SITES FOR COMMON SCHOOLS.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of forming meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman might think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of notice of motion. No such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board, unless notice thereof shall have been given to the clerk in writing by the member bringing it forward at the meeting previous to that in which the same shall be taken into consideration: motions involving expenditure of sums under Ten pounds, and the payment of salaries, alone excepted.

6. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded

No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under discussion and the next on the notice paper shall be discussed before the question of adjournment be again entertained; but if the motion of adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

14. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply as the mover of any motion or amendment, and after such explanation or reply the question shall be put to the vote.
