for the payment of any salaries.

9. That no payment whatever of any amount be made unless the same be authorised and passed by the board.

10. Any member speaking on any subject shall address the chairman standing; and no member while speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall immediately sit down; the member raising the point of order shall then be heard in preference to any other, when such point of order shall be decided by the chairman previous to the subject under discussion or any other matter being resumed.

11. Every motion or amendment shall be in writing, and be signed by the mover, and no motion or amendment shall be withdrawn unless by consent of the board.

12. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment, shall be held to have spoken thereon; and no member shall be permitted to speak more than once on any question, except by way of explanation or in reply to any original motion or amendment of which he is the mover; and after such reply, the amendment or original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

13. The chairman shall call to order any member digressing from the question under discussion, or imputing improper motives to others, and any member so called to order shall immediately sit down.

14. Any member making use of any expression which may be applied offensively to any other member shall, when required by the chairman, withdraw such expression and apologise to the board; and any member refusing or neglecting so to do shall not be allowed to take part in any business, or vote on any question, until he make the required apology.

15. The board shall vote by show of hands.
16. No resolution previously passed by the board shall be revoked or altered, except in strict accordance with clause 186 of *The Local Government Act*.

OFFICERS.

17. The officers of the board shall consist of a treasurer, clerk, surveyor, two valuers, and a collector, who shall enter into an agreement with the board for the faithful discharge of the several duties appertaining to their office; and should such officers at any time during the period of their agreement neglect or fail to perform any or either of their various duties whereby the board may sustain any loss or damage, they shall for every such neglect forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five pounds sterling, on the board passing a resolution to that effect at a special meeting called for that purpose.

22. Before any contract to the amount of One hundred pounds or upwards shall be entered into by the board, five days' notice, at the least, shall be given in one of the newspapers circulated in the district, in accordance with clause 149 of *The Local Government Act*.

23. Two committees shall be formed by this board, viz.: "Public Works Committee" and "Finance Committee," to consist of three members each. The duties of the Finance Committee shall be to examine all accounts and report thereon previous to their being finally considered by the board, and the clerk shall attend and take minutes of the proceedings of all such committees.

24. All agreements, contracts, orders, receipts, and official communications, shall bear the seal of this board, except as provided by clause 168 of *The Local Government Act*.

25. That these bye-laws shall not be altered or amended, except a meeting be called as per clause 136 of *The Local Government Act*.
