## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

The Director of Means and Domains informs navigators that a standing Katadioptric Harbor Light of the 4th class, at an elevation of 16.5 ell above high-water mark, will be lighted on the 1st of January next, at sunset, on the West Harbor Heads of Batavia, and will henceforward continue to burn regularly from that time to sunrise.

The color of this light, which illuminates the whole horizon, is white.

The light is visible at three German geographical miles, and serves as a mark to make for the road of Batavia.

Keeping this light between the bearings of S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. and S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., vessels steering a southerly course can safely reach the road and anchor place; coming from the westward by Onrust, vessels steer a S.E. by E. course to the road until the light bears south to the anchorage.

The old light will be extinguished on that date.

## WILFUL MURDER.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS Thomas Evans, a miner, residing at Donnelly's Creek, Gipps Land, left that place on Monday, the 15th of December last, for Melbourne: And whereas his body was subsequently discovered at a spot about a mile and a half from Cook's Restaurant, situate between Donnelly's Creek and the Bald Hills, and about 200 yards from the track, with the skull fractured and the neck encircled with a piece of rope: And whereas between Two and Three o'clock in the afternoon of the day aforesaid cries were heard in the direction where the body was found: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons guilty of the murder of the said Thomas Evans.

The Governor will also extend Her Majesty's free pardon to any person implicated in the said murder, not being the actual murderer, who will give the required information.

## PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

The persons suspected of the murder are the men here described, viz.:

James Clayton, a butcher, who left Donnelly's Creek about the time of the murder. He is 26 years of age, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, stout-built, with dark hair, clean shaved and full round face, and good looking; he wore a grey shirt, moleskin or cord trousers, and brown "jerry" hat.

James Bruce, who pretends to be a fighting man, aged about 35, stout-built, 5 feet 9 inches high, with full face, ruddy freckled complexion, light sandy whiskers, and very slight moustache; his usual dress consists of moleskin trousers and shirt with the sleeves tucked up.

## MEMORIALS.

A memorial to His Excellency the Governor, urging the desirability of changing the date of the financial year of the Government from January to July.

A memorial to His Excellency the Governor, praying that the *Real Property Act* might be carried out in its integrity, as at present in operation in South Australia.

A memorial to the Honorable the Chief Secretary, praying for the introduction of a Bill to the Legislature, as early as possible, to regulate mining on private property.

## PUBLIC WORKS.

The following public works have been carried out during the past half-year:—

1. The construction of 15 chains of kerbing and channelling in High and Main streets, together with formation and graveling the footpath, and pitching rights-of-way.

2. Sloping the cutting in High street for a length of 5½ chains.
3. Formation of 7 chains of Templeton street, towards German Reef.
4. Formation and gravelling 26 chains of footpath in High street, between Francis street and Adair street.
5. Cutting 5 chains of drain in Hospital street.
6. Construction and laying down five box shutes for draining the footpaths in various places.
7. Construction of a bridge on the road to Parkins Reef.
8. Formation and gravelling of 4 chains of footpath and construction of a footbridge in Francis street.
9. Forming and metalling 4 chains and construction of culvert in Peg Leg Gully.

Together with the repairs of roads in various parts of the municipality, where most urgently required.

#### WATER SUPPLY.

The Government having requested the council to act as agents in expending the sum of £1500 on the Maldon Reservoir, it was decided to agree to such proposal, and, in consequence, the council entered into contracts, which consist of increasing the reservoir, cutting catchment race, and laying pipes from reservoir to Wheelhouse's premises, opposite Spring street. An attempt has also been made at considerable cost to stop the leak known to exist, but without effect.

The above contracts will be completed within one month from the present date; already 33 chains of race have been cut, and 900 yards of earthwork have been excavated, and the repairs of the embankment completed.

The council regrets that the sum placed at its disposal will have been expended without the leak being stopped; and as the report of the town surveyor states that the water escapes through the rock, a further sum of about £700 will be required in order to thoroughly puddle the entire bottom of the excavation.

An application will be made to the Government for such further sum as will render the reservoir thoroughly watertight, and strong hopes are entertained that the application will be favorably considered, as, without the steps suggested are taken, the reservoir cannot be of any permanent benefit to the inhabitants.
