T is hereby notified that applications for Leases of Crown Lands, under the 47th section of The Land Act, 1862 (the number of such leases issuable during 1864 being restricted to one hundred), will be received by the Beard of Land and Works on the 1st January, 1864, and until further notice after that

Applications must be made on the amended form prescribed by the Governor in Council, to be obtained at the District Sur-vey Offices and Land Offices, and at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

Applications forwarded to the Board of Land and Works prior to the 1st January, 1864, for leases issuable during that year, will not be recognised.

The Board of Land and Works also desire it to be understood that in future applications will not be entertained for leases of land, under the above section of the Land Act, for the cultivation of maize, foreign grasses, root crops for stall-feeding cattle, or other crops of a similar nature, but must be restricted to the purposes contemplated by the Act, viz., the establishment in Victoria of bond fide novel industrial enterprises.

SEAMEN PROHIBITED FROM CARRYING ABOUT THEM, ON SHORE, KNIVES OR OTHER OFFENSIVE WEAPONS.

THE practice of late adopted by seamen, of carrying about their persons, when on shore, sheathed knives, being dangerous to the lives of the inhabitants, and in direct contravention of the Town and Country Police Act (18 Victoria No. 14, sec. 5, part 21), which attaches a penalty of Twenty pounds on every person who may be found carrying any fire-arms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or place: Commanders and officers of vessels are requested to warn seamen accordingly, and to use their utmost endeavors to prevent their crews from appearing on shore so armed, and thereby incurring the penalty imposed by the above-recited Act.

LIGHTS AND FOG SIGNALS TO BE CARRIED BY STEAM AND SAILING VESSELS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to revoke, from the 1st November, 1863, the Regulations framed by the Victoria Steam Navigation Board with respect to Lights and Fog Signals to be carried by Steam and Sailing Vessels, dated 11th August, 1855, and to substitute the accompanying regulations therefor from the same date.

REGULATIONS AS TO LIGHTS AND FOG SIGNALS TO BE CARRIED BY STEAM AND SAILING VESSELS.

THE Victoria Steam Navigation Board, by virtue of the power and authority vested in them by the 29th section of the Act 16 Victoria No. 25, and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, have determined from and after the 1st day of November. 1863, to adopt the Rules concerning Lights and Fog Signals published in the Government Gazette on the 28th May, 1863, and herewith annexed: And these Regulations shall be strictly observed on board all steam and sailing vessels coming within the provisions of the said Act.

The Regulations framed by the Board on this subject, and dated 11th August, 1858, are hereby revoked as from and after the 1st day of November, 1863.

PRELIMINARY.

Art 1 In the following rules every steam ship which is under sail and not under steam is to be considered a sailing ship; and every steam ship which is under steam, whether under sail or not, is to be considered a ship under steam.

Art. 2. Lights.—The lights mentioned in the following articles, numbered 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9, and no others, shall be carried in all weathers between sunset and sunrise.

all weathers between sunset and sunrise.

Art. 3. Lights for steam ships.—Seagoing steam ships when under way shall carry:

(a.) At the foremast head, a bright white light, so fixed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the ship, viz., from right alread to 2 points abatf the beam on either side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least five miles:

(b.) On the starboard side, a green light, so constructed as to throw an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abatf the beam on the starboard side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least 2 miles:

(c.) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show

(c.) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the port side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least 2 miles:

miles:

(d.) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens, projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

Art. 4. Lights for steam tugs.—Steam ships, when towing other ships, shall carry two bright mast-head lights vertically, in addition to their side lights, so as to distinguish them from other steam ships. Each of these mast-head lights shall be of the same construction and character as the mast-head lights which other steam ships are required to carry.

Art. b. Lights for sailing ships.—Sailing ships under weigh, or being towed, shall carry the same lights as steam ships under weigh, with the exception of the white mast-head lights, which they shall never carry.

Art. 6. Exceptional lights for small sailing vessels.—Whenever, as in the case of small vessels during bad weather, the green and red lights cannot be fixed, these lights shall be kept on deck, on their respective sides of the vessel, ready for instant exhibition; and shall, on the approach of or to other vessels, be exhibited on their respective sides in sufficient time to prevent collision, in such manner as to make them most visible, and so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side.

