MAIN ROADS UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of November, 1863.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application of any district, from time to time to appoint what road or parts of roads shall

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be main roads, and every such appointment on the like application from time to time to revoke; and every such Order in Council shall be published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Boards of certain Road Districts have severally applied for the appointment of the Main Roads hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the Roads hereinafter mentioned to be Main Roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say :—

The Main Road extending from the boundary of the borough of Ballarat to the boundary of the borough of Smythesdale.

The Main Road extending from the boundary of the borough of Creswick, *via* Glengower, Sandon, and Green Gully, to the township of Newstead.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

IMPORTATION OF CATTLE INTO OTAGO.

THE accompanying copy of a Proclamation by His Honor the Superintendent of Otago, removing the restrictions on the importation of cattle into that province from a portion of the county of Mornington, Victoria, is published for general information.

PROCLAMATION

Admitting Cattle into the Province of Otago from a portion of the county of Mornington, in the Colony of Victoria.
By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date hereof, until further notice, that portion of the county of Mornington, in the colony of Victoria, hereinafter described, shall not be deemed an infected district within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Diseased Cattle Act*, 1861: And that I do hereby rescind the Proclamation of the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, bearing date the fifth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, so far as the same relates to the before-mentioned portion of the colony of Victoria, that is to say:—All that area commencing at the mouth of a Creek in Western Port Bay, said creek forming part of the west side of portion 2, parish of Yallock; thence by that creek northerly to the south side of the Koo-we-Rup Swamp; by that side of the swamp and a line north-easterly to a point on the Buncup Creek, seven miles south of the south boundary of the village of Buncup; thence southerly by part of the east boundary of the county of Mornington to Cape Patterson; thence westerly and northerly by the sea coast and the shores of Western Port Bay to the point of commencement, including likewise Phillip and French Islands.

Given, under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago, at Dunedin, this sixth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

BYE-LAWS.—[15th September, 1863.]

AT a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden at the Offices of the Board, Old Treasury, Queen street, in the city of Melbourne, on the 15th day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

32. Bye-law No. 9 is rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—"That the members of the Board of Agriculture shall, at the annual general meeting, elect from amongst themselves, by ballot, an executive committee consisting of thirteen members, who shall be the council of the said board, and whose term of office shall continue for twelve months, or until the next annual general meeting; and should any member of the council (by effluxion of time) cease to be a member of the board, he shall, if re-elected by the same society he has hitherto represented, still continue a member of the council."

33. In the event of a vacancy occurring in the council, by death, retirement, or otherwise, or by any member thereof being

absent from five consecutive meetings (sickness or other satisfactory reasons excepted), then the board shall appoint some member of the board of agriculture to fill such vacancy until the next annual meeting.

34. Bye-law No. 10 is rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—"The chairman of the council shall preside and keep order at every meeting, see that accurate minutes are kept of the proceedings, and sign the minutes of the previous meeting on their being read by the secretary and confirmed."

35. Bye-law No. 13 is rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—"An annual general meeting of the board of agriculture shall be held on the fifteenth day of August in each year (or if that day shall be a Saturday or Sunday or a public holiday) then the meeting shall take place on the next available day, and the same shall be convened by circulars issued by the secretary fourteen clear days previous to such meeting."

36. Bye-law No. 14 is rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—"A special meeting of the board of agriculture shall be convened by the council on its own motion, or on a requisition addressed to the secretary signed by five members of the board; and circulars stating the business proposed to be transacted shall be issued by the secretary seven days previous to any such meeting; and no business other than that of which notice was given shall be transacted unless in accordance with bye-law No. 6."

37. Should a quorum of members fail to attend at any general or special meeting of the council, the members present at either of such meetings shall have power to adjourn the same until such time as shall be advisable so to do.

38. The words after "each member" in bye-law No. 16 are hereby rescinded.

39. The numbers 13 and 14 in bye-law No. 17 are rescinded, and the numbers 35 and 36 inserted in lieu thereof.

40. That no expenditure be authorised and incurred without the concurrence of the council, and that previous to any payments being made, vouchers showing full particulars of all accounts shall be laid before the council by the secretary for approval, and if found correct, payment of the same shall be ordered, such payment being made by cheque if on a bank, signed by the chairman and countersigned by the secretary.

