PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT. VICINITY OF SMYTHESDALE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by eleven householders, purporting to be the majority resident within an area adjoining to the municipal district of Smythesdale, containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile of such contiguous area, praying that their locality may be united with and form part of the said municipal district.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 18th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is effipowered to make bye-laws for the proservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Avoca, that the owners or occupiers of any houses or premises shall not allow the contents of any watercloset, privy, or cesspool to overflow or soak therefrom so as to

be a nuisance or injurious to the health of the public, after notice under authority of the council to such owner or occupier to abate the same.

Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this byc-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Twenty rounds storing.

MUNICIPALITY OF MALMSBURY. BYE-LAW NO. 7.—FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, initialled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all property in houses and lands within such district, according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the Municipal Council of Malmsbury, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the said recited Act, a rate of One shilling in the pound be levied on all property in houses and lands within the municipal district aforesaid, such rate to be due and payable on and after the 14th day of January, for the current municipal year ending the 4th day of December (1863), One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 7, made by the municipal council of Malmsbury, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 13th day of April, 1863.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Woodend, that the owner or occupier of any house or premises shall not allow the contents of any water-closet, privy, or cesspool, to overflow or soak thereform so as to be a nuisance or injurious to the health of the inhabitants, after written notice from the local inspector of nuisances to such owner or occupier to abate the same.

Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.
