POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF
HORSHAM.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Horsham shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application of any district, from time to time to appoint what road or parts of roads shall
