## SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLESALE, IN THE SOUTH-WESTERN DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all former proclamations of towns and districts situate within the South-Western District hereinafter described under the provisions of the said Act: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do, by this my Proclamation, declare that the whole of the said South-Western District shall be a district wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the abovesaid Act, and that the boundaries of the said South-Western District shall be as follows, viz.: Commencing at the point where the South Australian boundary line intersects the Mosquito Creek;

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thence easterly by that creek to its head; thence by a line eastward to the source of Power's Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Glenelg; by that river to its source between the Victorian Ranges and the Grampians near Mount William; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Avoca near Mount Cole; thence southerly to the source of the Trewalla Creek; thence by that Creek to its confluence with the Emu Creek; thence southerly by Mount Emu to the north-eastern corner of the county of Hampden; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to the confluence of Back Creek and Reedy Creek; thence southerly along the western boundary of the county of Hampden to the coast line; thence westerly along the sea-coast to the South Australian boundary; thence northerly along that line to the commencing point.

## THE SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT OF CAPE PATERSON.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors and of refreshments in certain districts*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the part or portion of the said colony hereinafter named and defined, to be a Special Licensing District, subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT OF CAPE PATERSON.—Commencing at the mouth of the River Balloch, on the east coast of Western Port Bay; thence southerly by the shores of Western Port Bay to Griffith Port; thence by the sea coast and the northern shores of Anderson's Inlet to the mouth of the River Tarwin; thence easterly and northerly by that river to its source; thence by a straight line northerly to the eastern extremity of the Koo-we-rup or Great Swamp; thence westerly by the south side of said swamp to the River Balloch; and by that river westerly to its mouth, being the point of commencement.

## CARLSRUHE FARMERS' COMMON.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a certain area therein described was proclaimed a farmers' common at Carlsruhe: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said common, and to proclaim another farmers' common in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the said farmers' common at Carlsruhe; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a Farmers' Common, that is to say:—

THE FARMERS' COMMON AT CARLSRUHE.—County of Dalhousie, five thousand seven hundred and sixty acres, more or less, being the unappropriated land within the following described boundaries, viz.: Commencing at the north-east angle of portion 34, parish of Langley; thence east about two hundred and seventy-seven chains nineteen links; thence south to the main dividing range on part of the south, and on east by the said dividing range to where the main road from Lancefield to Carlsruhe crosses it; again on the south by said road westerly to the south-east angle of portion 95, parish of Carlsruhe, on part of the west by portions 95, 91, 90, 84, 82, 81, and 79, Carlsruhe, to the north-east angle of the lastnamed portion; again on the south by part of the north boundary of portion 78; bearing west to the south-east angle of portion 40, parish of Langley; and on the remainder of the west by allotments 40, 39, 35, 37, 36, 35, and 34, bearing north to the points of commencement.—(63.H.755.)

## SHELFORD ROAD DISTRICT.

## RULES TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE SHELFORD DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

**T**HE business of the board shall be conducted with open doors.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held at the office of the board on the first Thursday of every month, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon. The business to commence as soon as the quorum of five is present; but should a quorum of five not be present at the expiration of forty minutes after the time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and the meeting shall lapse.

3. Special meetings may be summoned at any time by the secretary, upon his receiving a written requisition, signed by three members, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meetings; provided he shall give to each member notice thereof, by post, seven clear days before such meeting.

4. At every regular meeting of the board the first business thereof shall be the reading of the minutes of any preceding meeting for confirmation thereof, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman for the time being.

5. At all meetings of the board, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of regular business.

6. All petitions or memorials addressed to the board must be presented by one of its members, who will be responsible for its being in proper form and respectfully worded.

7. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and taken into consideration after the orders of the day or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall be a member of such committee.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration; any member of the board, may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion. No such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board unless notice thereof shall have been given to the secretary in writing by the member bringing it forward at the meeting previous to that in which the same shall be taken into consideration; and all such notices shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

10. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

11. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board regularly convened.

## ORDER OF DEBATE.

12. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the board.

13. The presiding chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

14. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

15. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon.

16. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

17. No member shall speak twice on the same question, excepting by way of explanation or reply upon an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last proposed; and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

18. Any member proposing a motion or amendment, or if speaking on any matter, must rise and address the chairman. No member when speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other; and the question of order shall be disposed of by the chairman before the subject is resumed or any other matter entered upon.

19. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

20. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

21. The chairman shall on taking the vote on any motion or amendment put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

22. All questions before the board shall be decided by show of hands.

23. Upon the adoption of any amendment of the board such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

24. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board; notice of intention to protest must, however, be given in every case on the adoption of the resolution to be protested against; and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board, by the protesting member or members, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office.

25. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be carried; the business then undispensed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

26. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion that has all already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board shall have been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board that shall have been negatived by the board shall be again entertained during the same year.

27. Notices of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency, provided that not more than two members be absent at such board meeting.

## ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

28. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in the local newspapers, inviting applications for candidates properly qualified.

## CONTRACTS.

29. All contracts shall be made by tender, and advertised not less than twice in the local newspapers, unless the board shall otherwise direct. Tenders shall be addressed to the chairman, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the board; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board. The security in all cases of contract shall be ten pounds per cent. upon the amount of the contract, paid over by the contractor to the chairman of the board, which amount shall be lodged in the bank with the other moneys of the board, and only repaid to the contractor when he obtains his final certificate that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

30. No officers or members of the board shall have any pecuniary interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract under the board.

## PAYMENTS OF MONEYS.

31. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the secretary, and no such cheques shall be given unless the account for which such cheque is given be passed at a regular meeting of the board.

## LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

32. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll, and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that unless the amount be paid before the expiration of fourteen days from the date thereof legal proceedings shall be taken for its recovery.

33. The collector shall once a week at least pay into such bank as the board may direct, to the credit of such board, all moneys received by him from time to time, and at the same time furnish the secretary with an account of such moneys.

34. The secretary shall present a statement of the monetary affairs of the board at each regular meeting of the board.

35. No alteration in these rules shall be made unless notice of motion be duly given, and such alterations agreed to by two-thirds of the members of the board.

At a meeting of the Shelford District Road Board, held at Rumble's Inn, Warrambeen Creek, within the said district, on the fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the foregoing bye-law was adopted, in order to be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor for his approval, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40, section 4.
