THE THIRD SESSION OF THE THIRD PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sie Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Constitution Act it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and (subject to the limitation in the said Act contained) such times for holding the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria, and to vary and alter the same respectively as he may think fit: And whereas it is expedient to fix the time for holding the next Session of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now called "The Parliament of Victoria," which stands prorogued to Friday, the eighteenth day of December instant: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament from Friday, the eighteenth day of December instant, to the day hereinafter mentioned; and, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, I do hereby appoint and proclaim that the Third Session of the Third Parliament of Victoria shall commence and be holden, for the despatch of business, on Tuesday, the twenty-sixth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, at Two of the clock in the afternoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament Place, Spring Street, in the City of Melbourne: And the Members of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

RULES OF THE RICHMOND COMPANY V.V.R.F.

1. The senior officer present at any meeting under these rules shall be the chairman.

2. The commanding officer shall call a meeting upon requisi-tion, in writing, of not less than twelve members; notice of such meeting to be given on parade, and also posted in the orderly room, at least seven days prior to such meeting being held.

As A debit and credit account shall be opened with every member, wherein all monies paid on his behalf and fines incurred by him shall be debited to him, and all monies received on his account or from him shall be credited.

4. If on the first of January in each year the debit exceed the credit by more than Ten shillings, such amount, not exceeding the sum of Two pounds, shall be considered as a fine due to the corps, and posted as provided in rule 6.

5. It shall, however, be in the discretion of the officer commanding to withhold the enforcement of any such fine so incurred for the whole or any portion of the current year.

6. All fines incurred under the Government Regulations during any month shall be posted in the orderly room on the first day of the succeeding month, and the same must be paid during the then current month.

7. Any member appearing on parade or in uniform in a dirty state shall be liable to a fine of One shilling for the first offence, and Two shillings and sixpence for every subsequent offence.

and Two shillings and sixpence for every subsequent offence.

8. All members, whether in or out of uniform, attending the orderly room or at the butts, during the hours of drill or practice, shall be considered on duty, and as such shall be amenable to the orders of the officer or non-commissioned officer in charge for the time being; provided always that such attendance shall not be credited to any member unless he actually takes part in such drill; and any member either swearing or making use of foul or obscene language, or behaving himself in an improper manner, shall be reported to the commanding officer, and shall be liable to a fine of One shilling for the first offence, and for any subsequent offence to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence, and may render himself liable to be dismissed.

9. Any member reported as wearing a part only of his uniform shall be liable to a fine of One shilling for the first offence, and for every subsequent offence Two shillings and sixpence.

The foregoing rules were adopted by the members of the Richmond Company of the Victorian Volunteer Rifle Force, at a general meeting, duly convened, held on Monday, 2nd November, 1863.

RULES OF THE BALLARAT VOLUNTEER RANGERS.

1. The regiment shall be styled "The Ballarat Volunteer Rangers," and every member shall be subject to the following

2. The monthly subscription shall be Two shillings, payable on the first day of each month.

3. No member shall wear the regulation uniform as adopted by the corps unless on duty, or by permission of the officer commanding the corps.

4. Any member having any complaint to make against any other member of the corps, whether commissioned officer, or private, shall make the complaint in writing to the captain of his company, by whom it shall be

placed in the hands of the commanding officer, who shall decide what action shall be taken in the matter.

5. Any member desiring leave of absence exceeding twenty-eight days, shall apply in writing for such leave of absence to the officer in command of the corps, shall return his rife and accoutrements into store properly cleaned and in good repair, and shall leave his address. All members changing their permanent address shall give notice of the same in writing to the secretary within fourteen (14) days of the same, under a penalty of Two shillings and sixpence.

6. Should occasion require the corps to be called together on any emergency, any member having obtained leave of absence shall hasten at once to headquarters, and consider his leave of absence cancelled.

7. Members shall be accountable for the good and serviceable order of their arms and accourtements, clothing, &c., and shall make good any damage thereto that may be occasioned by negligence.

8. All fines collected shall be approximated to such were at the

All fines collected shall be appropriated to such uses as the committee appointed under these rules shall decide; and at every general meeting of the corps (which general meeting shall be held half-yearly, viz., after the first parades in the months of January and July), the secretary shall submit a statement of all fines and subscriptions, and of their appropriation, for the information of the corps.

9. All members who may be three months in arrears with their subscriptions and fines, shall be proceeded against under the Volunteer Act for the recovery of the same.

10. The committee shall consist of thirteen members, viz., the commanding officer and three senior oflicers, the secretary and treasurer to be explicit onembers, and seven members to be elected by ballot, five to form a quorum. The election of the committee, secretary, and treasurer to take place at the half-yearly meetings of the corps.

11. The officer commanding shall fix the time and place for drill, parade, and practice, and meetings not otherwise provided for by these rules.

12. If on the 1st January in any year a member's debit exceeds his credit by £1 or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of the fine.

13. If any member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount, if more than Ten shillings (10s.), whereby the debit exceeds his credit; provided that no such fine shall exceed £2, and that the whole or the half may, at the discretion of the officer commanding, be remitted.

- 4. The supplies are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto, on the written order of the officer in charge, or at the Government Stores, on the order of the Government Stores.
- 5. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles when required within twenty-four hours, they will be otherwise pro-cured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.
