TIME SIGNAL AT PORT PHILLIP HEADS.

In the event of imperfection or incorrectness occurring on any occasion, in giving the signal, the No. 2 flag pendant (Marryatt's code) will be immediately shown, and kept flying at the mast head for fifteen (15) minutes.

THE CARNGHAM AND BEAUFORT ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him shall seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district, and from time to time revoke any such Proclamation and vary and alter the boundary of any such district as may be necessary and advisable: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the portion of the colony therein described was declared to be a road district under the designation of "The Carngham Road District." And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May, in the year aforesaid, the said road district was altered: And whereas it is expedient again to alter such district and to change the designation thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the two several Proclamations hereinbefore mentioned; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and do define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at the junction of the Burrumbeet Creek with the Lake Burrumbeet; thence easterly by the centre of the said creek for a distance of about sixty chains to a point due north of the western boundary of a Government road which forms the eastern boundaries of sections 8, 11, and 12 of the parish of Haddon, county of Grenville; thence by the western boundary of the said road and a line due south for a distance of eight miles; thence in a direct line westerly to a point in the centre of the Emu Creek opposite the north-east corner of the boundary of the county of Hampden; thence westerly by the centre of the Emu Creek to a point where the Emu Creek cuts the northern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence westerly by the said boundary to a point where the Electric Telegraph line cuts the said boundary; thence north-easterly by the Electric Telegraph line to a point due west of the southern boundary of the parish of Mahrwallok; thence by a line north to the Fiery Creek; thence by the said creek to its junction with the Middle Creek; thence by the Middle Creek until it intersects the main road leading from Ballarat to Ararat; thence by a direct line bearing north-west to the northern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the county of Ripon to the north-west corner of the Lange-kal-kal Run; thence south-easterly by the south-western boundary of the said run to the Emu Creek; thence by the Emu Creek to a point on the Electric Telegraph line on the main road from Ararat to Ballarat where it is intersected by the Emu Creek; thence easterly by the Electric Telegraph line to a point opposite the north-west bend of Lake Burrumbeet; thence by a direct line south to the shore of Lake Burrumbeet; thence by the western and southern shores of the said lake to the commencing point.

And I do hereby give to such road district the specific name and designation of "The Carngham and Beaufort Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