41. Bye-law No. 24 is rescinded.

42. Bye-law No. 25 is rescinded.

4. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly or bi-monthly on the prescribed form, and present the same in a complete state, signed by the officer receiving the supply, to the Government Storekeeper for payment, at the Treasury, or at a district pay office, as the case may be.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the Engineer-in-Chief of Railways, and the decision of the board is to be final.

6. If the delay necessary for obtaining the decision of a board of survey should be detrimental to the public service, the Engineer-in-Chief, or officer in charge at the station, will have the power to reject coal which is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and the contractor must take back the rejected coal and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense charged as in clause 2.

7. BYE-LAWS OF THE COMO ORIGINAL DISTRICT ROAD BOARD,
MADE TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS THEREOF.

THE business of the board shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors, and shall be open to the public, but any two members present may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the board whether the question proposed to be brought forward shall be discussed publicly or otherwise.

2. *Regular meetings.*—The regular meetings of the board shall be held on the first Wednesday of each month, commencing at Eleven o'clock a.m., the business to commence as soon as the legal quorum is present; but should such quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and such meeting shall accordingly be adjourned as per clause CXXXIII, Local Government Act.

3. *Special meetings.*—The board may be summoned at any time by the clerk upon receiving a written requisition from three or more members, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meeting, provided he shall give each member notice thereof in writing four clear days before the meeting, in accordance with clause CXXXIX, Local Government Act.

4. *Confirmation of minutes.*—The first business at each meeting of the board shall be the confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes then confirmed shall be signed by the chairman for the time being.

5. *Order of business.*—After the confirmation of the minutes, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the board, at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect.

1. Reading copies of letters sent.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception of and reading petitions and memorials.
4. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees.

5. Reading and ordering on reports of special committees.

6. *Orders of the day.*—The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any of the board may however bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the clerk by the member bringing it forward, at the meeting previous to that in which the same shall be taken into consideration.

7. *Petitions.*—Every petition addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for the petition being respectfully worded, and on the presentation of the same, no debate shall take place thereon, unless notice shall have been given in the usual manner; and the only question that shall be entertained shall be, that the petition be received; and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. *Proceedings with motions.*—No motion shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or one of the board authorised by him in writing, be present to proceed with the same when called upon.

9. *Motions referred to committees.*—The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall, for the occasion, be a member of such committee.

10. *Resolutions, how rescinded.*—No resolution previously passed by the board shall be revoked or altered except in strict accordance with clause CXXXVI, Local Government Act.

11. *Manuscript motions to be preserved.*—The original manuscript of any motion or amendment that is submitted to the board shall be preserved until the minutes of the meeting at which the same has been disposed of and confirmed in the usual manner.

12. *Points of order.*—1st. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board.—2nd. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and shall state the same without comment or argument.—3rd. No member shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute motives; and personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.—4th. Any member who shall use an expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the board.—5th. That the chairman call to order any one out of order (whether he be a member of the board or a ratepayer), and if the person deemed out of order refuse to sit down and be still, the chairman shall order him by name to leave the room, and if he still persist in his interruptions, the chairman shall order his removal, or give him in charge, and prosecute him as the law directs.

13. *Motions and amendments how proposed.*—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment shall address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall be silent until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair shall proceed with the subject.

14. *Priority in speaking.*—If two or more members shall rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which of them is entitled to priority.

15. *Motions and amendments recorded.*—Every motion and amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the name of the mover and seconder, and on the division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

16. *Amendments.*—One amendment only shall be discussed a one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

17. *Speaking on moving or seconding a motion.*—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member seconding a motion without remark shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

18. *Speaking twice on the same subject.*—No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation or reply upon an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last carried. After the reply, the amendment on the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

19. *Manner of voting.*—All questions before the board relative to contracts, election of officers, and committees, shall be decided by open voting.

20. *Production of documents.*—Any member of the board may of right require the production of any document of the board relating to the question or matter under discussion.

21. *Questions may be superseded.*—A question may be superseded—1st. By the adjournment of the board, on the motion of members, "that the board do now adjourn." 2nd. By the previous question, viz., "That this question be now put," being proposed and negatived.

22. *Contracts.*—All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised, if for an amount of One hundred pounds or upwards, five clear days in a local newspaper appointed by the board.
