THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF AVOCA ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the sixteenth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the Municipal District of Avoca was altered in compliance with the prayer of a petition of the householders resident within the area therein described: And whereas the district defined in the said Proclamation has been found not to coincide accurately with the district petitioned for as aforesaid, and it is expedient again to alter the said Municipal District: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the boundaries of the said Municipal District, and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare that the said Municipal District of Avoca shall be and consist of the area comprised within the boundaries and limits hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 1, section A 3; thence south to the south-east angle of allotment 30, section 1 A; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 7, section 6 A; thence north to the north-west angle of allotment 3, section 5 A, all in the parish of Avoca; thence east by the north boundaries of allotments 3 and 4 of section 5 A to the north-east angle of allotment 4; thence north by the east side of allotment 1, section 5 A, to the north-east angle thereof; thence east 1 chain (crossing a road); thence by a line bearing S. 73° 30' E. 59 chains to the west side of the main road from Moonambel to Avoca; thence by that side of the main road bearing S. 54° E. 13½ chains, more or less, crossing the Avoca River; thence crossing said road easterly to an angle on the west boundary of allotment C, section B, being the eastern side of the road leading to Nattie Yallock; thence by that side of lastnamed road northerly 6 chains 50 links to the north-west angle of allotment 6 of section B; thence east to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

VICINITY OF BALLAARAT.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by forty-eight householders, purporting to be the majority resident within an area adjoining to the municipal district of Ballarat, containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile of such contiguous area; praying that their locality may be united with and may form part of the said municipal district.

The petitioners state that they constitute a majority of the residents in an area containing thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof, which is outside of and adjacent to the southern and western boundary of the municipality of Ballarat, and that they are desirous that their locality should be included within the said municipality, the council of which is also desirous of the proposed annexation.

And the petitioners pray as follows:-

"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency will be pleased to declare by a Proclamation the locality within which they reside to be united with and form part of the Ballarat municipality, by the following general description as defined and set forth in the plan accompanying this petition, viz.:- Commencing at the north-west angle of the Botanic Garden Reserve; thence by a line bearing west twenty-seven and a half chains; thence by a line bearing south two miles three chains and forty links to the north-east angle of allotment twelve of section twelve, parish of Cardigan; thence east one mile and one chain and fifty links to the north-east angle of allotment four, section three, parish of Cardigan; thence south by the eastern boundary of said allotment four, section three, forty-six chains sixty links; thence by a line bearing east to the River Yarrowee; thence northerly by the River Yarrowee to the southern boundary of the municipal district of Ballarat; thence by the southern and western boundaries of the municipal district of Ballarat to the commencing point."
