APPLICATIONS FOR REWARDS FOR THE DISCOVERY OF GOLD FIELDS IN VICTORIA.

PERSONS deeming themselves entitled to rewards for the discovery of Gold Fields in the colony of Victoria are requested to make application to the undersigned on or before the 22nd January, 1864, and to furnish the following information:-

1. A description of the locality in which the discovery was made, sufficient to indicate its position and distinguish it from other Gold Fields, together with the approximate distances of the prospector's claim from the nearest gold working at the time of discovery, and from the nearest town.

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2. The nature of the workings, depth and character of sinking, &c.

3. The time at which the discovery was made, giving the exact date if possible.

4. The names in full of the discoverers.

5. The name of the Government Officer (if any) to whom the discovery was reported, and the time at which such report (if any) was made.

Each applicant should furnish, in addition to the above, any documentary evidence which he may consider important.

Unless the above information is placed in the hands of the board on or before the 22nd January, 1864, the claim will not be considered.

Claims for rewards for discoveries made in 1862 cannot be entertained, a previous board having been appointed for their consideration; neither will discoveries be considered for which any reward has been paid by the colony.

THE WOODY YALOOK ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the second day of September, 1863, the boundaries of the Woody Yalook road district were altered and defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add the parishes of Mannibidar, North and South Naringhil, and Wallindue to the said district: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the addition of the said parishes to Woody Yalook road district aforesaid, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the

whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre line of the road from Carngham to Ballarat, due south of the eastern boundary of section VIII. in the parish of Haddon; thence easterly by the centre of the said road from Carngham to Ballarat to a point due north of the eastern boundaries of sections III. and V. in the parish of Cardigan; thence south to and by the eastern boundaries of said sections to the south-east angle of section V. in the said parish; thence south by a line to the north-west angle of J. Winter's pre-emptive right; thence south to its south-west angle; thence west to a point due south of the west boundary of section VIII. of the parish of Cardigan; thence south to the south-west angle of the Buninyong road district; thence by a line due west to the centre of the Little Woody Yaloak Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the said creek to its confluence with the Woody Yaloak Creek; thence further south by the said Woody Yaloak Creek to a point due east of the southern boundary of the parish of South Naringhil; thence west to and by the said boundary of the said parish to the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence northerly by the centre of the Woody Yaloak Creek to the Upper Western road; thence by the Upper Western road north-westerly to the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence north by the said county boundary to a point in centre of the Emu Creek opposite the north-east angle of the said county; thence by a line north-easterly to a point about two miles sixty chains due south of the south-east angle of allotment 5, section XII. of the parish of Haddon; thence north to the commencing point; excepting the borough of Smythesdale.

MORRISON'S GOLD FIELD COMMON INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; that is to say:—

MORRISON'S GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The Gold Field Common, described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of September last, under the designation of Morrison's (approximate area, four thousand two hundred and thirty-two acres), is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the area described, as follows:—Five hundred and thirty-five acres, more or less: Commencing at the junction of the Stony Creek with the Moorabool River; thence by Stony Creek north-westerly to a point about twelve chains easterly of the north-west angle of Morrison's pre-emptive right on the Moorabool River; thence by a straight line bearing about N. 32° W. two hundred and sixty chains, more or less; thence by a straight line bearing about N. 73° E. one hundred and sixty-eight chains, more or less, to the Moorabool River; thence by that river southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 26, parish of Ballark; thence by the south-west side of said allotment south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 23, parish aforesaid; thence east to the north-west angle of allotment 36, parish aforesaid; thence south by the west boundaries of allotments 36, 35, and 34, to the south-east angle of allotment 31, parish aforesaid; thence west to the north-west angle of allotment 33; thence by a road bearing S. 48° E. to the south-west angle of allotment 33 aforesaid; thence east twenty-five chains ninety links to a road; thence by a line bearing S. 11° E. forty-nine chains, more or less, to the Eclipse Creek; by that creek south-westerly to its junction with the Moorabool River; and by that river north-westerly to the point of commencement. Total area approximately, four thousand seven hundred and sixty-seven acres, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(G.S.H. 10814.)
