### ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW NO. 2.—SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE BYE-LAW REGULATING ALLUVIAL MINING IN THE PLEASANT CREEK AND BARKLY DIVISIONS OF THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT, DATED 17TH NOVEMBER, 1862, AND GAZETTED 6TH JANUARY, 1863.

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board Room, Ararat, in the said district, on the fifteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of words and terms.*—In the interpretation of and for the purposes of the provisions of this bye-law, the following words and terms, if not inconsistent with the context, shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—The term "lead" shall mean the alluvial deposit or wash dirt containing gold, running in a continuous course or occurring successively in patches; the word "miner," "person," "claimholder," "shareholder," "party," shall be construed to imply any mining party or copartnership for mining purposes; and all words and terms used in the singular number shall include the plural number.

2. *Interpretation clause.*—The term "prospector" shall mean any person or persons engaged in searching for or discovering any new, lost, or abandoned lead or deposit of gold.

3. *Marking out claims.*—Claims must be marked out by a conspicuous peg at each end (the upper and the lower) on the supposed course of the lead, and may be of any width not exceeding four hundred (400) yards until the course of the lead be determined, when the width must be reduced in accordance with clause 4, and a peg, projecting not less than three (3) feet above the surface, must be placed at each corner of the claim, and in such manner that the boundary lines which meet at each peg shall form right angles with each other; such pegs shall be kept visible during the working of the claim.

4. Prospectors shall be entitled to an extent of claim as specified in the following table:—

FOR DISCOVERING A NEW LEAD.	
Within three (3) miles of an established lead.	Beyond that distance.
Two hundred and fifty feet by two hundred and fifty feet (250 feet by 250 feet).	Three hundred feet by three hundred feet (300 feet by 300 feet).

FOR DISCOVERING A LOST OR ABANDONED LEAD.	
In dry sinking.	In wet sinking.
Two hundred feet by two hundred feet (200 feet by 200 feet).	Two hundred and fifty feet by two hundred and fifty feet (250 feet by 250 feet).

5. *Prospecting claims to be registered.*—Prospectors on discovering payable gold shall, without delay, report the same to the warden, and register their claim with the registrar. Application for registration shall be made in the form set forth in schedule A, annexed to this bye-law, and the registrar shall, on receipt thereof, immediately post a copy of the same in front of his office. Prospectors not complying with the provisions of this clause shall only be entitled to an ordinary claim.

6. *Sinking ahead on established leads.*—Any party sinking not less than two hundred and fifty (250) yards distant from the nearest boundary line of any claim bottomed and at work (at the time of commencing to sink) on an established lead, shall be entitled to a claim:—

In dry sinking.	In wet sinking.
One hundred feet by one hundred feet (100 feet by 100 feet).	One hundred and twenty feet by one hundred and twenty feet (120 feet by 120 feet).

7. *Spare ground and oversized claims.*—Any miner may measure the surface area of any claim, and should there be too much ground therein may take possession of any portion of such ground, not exceeding sixty (60) feet in length, on whichever side of such claim he may prefer, provided the superficial area does not exceed the quantity allowed for one man.

8. *Marking off and shepherding claims.*—On the day on which any claim shall be taken possession of, not less than one-half the shareholders must remain thereon for two (2) consecutive hours between nine a.m. and noon; and on every succeeding day each shareholder in such claim must be present thereon during the time above mentioned until work is commenced and continued in a *bond fide* manner. No share or interest in any claim being shepherded shall under any circumstances become liable to forfeiture, unless through absence from such claim during the hours specified above. But no person holding a share or interest in a claim under this clause can hold any other share or interest at the same time, unless such share or interest be represented by a miner other than himself, and in all respects in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law.

RELATING TO WET SINKING.  
9. *Commencement of work.*—Claimholders within three claims of the last claim bottomed and at work in which water has been struck shall, without delay, commence to sink their shaft, and must continue to do so during the usual working hours of every day until the "well" shall be completed or the claim abandoned, unless the water shall prove too heavy, and work shall be suspended with the consent of the adjoining claimholders. Non-compliance with this clause shall render the claim liable to forfeiture.

RELATING TO MINING REGISTRARS.  
10. *Fees to be paid to the mining registrars.*—There shall be paid to the mining registrars, in respect of the several registrations and other duties mentioned in this bye-law, and in the schedule hereunto appended and marked B, the sums or fees respectively set forth in the said schedule, which fees the registrars may demand and receive previous to making any registration under this bye-law.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for ——" (as the case may be), and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street; or if sent by post they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be oaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran and maize to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth or the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1864.

At a meeting of the council of the city of Melbourne, held in the Council Chamber in the Town Hall, Swanston street, in the said city, this 30th day of November, 1863, at which were present—The Right Worshipful the Mayor, Alderman John Thomas Smith, presiding; Aldermen Richard Eades, Richard Evans Hill, John Harbison, and Michael Keeley; Councillors William Bayles, Henry Donovan Brown, Joshua Cowell, Edward Cohen, John Edwards, John George Goldsmith, William Grant, Michael Gallazer, George Hughes, Charles Edwin Jones, Isaac Lyons, Joseph Story, Samuel Thorp, James Woodrow, and George Wraze, being more than one-third of the members of the said council, it was resolved and ordered: That whereas by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria No. 29, intituled, *An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne*, it is amongst other things enacted that where any street, court, or alley on private property in the city of Melbourne, shall not be, or shall not have been, sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the mayor or town clerk of the said city for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall, in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair, so much of the said street, court, or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively:

And whereas by the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 178, intituled, *An Act to further alter and amend the laws relating to the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong respectively, and to extend and apply other existing Acts thereto*, it is amongst other things enacted that the words "tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley," where used in the first hereinbefore recited Act, shall be held and taken to mean all tenements or premises actually abutting upon, and accessible from, and communicating with such street, court, or alley, whether the owners or occupiers thereof have or have not a right to use, or do commonly use the same: And that the word "owner" used in the said Act shall apply to, and be held to include agent of an owner, but only in so far as to enable such agent to apply to the defrayal of expenses incurred in the formation, drainage, and repair of any such street, court, or alley, under the authority hereof, monies of his principal, of which he shall be in the receipt or possession accruing from tenements lawfully chargeable for such expenses:

And that the said Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne, shall extend and apply to the entire limits of the said city:

And that the apportionment of the expenses incurred by the council of the city of Melbourne, in the formation, drainage, and repair of every such street, court, or alley on private property, shall be made proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners which shall be so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley:

And whereas the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to the order annexed marked A have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the council of this the said city, that the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed marked A, shall, within ten days from the date of this order's coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed, and marked B. And it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed marked A, that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete and repair the street, court, or alley on which their respective tenements adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the council of the said city will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts, or alleys, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order; and will thereupon ascertain, determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate part of the costs, charges, and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley, proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners, so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of, or in consequence of, the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition in which the pavement, flagging, macadamising,

levelling, draining, and sewerage of such streets, courts, or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

SCHEDULE B, REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Manner in which the Streets, Courts, and Alleys enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides) is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerb-stones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 2½ inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam, two (2) inches thick, and rolled with corporation iron roller.

Whenever private entrances lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers, similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining street shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone kerbing.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the city surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.


