SEAMEN PROHIBITED FROM CARRYING ABOUT THEM, ON SHORE, KNIVES OR OTHER OFFENSIVE WEAPONS.

THE practice of late adopted by seamen of carrying about their persons, when on shore, sheathed knives, being dangerous to the lives of the inhabitants, and in direct contravention of the Town and Country Police Act (18 Victoria No. 14, sec. 5, part 24), which attaches a penalty of Twenty pounds on every person who may be found carrying any fire-arms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or place: Commanders and officers of vessels are requested to warn seamen accordingly, and to use their utmost endeavors to prevent their crews from appearing on shore so armed, and thereby incurring the penalty imposed by the above-recited Act.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIE CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act. Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, alter, and abolish the commons as hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

CHILTEEN GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The area hereafter de-

CHILTERN GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The area hereafter described shall be and constitute the Gold Field Common of Chiltern, viz.:—Four thousand one hundred acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the following described area: Commencing at the north-east angle of the borough of Chiltern; thence east one hundred and fifty-five chains; thence south one hundred and eighty-seven chains; thence westerly three hundred and fifteen chains twenty-five links; thence north to the south-west angle of the borough of Chiltern; thence east by the south boundary thereof one hundred and sixty chains; thence north one hundred and twelve chains fifty links to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Oflice, Melbourne.—(63.H.6552.)