To make the use of these portable lights more certain and easy, they shall each be painted outside with the color of the light they respectively contain, and shall be provided with suitable screens.

Art. 7. Lights for ships at anchor. — Ships, whether steam ships or sailing ships, when at anchor in roadsteads or fairways, shall, between sunest and sunrise, exhibit, where it can best be seen, but at a height not exceeding twenty feet above the hull, a white light, in a globular lanter of eight inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon, and at a distance of at least one mile.

Art. 8. Lights for pilot vessels.—Sailing pilot vessels shall not

Art. 8. Lights for pilot vessels.—Sailing pilot vessels shall not carry the lights required for other sailing vessels, but shall carry a white light at the mast-head, visible all round the horizon, and shall also exhibit a flare-up light every fifteen

norizon, and shall also exhibit a nate-top light city, minutes.

Art. 9. Lights for fishing vessels and boats.—Open fishing boats and other open boats shall not be required to carry the side lights required for other vessels, but shall, if they do not carry such lights, carry a lantern having a green slide on the one side and a red slide on the other side; and on the approach of or to other vessels, such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side. Fishing vessels and open boats when at anchor, or attached to their nets and stationary, shall exhibit a bright white light. Fishing vessels and open boats shall, however, not be prevented from using a flare-up in addition, if considered expedient.

BULES CONCERNING FOG SIGNALS.

Art. 10. Fog signals.—Whenever there is a log, whether by day or night, the fog signals described below shall be carried and used, and shall be sounded at least every five minutes, viz.:—

(a.) Steam ships under weigh shall use a steam whistle placed before the funnel, not less than eight feet from the deck:

(b.) Sailing ships under weigh shall use a fog horn:

(c.) Steam ships and sailing ships when not under weigh shall use a bell.

NOTICE TO SHIPOWNERS AND MASTERS.

FREQUENT complaints having been made of vessels not exhibiting their side lights when under weigh, whereby collisions have been with difficulty avoided, shipowners and masters are again cautioned against any infringement of the Regulations on this subject, and their attention is invited to the above regulations, which are published for general information.

The deaths during the month were fewer than those in the same month of either of the three previous years; they also numbered 19 less than those in the month of August. The deaths of males and females which occurred during the month were in the respective portions of 57 and 43 per cent.; those of children under five years of age (71) were doubled by those of persons above that age (143). For the last three months there has been an excess of deaths at the younger period of life, but in no case has it been so great as in the month under review.

The greatest mortality in any one day was 13 on the 29th, no more than 2 deaths were recorded on the 18th, and only 3 on the 1st and 11th.

Only 1 death was recorded of a person at a more advanced ago than 75 years, viz., that of a male aged 76, who died of brain disease.

The violent deaths which took place during the month numbered 15, of which 10 were from drowning, viz.:—A male aged 50 in the Kororoit Creek, another aged 22 at Footscray, a fireman aged 30 and a cooper aged 46 in the Yarra, a carter aged 27 in a waterhole at Brunswick, two boys aged 8 and 11 in the Yarra Swamp, a boy aged 5\fraction years at the Queen's Wharf, a boy aged 17 months in a tank at Footscray, and a girl aged 1\fraction years at Caulfield. A chemist aged 60 was killed by the wheel of a dray passing over him, a laborer aged 30 died of a fractured skull, a child aged 3\fraction years of a scald in the stomach, a male aged 47 hanged himself in the Pentridge Stockade, and a female aged 70 cut her throat at North Melbourne.

The deaths which occurred in public institutions numbered 50, or nearly 24 per cent. of the whole, and occurred as follow:—Melbourne Hospital, 26; Benevolent Asylum, 7; Immigrants' Home, 5; Immigrants' Hospital, 1; Lying-in Hospital, 1; Melbourne Gaol, 3; Military Barracks, 1; Richmond Police Depôt, 1; Yarra Bend Asylum, 5.
