SEAMEN PROHIBITED FROM CARRYING ABOUT THEM, ON SHORE, KNIVES OR OTHER OFFENSIVE WEAPONS.

THE practice of late adopted by seamen, of carrying about their persons, when on shore, sheathed knives, being dangerous to the lives of the inhabitants, and in direct contravention of the Town and Country Police Act (18 Victoria No. 14, sec. 5, part 24), which attaches a penalty of Twenty pounds on every person who may be found carrying any free-arms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or place: Commanders and officers of vessels are requested to warn seamen accordingly, and to use their utmost endeavors to prevent their crews from appearing on shore so armed, and thereby incurring the penalty imposed by the above-recited Act.
