MELBOURNE AND NORTH MELBOURNE VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations, agreed to by the Members of the Melbourne and North Melbourne Rifle Corps, have been approved by the Governor in Council, in accordance with the 3rd clause of the Act No. 183.

MEETINGS OF THE CORPS.

1. At any meeting of the corps the senior officer present shall take the chair.
2. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members. No such special meeting shall be held to be duly convened unless notice of it shall have been given at a parade of the corps, and it shall have been called by advertisement inserted or circular issued to every member four days previous to the day of meeting.

FINES.

3. Any member appearing on parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accoutrements dirty or unserviceable from neglect, may be fined by the officer in command the sum of 1s.
4. Any member changing his permanent address must give notice of the same to the officer commanding, in writing, within thirty (30) days; and if he fail to do so, shall be fined the sum of half-a-crown (2s. 6d.).
5. All excuses for absence from parade-muster must be in writing, and must be at the orderly room, or other place appointed.

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pointed, before the end of the month in which the absence occurred.

6. A list of all fines imposed in any month shall be signed by the officer commanding, and be posted in the orderly room, or other place appointed, on the first of the following month.

7. All fines must be paid to the sergeants in charge of squads within the month on the first of which they are posted.

8. An account of all fines as incurred and received shall be kept in a book, which shall be open to inspection in the orderly room.

LIABILITIES INCURRED BY THE CORPS FOR MEMBERS.

9. An account shall be kept by the officer commanding between the corps and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with all liabilities incurred by the corps on his behalf, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective.

10. If on the 1st of January in any year a member's debit exceed his credit by (£1) One pound or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference: Provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed (£2) Two pounds, and that the officer commanding may, at his discretion, enforce only one-half of the fine. The amount paid under this rule shall be placed in the book to the credit of the member paying it.

11. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount if more than (10s.) Ten shillings whereby his debit exceeds his credit: Provided that no such fine shall exceed £2, and that the whole or the half may, at the discretion of the officer commanding, be remitted.

REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

THE subjoined Regulation respecting Public Accounts has been approved by the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the amended Audit Act, 22 Victoria No. 86.

THE following Regulation respecting Public Accounts is to be read with and as amending the 29th General Regulation respecting Public Accounts, dated the 1st May, 1859:—

Accounts must be invariably signed opposite the total amount, by the claimant, and in no case by an agent on his behalf, unless such agent is acting under a power of attorney; in which case the account should be prepared in the agent's name, as such attorney, and he must describe himself as attorney for the claimant.

On the first claim for payment being made by such agent, he must exhibit the power under which he acts (or if the power be registered, then a certified copy thereof), to the paymaster, hereinafter more particularly mentioned, and at the audit office.

When payment of an account is thus claimed by an agent acting under a power of attorney, the paymaster will, if he acts upon it, be held responsible for its correctness, and he is to understand that it devolves upon him to ascertain before paying an account to a person claiming under a power of attorney for the person to whom the money is due, that the power (whether registered under 21 Victoria No. 23 or not) under which the name of such person is admitted for the original claimant is sufficient, that it has not been revoked, and that it has been exhibited at the audit office. On the payment being then made the paymaster will endorse on the account, "power of attorney exhibited."

As in these cases it will be necessary, immediately prior to payment, for the paymaster to ascertain by reference to the Registrar General whether the power of attorney under which a claim is made has been revoked, as allowed by Act 21 Victoria No. 23, no account payable to an agent acting under a power of attorney is to be passed for payment or to be paid at any other pay office than the Treasury Pay Office in Melbourne.

Accounts forwarded to the country pay offices, which may be claimed by persons acting under power of attorney executed subsequently to the passing or transmission of the account for payment, are to be immediately returned (under cover of a letter) to the Treasurer, accompanied by the paymaster's cheque for the amount for payment in Melbourne.

Receivers and paymasters and officers certifying accounts are informed that a power of attorney executed for a valuable consideration may not be revoked except with the consent of the attorney.

SITES FOR COMMON SCHOOLS.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 8th section of *The Land Act, 1882*, that it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve from sale the lands hereinafter described, for the purposes of Common Schools, at the under-mentioned places, and that deeds of grant thereof will be issued to the Board of Education appointed under the Act No. 149, viz.:-

ALBERTON—Two acres, county unnamed, parish of Alberton, allotments 14, 15, 16, and 17 of section 6: Bounded on the north by Thomson street, bearing N. 68° E. four chains; on the east by allotment 13, bearing S. 22° E. five chains; on the south by allotments 5, 4, 3, and 2, bearing S. 63° W. four chains; and on the west by allotments 19 and 18, bearing N. 82° W. five chains.
