#### IMPORTATION OF SHEEP INTO SOUTH AUS-TRALIA.

THE accompanying Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor of South Australia, prohibiting the importation of diseased sheep into that province, is published for general information.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA, Proclamation by Sir Dominick Dally, to wit.

Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Province of South Australia and the Dependencies thereof, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled An Act to enable the Governor to prevent the Importation of Cattle into South Australia under certain circumstances, and for other purposes, it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor from time to time, and at any time thereafter, with the advice and consent; of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the South Australian Government Gazette, to prohibit the introduction or importation of any cattle, or any particular description of cattle, into the said province from such places and during such time as should be set forth in such Proclamation:

No. 58.-June 2, 1863,-1.

Now therefore I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the said authority, and of all other powers me enabling, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, order, and direct that from the day of the date hereof no sheep, except such as being free from the disease known as "scab," shall be authorised to be imported, under a permission in writing, signed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, shall be introduced or imported into the province of South Australia, from either of the colonies of New South Wales or Victoria: And I do also proclaim, order, and direct that this my Proclamation shall continue in full force and effect until the same shall be revoked by Proclamation in the South Australian Government Gazette.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the said Province, at Adelaide, this seventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
