SIR,
With reference to my Circular Despatch* of the 23rd July, 1860, I transmit to you herewith, for your information, copies of Declarations which have recently been exchanged between

* Relative to the payment, by aliens, of the *jus detractis* of 10 per cent., in Bavaria, on the withdrawal of their property from that kingdom.

Her Majesty's Government and the Government of Bavaria, providing for the abolition of any special duty in Bavaria on the withdrawal of property belonging to British subjects, so long as no such duty is levied in the British Dominions in respect of property belonging to Bavarian subjects.

DECLARATIONS exchanged between the Governments of Great Britain and of Bavaria, relative to the duties payable on the withdrawal of the property of subjects of the one country from the territories of the other:

BRITISH DECLARATION.

The undersigned, Her Britannic Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of His Majesty the King of Bavaria, being duly authorised by his Government, hereby declares that the subjects of his Majesty the King of Bavaria are at liberty to withdraw their property from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and from the British Colonies and possessions, without being called upon to pay any duty as aliens on the withdrawal of it, and without paying any other duty than such as the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty are equally liable to pay.

In witness whereof the undersigned has signed the present Declaration, which is to be substituted for the Declaration of the 30th April, 1836, and has affixed thereto the seal of his arms.

BAVARIAN DECLARATION.

Sa Majesté le Roi de Bavière, Comte Palatin du Rhin, Duc de Bavière, de Franconie et en Souabe, &c., ayant eu connaissance que d'après les lois en vigueur dans le Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et dans les Colonies et possessions Britanniques, il ne se perçoit aucun droit quelconque à raison de l'exportation et du transfert des héritages et autres propriétés appartenant à des sujets Bavares, le Soussigné, Ministre d'Etat ayant le Département de la Maison du Roi et des Affaires Etrangères, déclare par ces présentes, au nom du Gouvernement de Sa Majesté, qu'aucune retenue ne sera désormais exercée sous le titre de droit d'aubaine ou de détraction sur les héritages et autres biens échus en Bavière à des sujets de Sa Majesté Britannique soit dans la Royaume Uni, soit dans les Colonies et possessions Britanniques, et que l'abolition de ces droits en faveur de ceux-ci aura son plein et entier effet, non seulement dans tous les cas à venir, tant que les lois ne seront pas changées à cet égard dans le Royaume Uni et dans les Colonies et possessions Britanniques, mais encore dans tous ceux où, jusqu'au jour de la signature du présent Acte, les droits ainsi abolis n'auront pas effectivement et définitivement été perçus.

En foi de quoi, cette Déclaration, destinée à remplacer la Déclaration du 10 Avril, 1836, et à être échangé contre une Déclaration semblable de la part du Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique, assurant une parfaite réciprocité aux sujets Bavares, a été délivrée par le Ministre d'Etat Soussigné, et munie du sceau de ses armes.

His Majesty the King of Bavaria, Count Palatine of the Rhine, Duke of Bavaria, of Franconia, and in Suabia, &c., having learnt that, according to the laws in force in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and in the British Colonies and possessions, no duty whatever is collected on the exportation and transfer of inheritances and other property belonging to Bavarian subjects, the undersigned Minister of State for the Department of the Royal House and for Foreign Affairs, declares by these presents, in the name of His Majesty's Government, that no deduction shall henceforth be made under the title of *droit d'aubaine ou de détraction*, upon inheritances and other property in Bavaria belonging to subjects of Her Britannic Majesty, whether in the United Kingdom or in the British colonies and possessions; and that the abolition of such duties in favor of those subjects shall have its full and entire effect, not only in all future cases, so long as the laws shall not be changed in this respect in the United Kingdom and in the British Colonies and possessions, but also in all those cases in which, up to the date of the signature of the present Act, the duties thus abolished shall not have been actually and definitely collected.

In witness whereof this Declaration, destined to be substituted for the declaration of the 10th of April, 1836, and to be exchanged against a similar Declaration on the part of the Government of Her Britannic Majesty, securing perfect reciprocity to Bavarian subjects, has been delivered by the undersigned Minister of State, and sealed with the seal of his Arms.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the sixteenth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of "The St. Arnaud Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to again alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said St. Arnaud Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at the northern boundary of the Natte Yaloak pre-emptive section on the River Avoca; thence by a line west to the eastern boundary of the Stawell Road District at the township of Navarre; thence by part of the northern boundary of the said Road District to a point where it is intersected by the west branch of the Richardson River; thence northerly by the centre line of said river and by the centre line of the Avon River to the south-west angle of the Rich Avon East Run; thence easterly and northerly along the southern and eastern boundaries of the Rich Avon East Run to the western boundary of the Swan Water North Run; thence by the western boundary of the Swan Water North Run to the north-west angle of the Convor Run; thence south and east by the western and southern boundaries of the Convor Run to the centre of the Avoca River; thence south by the Avoca River to commencing point.—(63.375.)

THE HORSHAM ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the sixteenth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of "The Horsham Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Horsham Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the most northern point of the River Glenelg; thence by a line north-westerly to a point on the western boundary of the province three miles north-east of Lake Cadmite; thence north by the western boundary of the province to a point sixty-six miles south of the River Murray; thence east to the eastern boundary of the electoral district of the Wimmera; and thence by the eastern boundary of the electoral district of the Wimmera at a point where it is intersected by the northern boundary of the Kewell Run; thence eastward by the northern boundary of the said run to a point where it joins the Sheep Hills Run; thence along the south-western boundary of that run until it joins the Kirkwood Run; thence by the north-western and north-eastern boundary of the Kirkwood Run to the northern boundary of the Rich Avon West Run; thence by the north-eastern boundary of the said run to the Avon River; thence southerly by the centre line of the Avon River and the Richardson River to a point where the western branch of said river is intersected by the main road to Navarre; thence westerly by the centre line of said road to a point in the centre of the River Wimmera; thence southerly by the western boundary of the Stawell Road District, and by part of the eastern and southern boundaries of the Wimmera Electoral District to the commencing point.—(62.1501.)

PROPOSED NEW ROAD.
PARISH OF NUNAWADING.
