RATES OF POSTAGE ON LETTERS, ETC., SENT VIA THE UNITED KINGDOM TO OR THROUGH GERMANY.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the 2nd day of March, 1863.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act, intituled, An Act to amend the Law relating to the Post Office*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make or cause to be made arrangements with the Postmaster General in England, or with the authorities of any British possession or foreign country, for the following objects, that is to say:—

(3.) For the appointment, determining, and collection of postage, and rates of postage upon letters, packets, and newspapers conveyed between the colony aforesaid, and such kingdom, possession, or country, and for the exemption of such letters, packets, and newspapers from all or any rates:

(4.) For the division or appropriation and mutual accounting for and payment of money so collected:

And that such arrangements may provide for the prepayment or otherwise of the postage due on such letters, packets, and newspapers, notwithstanding any of the provisions of the said Act, and the postage on any letters, packets, and newspapers received from parts beyond the seas, may be payable under such arrangements in Victoria:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that under an arrangement with the Imperial Government, based upon postal conventions concluded between Great Britain and Prussia, Bremen and Hamburg, the rates of postage shown in the annexed schedule shall be collected in Victoria on letters, newspapers, and printed papers sent through the United Kingdom to Germany and to certain countries the correspondence of which passes through Germany.

That the foreign postage on letters of the above class may be paid in advance or left to be paid on delivery at the option of the sender, provided that the colonial ship postage be in all cases prepaid.

That the foreign postage due on unpaid letters received in Victoria, be collected on behalf of the United Kingdom. That the foreign postage hereby authorised to be collected, be accounted for and paid to the Imperial Government.

And the Honorable George Samuel Evans, Her Majesty's Postmaster General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SANDHURST MINING DISTRICT.

SLUDGE BYE-LAW.—[24th February, 1863.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the twenty-fourth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Former sludge bye-laws repealed.*—Whereas it is expedient that the bye-laws relating to sludge in force in the Sandhurst division of the Sandhurst mining district should be revised and amended, the following bye-laws are hereby repealed, viz.—A bye-law made and passed on the 15th day of November, 1850, and gazetted on the 18th day of January, 1861; and an addition to the same made and passed on the 27th day of September, 1861, and gazetted on the 25th day of October, 1861; and also a further addition made and passed on the 15th day of September, 1862, and gazetted on the 30th day of September, 1862; all of which are hereby repealed, and the following bye-law substituted in lieu thereof:—

2. *Purposes of this bye-law.*—Funds to be expended by the said board in and about the repairing, clearing, and keeping clear all main and intermediate sludge channels, not being private sludge channels, existing within the division of Sandhurst, and for defraying all costs incurred in raising the said funds, and for the due distribution of such funds, shall be raised as follows:—

3. *Assessment on horse puddling machines, &c.*—For the purpose aforesaid, the owner or occupier of every horse puddling machine situated on ground held by miner's right or by lease, and of every site for a horse puddling machine situated as aforesaid, shall pay in advance to the said mining board a quarterly assessment of One pound ten shillings: Provided always that in case such owner shall hold two or more such puddling machines, all of which shall be situated within a distance of one hundred and fifty yards from each other, he shall for every such machine exceeding one pay as aforesaid a quarterly assessment of Fifteen shillings; and the owner of such machine or site shall be responsible for the payment of such assessment until he shall have sold or abandoned said machine or site, by giving notice in writing of such sale or abandonment to the superintendent of the subdivision wherein the same is situated.

4. *Assessment on steam puddling machines.*—For the purpose aforesaid, the owner of every puddling machine worked by steam power shall pay in advance to the said mining board a quarterly assessment of Ten shillings per horse power of the engine or engines used by him for such puddling purposes.

5. *Assessment on steam crushing machines.*—For the purposes aforesaid, the owner or occupier of every machine situated on ground held by miner's right or by lease, worked by steam power, and used for the purpose of crushing cement or alluvial soil or gravel, shall pay as aforesaid a quarterly assessment of Three shillings per horse power of the engine or engines used by him for such purpose; and the owner of every quartz crushing machine situated as aforesaid shall pay a quarterly assessment of Two shillings per horse power of the engine or engines used by him for such purpose.

6. *When assessments payable.*—The foregoing assessments shall be due and payable quarterly in advance by the said owners of machines on the twenty-eighth day of March, twenty-eighth day of June, eighth day of September, and the eighth day of December, each year.

7. *Duties of collector.*—That it be the duty of the collector to demand, receive, and collect all fees and charges imposed by this bye-law, and upon receipt thereof such fees shall be paid by him into such bank as the mining board may from time to time appoint, to the credit of the members of the finance committee,

to be hereafter appointed in pursuance of, and subject to, the provisions of clause 7 of this bye-law; and each collector shall once a week furnish to the board a correct account of his receipts, together with his bank book, with a list of all arrears in the subdivision of which he is collector.

8. *Duties of superintendent, finance committee, &c.*—It shall be the duty of the superintendent to compile an assessment roll once every three months for the Sandhurst division, containing the names of all owners or part owners of machinery driven either by horse or steam power, whether such machinery is in work or not, and to furnish a copy of the same to the mining board.

It will also be the duty of the superintendent to take cognizance of the various sludge channels under the control of the board throughout the division, and to supervise the work being carried on in maintaining and clearing the same, and shall furnish a weekly report of his proceedings thereon to the mining board and also to the consulting engineer, and shall further furnish to the mining board once a month, or at such times as the board may require, a clear statement of the works then in progress, together with the cost of the same, and shall apply once a fortnight to the board for the sum necessary to defray such cost; and thereupon three members of the board, who shall be appointed by the board to act as a finance committee, may draw a cheque in their joint names for the required amount, and said cheque shall be countersigned by the clerk of the board: Provided that such committee shall be appointed at a meeting of the board to be specially called for that purpose, of which meeting one week's notice in writing shall be given by the clerk to each member of the board.

9. *Interpretation clause.*—For the purposes of this bye-law, the word "owner" shall be held to include the members of a mining partnership; the word "claimholder" shall be construed to mean the owner of any claim held either by miner's right or by lease; and the horse power of engines liable to assessment as aforesaid shall be taken to be the nominal horse power of such engines.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

The municipal councils of Ballaarat and Ballaarat East, forming the Ballaarat and Ballaarat East Water Commission, have accepted tenders for 18-in. mains, to be laid from Kirk's Dam to the mains in Ballaarat East. Tenders have also been accepted for the construction of a dam at Harry Beale's Swamp.

The commission have appointed a secretary and engineer, who will in future furnish reports on the progress of the works.
