PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIE CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Vic-toria, &c., &c.,

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions, of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any nunicipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such lirst-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the second day of September, 1863, the boundaries of the Woady Yaloak road district were altered and defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add the parishes of Mannibidar, North and South Naringhil, and Wallindie to the said district: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the addition of the said parishes to Woady Yaloak road district aforesaid, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the

whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say :-
