THE SHIRE OF BALLARAT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district. And whereas the area of the district hereinafter named, and the amount of the last general rate therein, exceed the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Ballarat Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF BALLARAT.

UNITED COMMON INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby change the designation of, and increase the United Common hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD FIELD COMMON OF AMHERST (described in two several Proclamations bearing date the seventeenth day of October and the thirteenth day of November, 1862) shall be designated the United Borough and Gold Field Common of Amherst, and is hereby increased by adding

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thereto two allotments of the original survey at Amherst, viz.: allotments 7 and 8 of section 5: Commencing at the south-east angle of original allotment 7; bounded on the south by a line bearing west eighty chains; on the west by a line bearing north thirty-nine chains; on the north by a line bearing east eighty chains; and on the east by a line bearing south thirty-nine chains to the point of commencement; deducting from above-described extension all sold or otherwise legally appropriated land, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.H.10791.)

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND AT SANDHURST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 16th day of November, 1863, under the authority conferred by the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32, authorized the holders of miners' rights to prosecute mining operations on the Crown lands within the boundaries of the storm-water channel reserve at Sandhurst (previously exempted from mining operations by an Order of 13th July, 1863, page 1605, &c., *ante*), on the following conditions, *viz.* :—

1. The miners shall remove gravel, soil, and debris from the bed of the channel, but they shall not sink shafts or make excavations or undermine the banks or sides of the said channel.

2. The miners shall not construct any dams or earthworks which would obstruct the flow of the water, and the course of the channel shall be kept clear at all times.

3. The spoil, debris, and tailings, taken out of the channel, shall be deposited in such places and in such manner as shall be directed by the officer authorized by the Minister of Mines to superintend such channel.

4. Before any application for any claim shall be entertained, the applicants for the same shall deposit with the officer authorized as aforesaid the sum of Fifteen pounds; and if there be any portion of the channel remaining within which mining could be permitted without damage to the works, he shall set out such area and allot the same to the said applicants in the order of priority of the applications; and if such claim be allotted, the said deposit shall be retained by such officer so long as the claim is worked and held; and if any damage be done to the works by the claimholder, the said officer shall cause such damage to be repaired, and the costs thereof to be defrayed out of the moneys so deposited. If a claim be not allotted, then the moneys shall be returned to the applicants without any deduction.

5. The officer authorized as aforesaid may at any time, by writing under his hand, order any claimholder to discontinue mining operations if in the opinion of the said officer such mining operations are likely to cause damage to the works or to obstruct the flow of water.

6. If any person mining on the said reserve shall violate any of the above conditions, he shall forfeit his claim, and it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine on the said reserve.

7. Every person to whom a claim shall be allotted shall enter into an agreement in which the above conditions shall be set forth, and it shall not be lawful for any person to mine on the said reserve who has not made and signed a contract to abide by the said conditions.

BYE-LAWS TO REGULATE BY STANDING ORDERS THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MORTLAKE DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

AT all meetings of the board, the business shall commence as soon as the legal quorum is present, but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of thirty minutes after the hour appointed for such meeting, such circumstance shall be noted (with the names of the members present) in the minute-book, and such meeting shall lapse.

2. The first business at each meeting of the board shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon except as to the accuracy thereof.

3. At all meetings, the readings of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions,

and the bringing up of reports, shall have precedence of all motions.

4. Any member when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must address the chairman standing, and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order. The member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any business entered upon.

5. No member shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

6. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

7. No motion shall be decided on at any meeting of the board, unless notice thereof shall be given by the member bringing it forward at the preceding meeting.

8. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time; and on the adoption of any amendment, the original motion shall be rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS.

9. The district shall be subdivided as hereinafter described, and, as far as practicable, the moneys collected therein, and a proportionate amount of the grant-in-aid, shall be expended in each subdivision:—

1st. Parishes of Mortlake, Kolara, Toorak, Ligar, Eilyar, and Nerrin-nerrin.

2nd. Parishes of Hexham, Cobra Killuc, Towanway, Woorno, Conewarre, and Ellerslie.

3rd. Parishes of Wooriwyrite, Darlington West, Jellalabad, Terinalum, and Kornong.

PAYMENT OF MONIES.

10. All payments of moneys shall be by cheque, signed by the chairman, one member of the board, and countersigned by the treasurer.

11. Final payments on each contract shall not be made until the certificate of the engineer as to the completeness of the works under that contract, shall have been laid on the table of the board.

MISCELLANEOUS.

12. Any one or more of these bye-laws may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the board.

13. Any question which it may be desirable to ask of any officer of this board shall be put through the chairman.
