1. The supplies are to be according to schedule, wherever the manufacture is indicated, and other items are to be the best of their several kinds.

2. All orders for supplies under these contracts must issue from the Government Storekeeper's Department, and unless otherwise specially ordered, the supplies must be delivered to the Government Stores. When ordered, they are to be delivered free of charge to any part of Melbourne, and in the case of Ship Chandlery and Oil for Lighthouses, at the Marine Yard, Williamstown.

3. The contract entered into under this notice is not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts made by the military commissariat, or by other departments of the public service. When desirable, raw material will be ordered for the

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mule, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent, either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract by giving a notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.


